### Kennedy Opposed To Branding Nazi **Group Subversive**

WASHINGTON (UPI) - Ally. Gen. Robert F. Kennedy has informed a senator that he opposes branding the American Nazi Party as a subversive group because it would give the Nazis free publicity.

Kennedy said in a letter to Sen.

Kenneth B. Keating (R-N.Y.) that the Justice Department and "all sensible Americans" despise the Nazi doctrines. The party is being

watched closely, he said. But the Cabinet officer said that steps to place the Nazis on the attorney general's list of subversive organizations would give party leader George Lincoln Rockwell a public forum to spread his "obnoxious doctrines." Kennedy said the practical way to deal with Rockwell and his followers was for local authorities to prosecute them when they violate the law.



PARIS (UPI)— Betting among Western diplomats in Europe is that there will be an East-West summit conference Before the year is out. Nikita Khrushchev has made i

clear he wants one. The Western government heads are far from enthusiastic. But if

Khrushchev keeps forcing the pace on Berlin, officials believe the West may find itself pushed into such a meeting as the only hope, perhaps the last hope, of heading off a shooting war which neither side wants.

Summit or no summit, the next three months are likely to be one of the busiest periods of diplomatic talks and travel in recent

U. S. Secretary of State Dean Rusk and the British, French and West German foreign ministers more or less agreed at their Berlin crisis talks here last weekend that they would meet again dur ing the United Nations General Assembly in September for another review of the East-West situation.

According to present plans the West would make no move before that to invite the Russians to the

conference table. The next step, which is regarded by Western officials as a virtual certainty now, would be a meeting of President Kennedy. British Prime Minister Harold Macmillan, French President Charles de Gaulle and probably West German Chancellor Konrad Adenauer - if Adenauer is given another term in the Sept. 17

West German elections. The summit leader: would take the final decision whether-and, & so, how-to approach the Russians for talks on Berlin.

The French are particularly reluctant to make the first move, arguing that simply to offer talks means giving away one tactical point. De Gaulle also argues that negotiations can only weaken and certainly cannot improve the Western position.

EDITORIAL COMMENT

### Let's Wake Up!

"If only the public would wake up to the danger which is resulting from careless fires. . . ."

With this statement Forest Ranger Lewis Williams of the Longwood station opened a statistical account of the needless timber losses in Seminale County since the first of the year.

His comparative report shows a total of 110 fires to date against 114 for the entire 12 months of 1960. Incendiary fires (those deliberately set) number 53 as compared to 54 last year. These, plus the 39 careless fires have destroyed 2,217 acres of county pastures and timberlands. An additional 1,000 acres have been burned through fires of miscellaneous origin.

And, at the present rate of timber used in the state. within the decade we will be using more than we can produce even though vast acreages are being replanted each year with the cooperation of the Florida Forestry Service which, in 1960, distributed 140 million seedlings to landowners for this purpose.

such needless waste . . . if you must burn, call the Forestry Officials who say that they will be glad to come out on a standby basis and remind that it always is casier to prevent than to control a wildfire.

And, contrary to the prevalent idea that it is best to burn just before a summer rainstorm, the Ranger advises that just now, when the county still is extremely dry, too often the heavy winds accompanying what appears to be an approaching drencher only serve to fan flames and blow any real rainfall from the area.

We remind, too, that there is a \$1,000 fine or three months in jail for those convicted of causing incendiary fires and \$200 fine or three months in jail for the careless fire charge.

We also urge full compliance with the request of Rangers, who say that most set fires occur over the weekends, that Seminole County residents report to them or to the Sheriff's Dept. any persons whose actions indicate the making of a deliberately set fire.

Let us all help grow our own timber and feed our own cattle so that our state can be self-sustaining in providing these commodities.


