Administration Leaders Believe Time Is Ripe For Drive To Expand Credit

Sanford High School closed its regular 1937 basketball season in the school auditorium Saturday night by dropping a 39 to 25 game to the Leesburg Yellowjackets.

## New Kind Of Government Just Born In Portugal

Attached to the national assembly was to be a corporative chamber, representative of the social interests, these being considered in their economic, cultural and administrative branches. In other words, there was to be representatives from the towns of capital and labor, of the advanced professions — men possessed of special knowledge of their subjects.

Every measure introduced in the assembly first had to be considered by this corporative chamber, which was charged to make a report on it before it could be introduced to the assembly.

Contrary to the assembly, members of the chamber are not to be elected. The premier and his cabinet are responsible only to the president. They can not be ousted by an adverse majority in the assembly but by defect of any of its members they propose.

The vote of the people is not universal. To the contrary, all citizens over 40 percent of the population are disfranchised. The bulk of the voting power is in the hands of the responsible heads of families, be they men or women.

This new form of parliament was spread with solemnity the other day by President Carmona. In his address Carmona outlined the means of transport, increase the production and distribution of electrical power, carry on the great work of irrigation, and further up the bonds between Portugal and its colonial empire.
