Pollution Officer Says: 'Unhappy'

"I am not satisfied with cleanup in the Port of Sanford," Pollution Control Officer Langley Adair, has stated. "My office here in Sanford is to submit a report with photos to the legal department for the State Pollution Control office. We are presently consolidating data to present to the U.S. district attorney for possible prosecution under the federal Refuse Act of 1939." Crapps Opens Election For His City Position

Sanford City Commissioner J. H. (Jimmy) Crapps today announced he will not seek re-election to the office he has held for the past three-year term. Crapps, who has served on the City Commission for a total of nine years, said he made his decision not to offer himself for re-election based on the press of business and other personal obligations. The announcement by Crapps today leaves the seat held by him open to one announced candidate, John Morris, who paid his \$50 qualification fee a week ago. At least one other aspirant is known to be interested in seeking the spot but has not officially announced. He is former City Commissioner Earl Higginbotham, who earlier expressed himself as willing to see if Crapps would run for another term. Two men have announced their candidacy for the only other seat open this year on the City Commission, that now is held by W. Vincent Roberts, who is expected to qualify also for the same slot this afternoon.

Appeals For 'Sense Of Fairness' Askew Firing On Tax Opponents

Askew, who ran for election last year on a pledge to reform taxes, is campaigning for the proposed constitutional amendment which voters will act upon Nov. 2. Askew ripped into House Minority Leader Reed before the Boca Raton Republican's constituents here. While Reed was critical in permitting the tax to be voted upon this year, he has opposed its passage. Askew repeatedly has stressed that personal income cannot be taxed under the proposed amendment. He said he opposes the hardest against the corporate profits tax so that you'll have to pay a higher sales tax. He said Winn-Dixie would prefer an increase in the 1 per cent sales tax because of the commission they get for collecting the tax. The 3 per cent rebate brought Winn-Dixie \$285,000 last year. 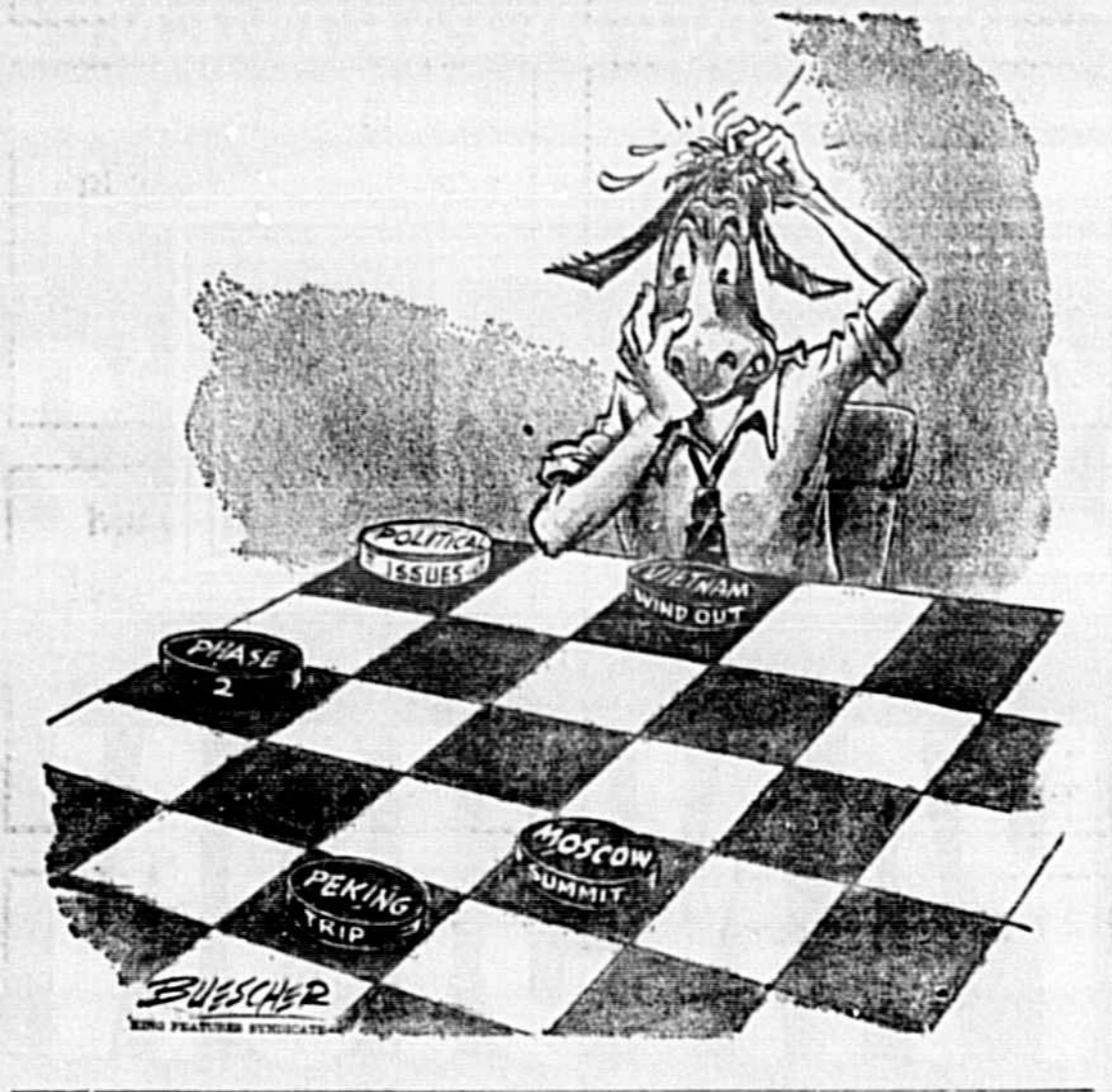

Prominent Centenarian Still Plays Piano Mary Stevenson Celebrates 100th Birthday

FOREST CITY—A gracious lady, Mrs. Edward Stevenson, celebrated her 100th birthday Monday with members of her family and friends during a party at the Florida Living Center in this city.

She is the former Mary Blackwell, born Oct. 23, 1871, in Graham, Miss.

Mrs. Stevenson received congratulations from President Richard Nixon, a card which she greatly appreciates.

This is the second time Mrs. Stevenson has received presidential recognition. A pianist of concert calibre, she gave a command performance at the White House for President Harry S. Truman and guests. At the time she was in her 82nd year and had recently retired as a piano teacher. Following the formal performance, President Truman joined her in a duet.

Greatly impressed by her talent the President made arrangements with Radio and Recording Station WIS of St. Louis to record her work. It is said that she played steadily for an hour during the recording session. Later she was presented the master record and several duplicates which she distributed to members of her family.

Two of her pupils who have gained international repute as pianists are Gordon Jenkins, Hollywood, Calif., recording star and Russell Davis, composer and concert pianist. David has also been guest conductor of the national. A graduate of the Cincinnati Conservatory of Music, Mrs. Stevenson studied with Armin Doerner and Senior Albin Goro, and later with composer Louis Victor Sarr. She was organist at the First Presbyterian Church of St. Louis, and she organized the Mary Blackwell Choral Group, widely known in the Mid West.

Except for teaching, her professional career was thwarted when she married the late Edward L. Stevenson, a prominent St. Louis attorney, and became the mother of seven children.

Her children include two sons and five daughters. They are Edward of Palm City; Marion, of St. Louis; Mrs. Polly Murphy of Orlando; Mrs. Lewis Truman, Atlanta, Ga.; Mrs. Gladys Maddock, Los Angeles, Calif.; Mrs. Dolly Millenberger, St. Louis, and Mrs. Barbara Graham, Barcelona, Spain. There are eight grandchildren.

At times Mrs. Stevenson has traveled extensively with members of her family including trips to the Far East and Europe.

The centenarian, still in comparatively good health is most gracious to all with whom she comes in contact daily. When in the mood she will play the piano for the entertainment of other residents of the Center.

Though age has slowed the once nimble fingers, those who hear her play claim they recognize the touch and timing of the artist.

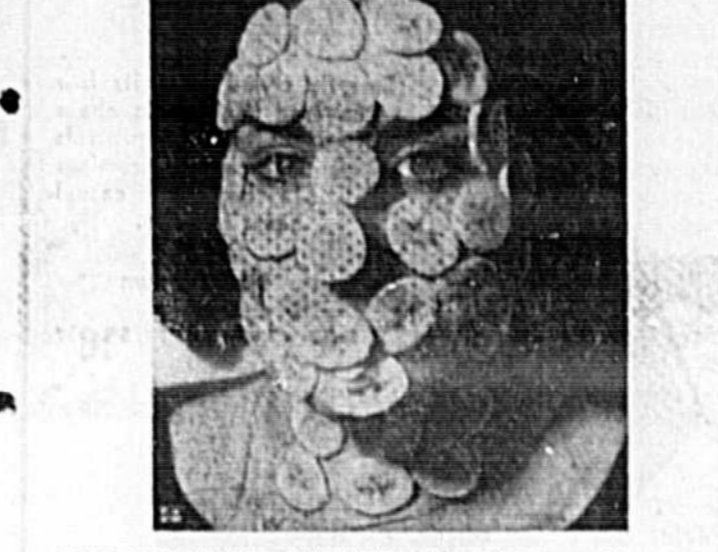

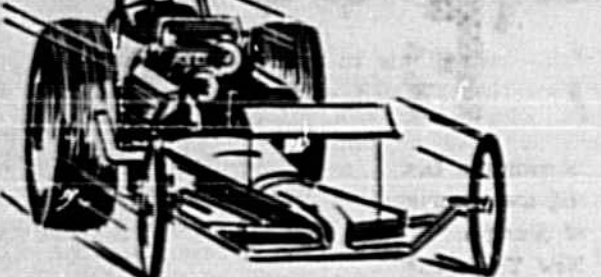

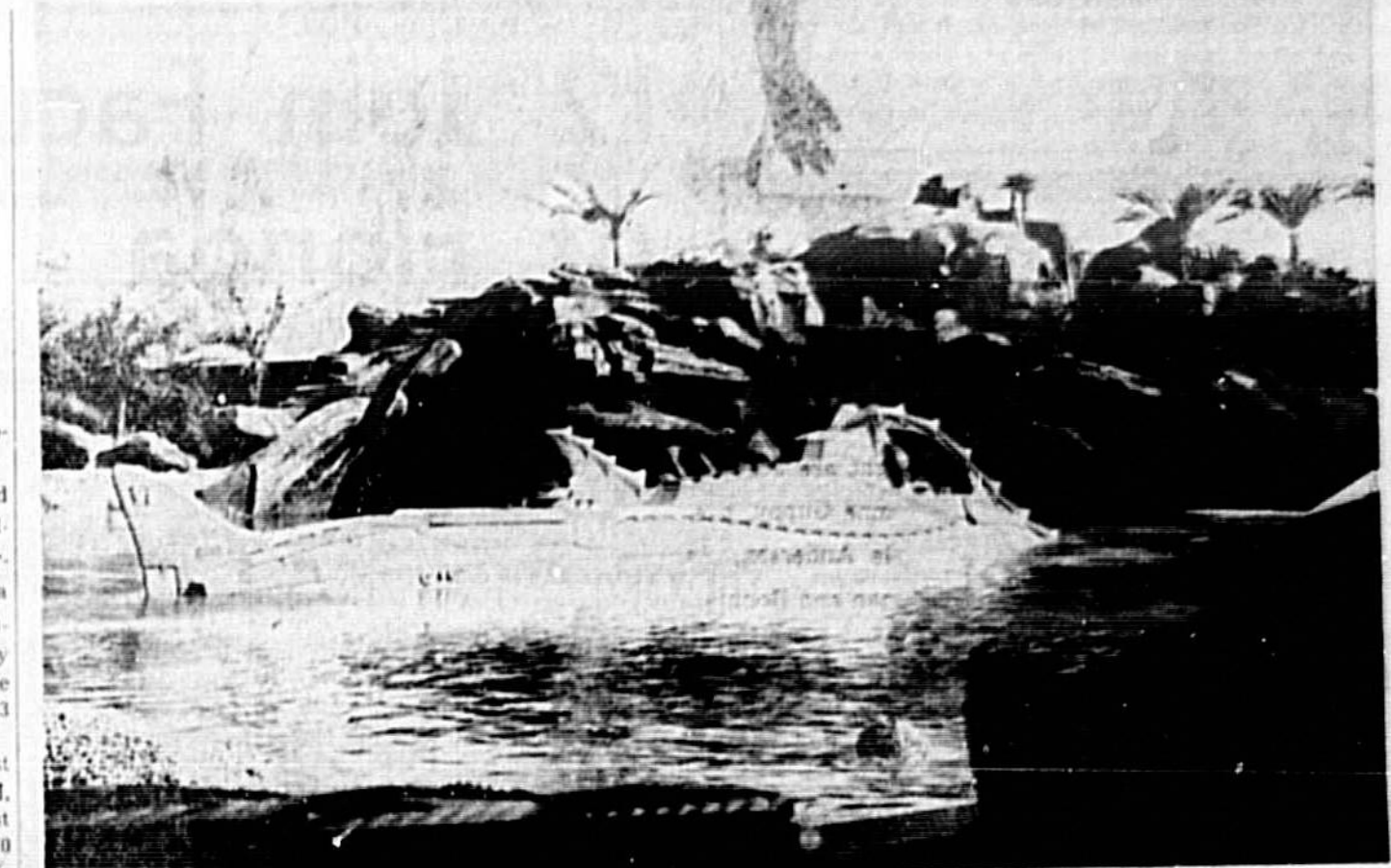

In Seminole Schools Education For Retarded

Seminole County is making rapid strides toward services for exceptional children in its public schools.

The educable mentally retarded child who is identified by a pilot program serving to identify their regular school program.

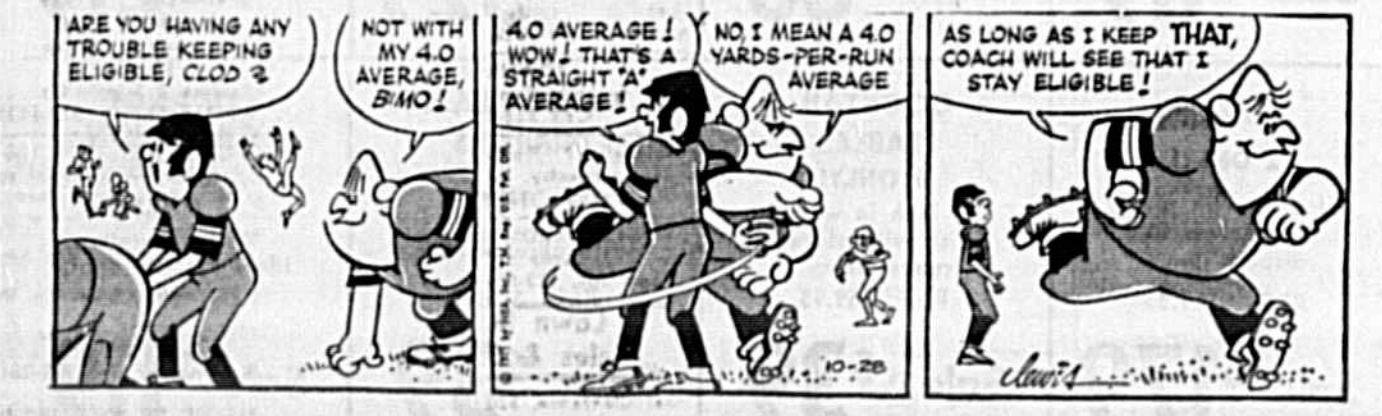
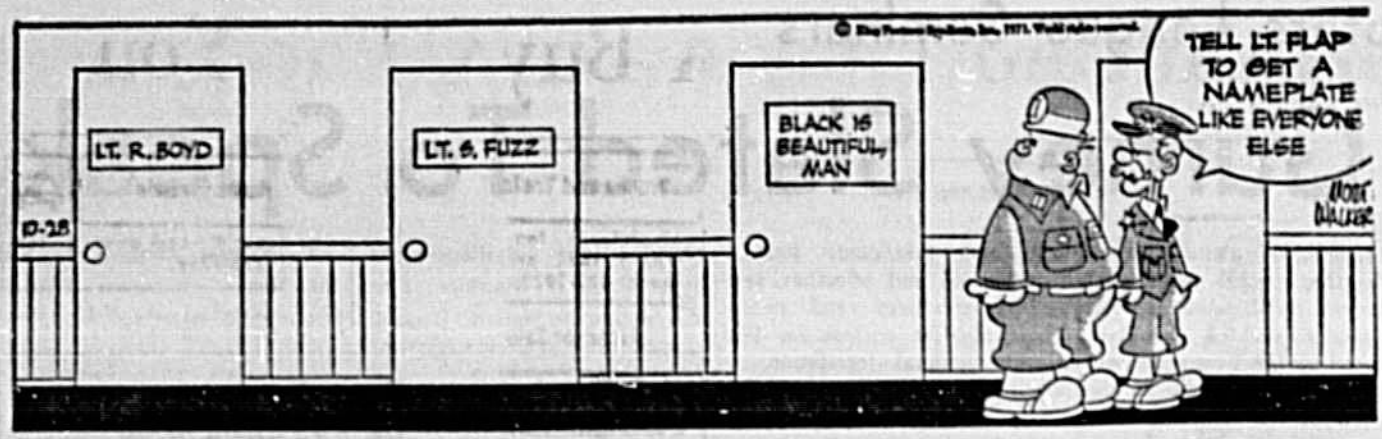
