Long range plans for flood control in the St. Johns River Valley were outlined to 100 members and guests of the Lake Harney Civic Association by Theodore E. Haeussner, chief of the water management section, U. S. Army Corps of Engineers, Jacksonville district, last night at Sieg

> The program is under the joint control of the Army Engineers and the Central and Southern Florida Flood Control District (CSFFCD), which has been constructing flood control projects (canals, dams, etc.) from Kissimmee southward for more than 20 years. The CSFFCD taxing area includes propertites adjacent to Lake Har-


