Florida 'Phone Expansion Bid

TALLAHASSEE (UPI) — Florida Telephone Company has asked to start toll-free service in some areas of eight Central Florida counties, but with a rate increase at a few exchanges to finance the extension.

The Public Service Commission said it planned public hearings on the request. No date was set.

According to the commission, it must invest between \$4 and \$8 million to put the program into effect.

Counties included in the proposed toll-free service plan are Citrus, Lake, Levy, Marion, Orange, Osceola, Pasco and Sumter.

Florida Telephone was criticized for a rapid growth in its service area, the commission said, and there was a demand for its toll-free service.

In addition, it said the World Diney Enterprises proposal to build a \$100 million hospital in the Orange County area "makes the portion served by the Winter Garden area change and Orlando of vital importance."

Almost without exception a married couple will reduce their income tax by filing a joint return rather than separate returns.

But since there are situations where separate returns are advantageous, a safe rule of thumb is to try both methods. Then use the one that produces the smaller tax payment or greater refund.

Here are some typical cases where saving results from the use of separate returns.

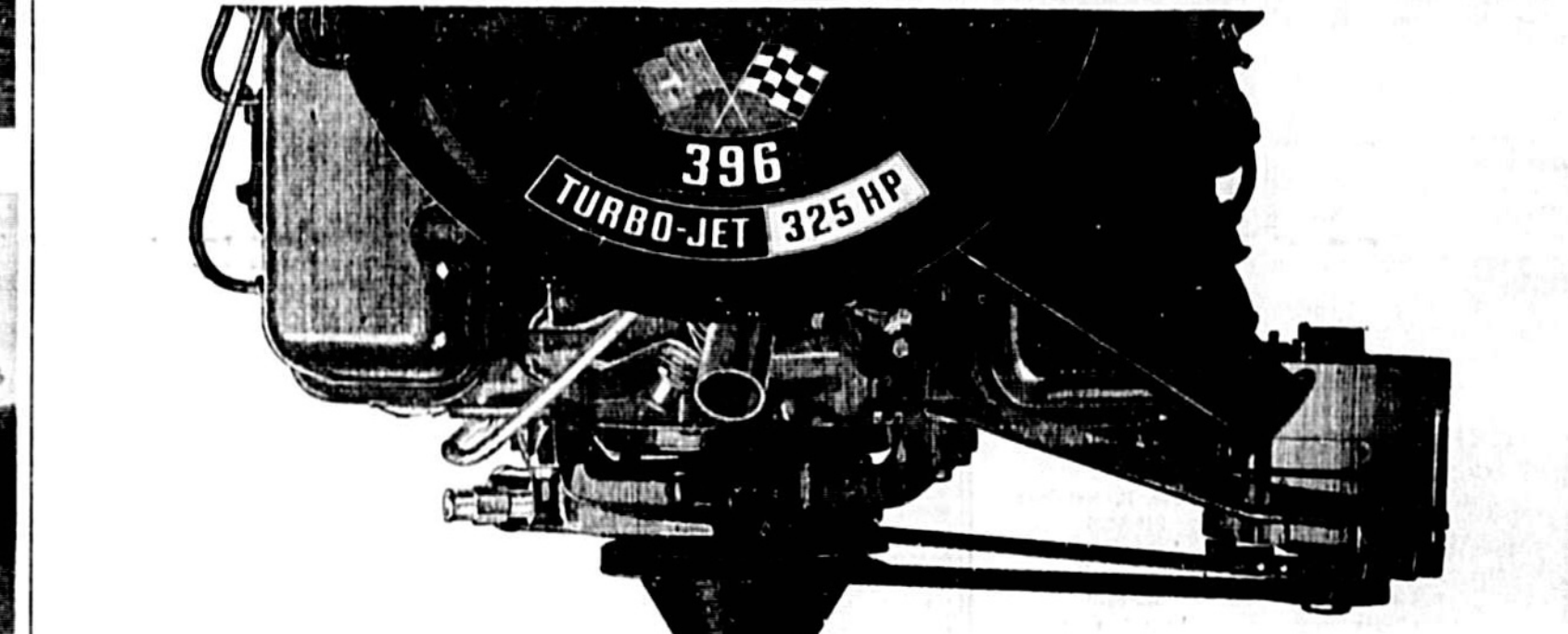
— A young husband and wife each has a small income and standard deductions. The combined tax on separate returns frequently is a few dollars less than the tax bill for a joint return.

— A husband and wife each has a capital gain and a capital loss for the year. On a joint return they would be eligible for the \$1,000 loss on one of the gains, but on a separate return each could deduct his or her loss. This is especially true if the husband and wife have a long-term transaction and the full \$1,000 capital loss could be claimed on the other return.

Oceanography Study Pushed In Florida

TALLAHASSEE (UPI)—Oceanographic research in Florida ranges from checking oysters for radioactive taint to using earth circling satellites to track down sea turtles, the state's chief agencies for marine research said today.

The council is one of the state's chief agencies for marine research. It was set up in 1962 by the state legislature.

Members of the committee met with state university presidents and professors in a two-hour briefing session designed to bring the council up to date on ocean research and development in Florida universities.

Chancellor J. Brewster Culpepper revealed that, prodded by the governor, the Board of Regents was making a study to determine the "role and scope" of each university in the field of oceanography. He said the study would be released in March.

On one hand for the session in the Regatta office was University of Miami President Henry King Stanford and members of his staff, in which university would take a part.

"We are approaching this study in a way that will not create unnecessary duplication and that all dollars are used wisely and well," he said.

Culpepper said the state university system is laying out a seven-state Gull University Research Corporation, he said it was hoped that the corporation would become an eastern holding point from which to conduct research in Miami Beach.

Dr. John Champion, president of Florida State University, outlined plans for his school's 10-year development plan for oceanographic studies. He said the state would be increased from seven to 10 and new facilities are being built in Franklin County on the Gulf Coast.

He said more than \$500,000 is slated to go into the program, which now draws about \$100,000 in research grants.

Dr. George D. V. Kuhnberger, director of the biological sciences department of the University of Florida, said

ORLANDO (UPI) — The victims of an armed robbery Tuesday continued to inventory the loss of jewelry today and officials said it would amount to at least \$60,000 and could run as high as \$120,000.

Mrs. W. J. Goodson was robbed of the jewelry by two well-dressed, smooth-talking gunmen who posed as internal revenue agents to gain entry into the home.

The men told a maid they were internal revenue agents and wanted to see Mrs. Goodson. When they were admitted to the house, she was blindfolded and the men's mouths, ankles and wrists.

They then went to Mrs. Goodson's bedroom and taped her mouth, ankles and wrists.

The most expensive item taken in the daylight robbery was a nine-carat diamond ring valued at \$82,000. Police said the woman overlooked the ring because she had been at least a dozen other pieces of jewelry in the robbery.

Teacher Union Charges Threat

NEW YORK (UPI) — A teacher's union charged today that St. John's University, one of the largest Roman Catholic schools in the world, has threatened striking instructors that if they don't end a walk-out they "will face the consequences."

The development comes as picket lines reappeared today at the two St. John's campuses in Jamaica and Brooklyn.

The United Federation of College Teachers (UFCT), which represents about 100 of St. John's 651 faculty members, struck the university Tuesday in a simmering dispute over the role of teachers in making policy decisions at the big Catholic school.

"The St. John's University administration is lying in a transparent attempt to intimidate teachers," said UFCT President Dr. Israel Kugler and Rev. Peter O'Reilly, head of the UFCT chapter at St. John's, in a joint statement.

A union spokesman said administration officials had sent telegrams to striking faculty members that unless they showed up today "they will face the consequences."

The spokesman said the threat touched on the possibility that absent teachers might be fired.

Johnson Seeks Big War Chest

It will raise total military appropriations for this fiscal year to well above \$62 billion, the highest figure since World War II.

Sen. Smathers Enters Hospital

WASHINGTON (UPI) — Sen. George A. Smathers (D-Fla.), who announced earlier this week that he would not be a candidate for re-election in 1968, entered Georgetown University Hospital here for further medical tests.

Smathers told a news conference in Miami that he was suffering from an ailment that is "serious, complex, but not incurable." Friends have reported that the 52-year-old lawmaker was concerned over a hernia of the diaphragm.

1,000 Escape Floodwaters

EUREKA, Calif. (UPI) — Heavy residents of north California and southern Oregon braced for further heavy rain today as flood-swollen rivers and streams carried an angry torrent of storm water seaward.

Disaster officials, who met yesterday behind 1,000 persons escape the path of the floodwaters, were handed a brief respite as skies temporarily cleared and rivers crested well below record levels which devastated the area last winter.

But another storm front, expected to dump heavy rain and snow on the beleaguered section, could bring a disaster of major proportions.

Grange Honors Tallahassee

TALLAHASSEE (UPI) — The Governor's Committee on Hiring the Handicapped will honor the Florida Grange at a meeting Jan. 6 in Daytona Beach. The committee said the Grange helped push three bills requiring public buildings to be constructed with ramps and other facilities for handicapped persons.

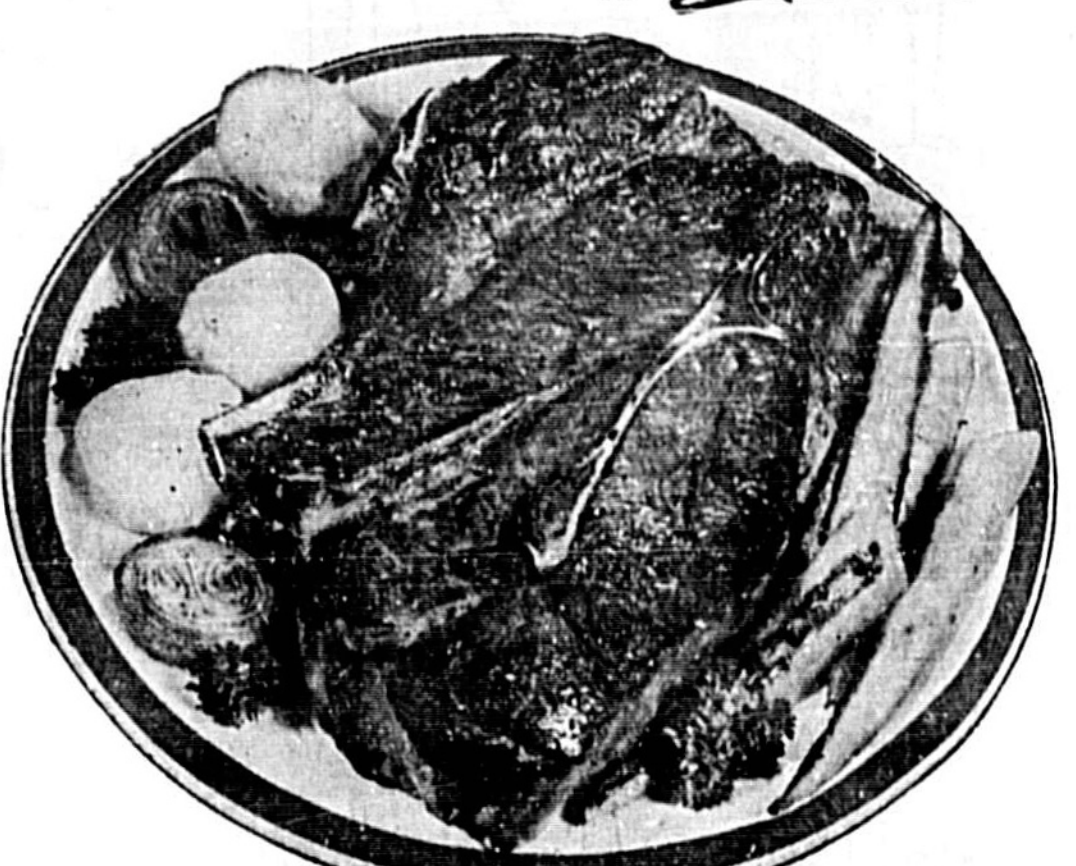

West Germany Joins Race For The Stars

BONN (UPI) — West Germany has at last won a place on the Western team racing for the stars.

Chancellor Ludwig Erhard and President Johnson agreed, in their pre-Christmas talks in Washington, that Germany should join the United States in several space research projects, including perhaps probes to the sun and to Jupiter.

Their agreement is potentially of more importance to Germany than their parallel discussion of a possible greater role for Bonn in nuclear defense planning.

Nuclear defense planning involves existing weapons systems.

But the space research programs require the invention of new or refined techniques. A nation unable to keep abreast of these developments soon will lose out in the industrial race, with a disastrous effect on international trade, productivity and standards of living.

At first glance, West Germany seems among the most prosperous trading nations in the world.

West Germany pays about five times more for foreign patents and licensing fees than it earns by the sale of patent rights.

In the last 20 years, almost none of the Nobel Prizes have gone to Germans.

Not only did the Western allies and the Russians alike recruit hundreds of German rocketry technicians in 1945, but a large proportion of graduating scientists leave Germany each year for greener pastures.

American-owned companies already have acquired an edge on the computer market in Germany, and even the defense ministry hired an American outfit to build and program a computer to review the armed forces' cost effectiveness.

Germany participation in American space programs, it is hoped, will reverse this trend.

So far, Germany has indicated her main interest is in the satellite and communications systems. But she may also join Britain in the development of launcher and guidance systems.

When Erhard mentioned the sun probe in an after dinner toast at the White House, German journalists nicknamed him "the sun king." Not only does the tag suit his round countenance, but if the agreement gets Germany back on the mainline of industrial development, it may stick with even more justification.

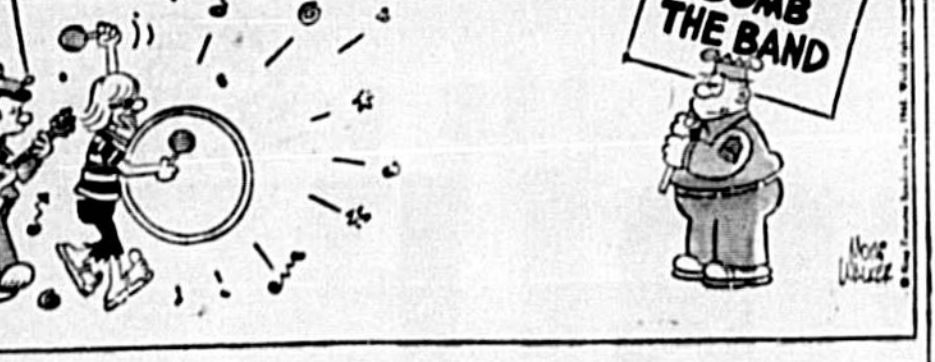

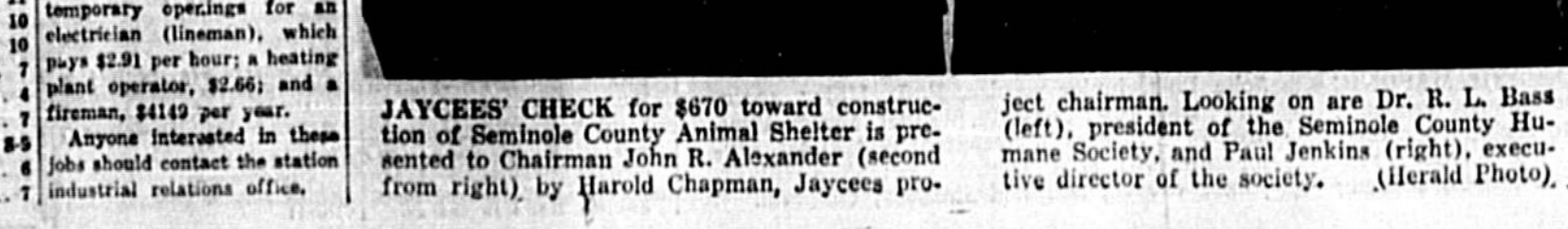
