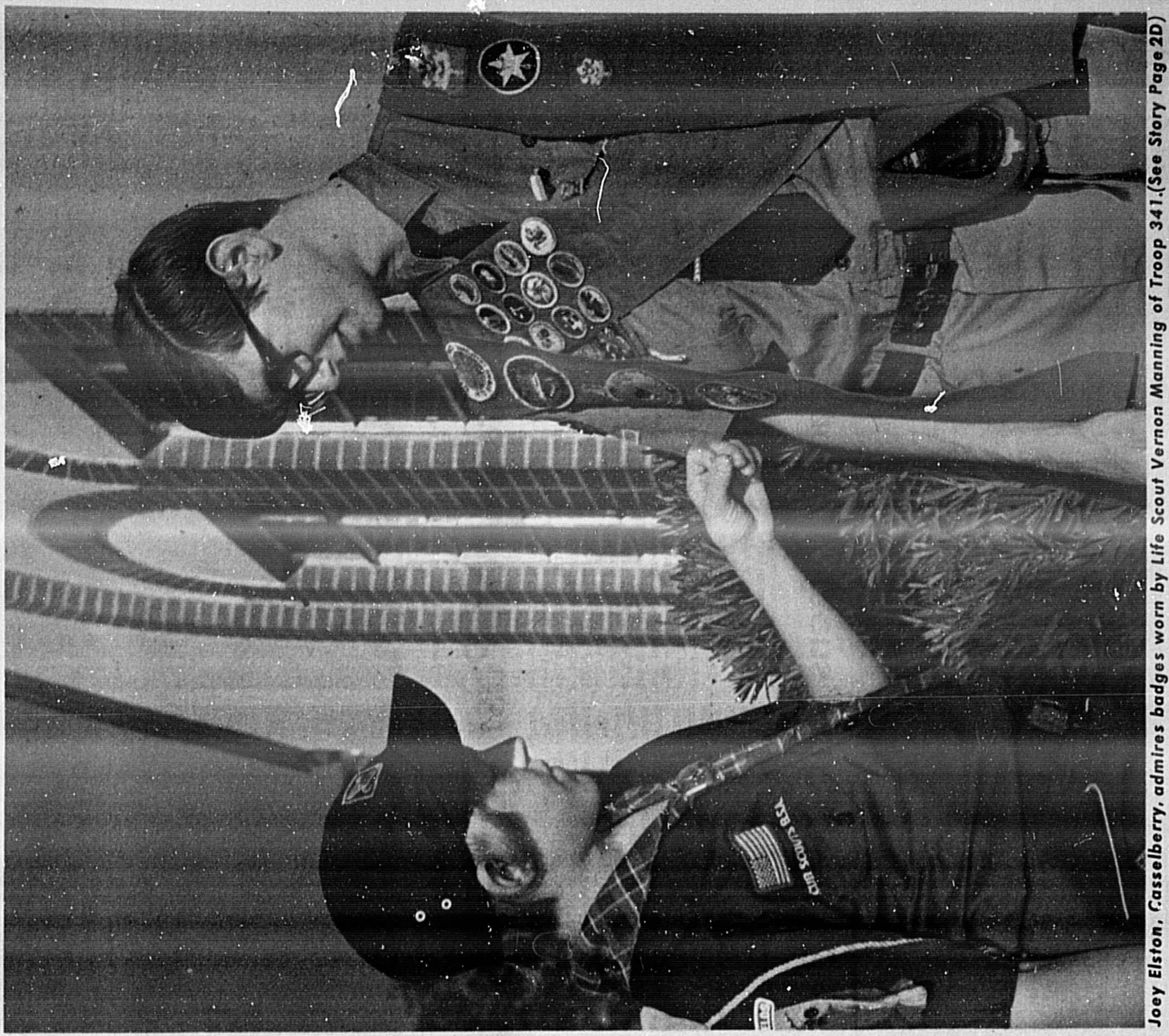

# Sanford Ballet Guild Proves That The Impossible Dream Really Can Come True

Last year, the Ballet Guild company performed at the three-day Dimensions '74 Art Festival at Loch Haven Center in Orlando, where its performance was taped for the public television station. The public television station also plans another 60-minute show this year featuring the Ballet Guild.

The young troupe also stole the show last year at a three-day seminar at Birmingham Southern College when it was asked at the last minute to give an entire evening's performance instead of performing just two numbers. In addition, the Ballet Guild dancers presented performances with the Seminole Mutual Concert Association and for the National Secretaries Association convention at Walt Disney World in 1974.

They also are frequently invited to perform and give demonstrations on ballet for civic groups and schools.

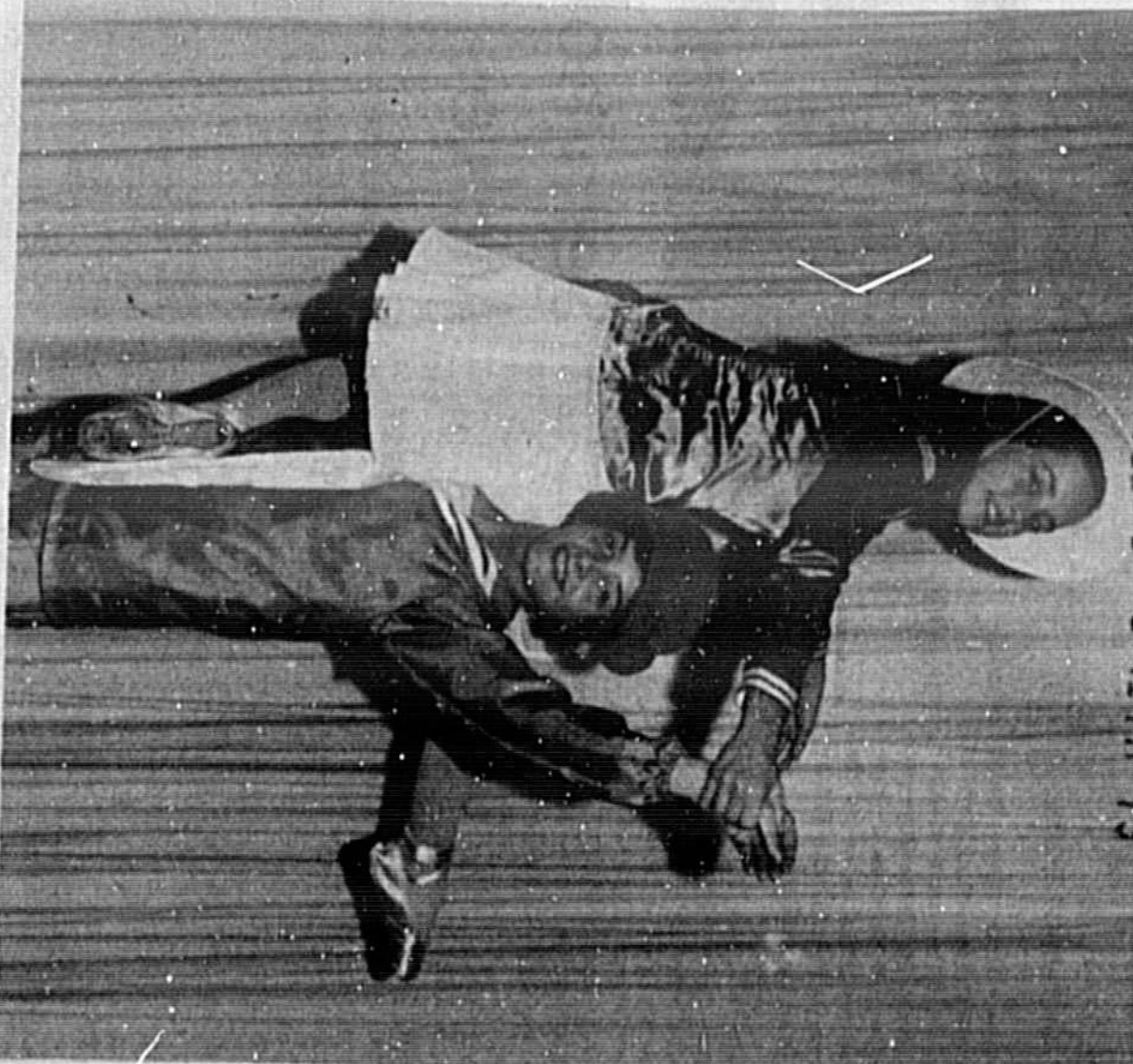
To be eligible for the 26-member company, dancers must be at least 12 years old, have two years ballet training, and they must be auditioned and judged by a dance-master from the National Regional Ballet Association, headquartered in New York City.

Once accepted, they practice ardently Saturdays and Sundays and must maintain a "C" average in their regular schoolwork.

The guild is a non-profit organization and financed completely through community and civic support.

The dancers do not pay for membership in the Guild. Instead, each has five sponsors who contribute \$10 each to help pay for costumes, travel expenses and production costs.

Private donations and an annual Ballet Guild Open Golf Tournament, founded last year by Dr. Thomas Largent and Joe Kurimal, are major sources of funds to finance the Guild's production and travel expenses.

Neither the directors nor the choreographers, sisters Valerie Rye World and Miriam Rye are paid for their work. The Rye sisters, who opened their own School of Dance Arts in Sanford in 1965, have trained for more than 20 years under New York's finest dance masters, including Richard, Thos. Karel Shook, Earle Bagshaw, Matt, Marjorie Aubrey Hill, and Edward Cahan.

Their professional background includes Broadway dancers and Broadway shows, "Anything Goes" and "Carnivals" as well as summer stock, night club engagements and touring as a song and dance team.

As teachers in Jacksonville before coming here, they also were choreographers for little theater groups and the Drama Department at Jacksonville University.

The board of directors governing the Ballet Guild is drawn from the cultural community and includes persons with professional backgrounds in the arts. The board consists of: Dora Lee Russell, president; Eleanor Maresca, vice president; Doris Williams Dietrich, recording secretary; David Lewis, corresponding secretary, and directors Mildred Caskey, Rich Grover, Beth Nicholas, Walter Rye and Ingonia Yarborough.

The Ballet Guild is also one of two Seminole groups belonging to the Central Florida Council of Arts and Sciences whose membership roster includes the Florida Symphony Orchestra and some 50 other organizations.

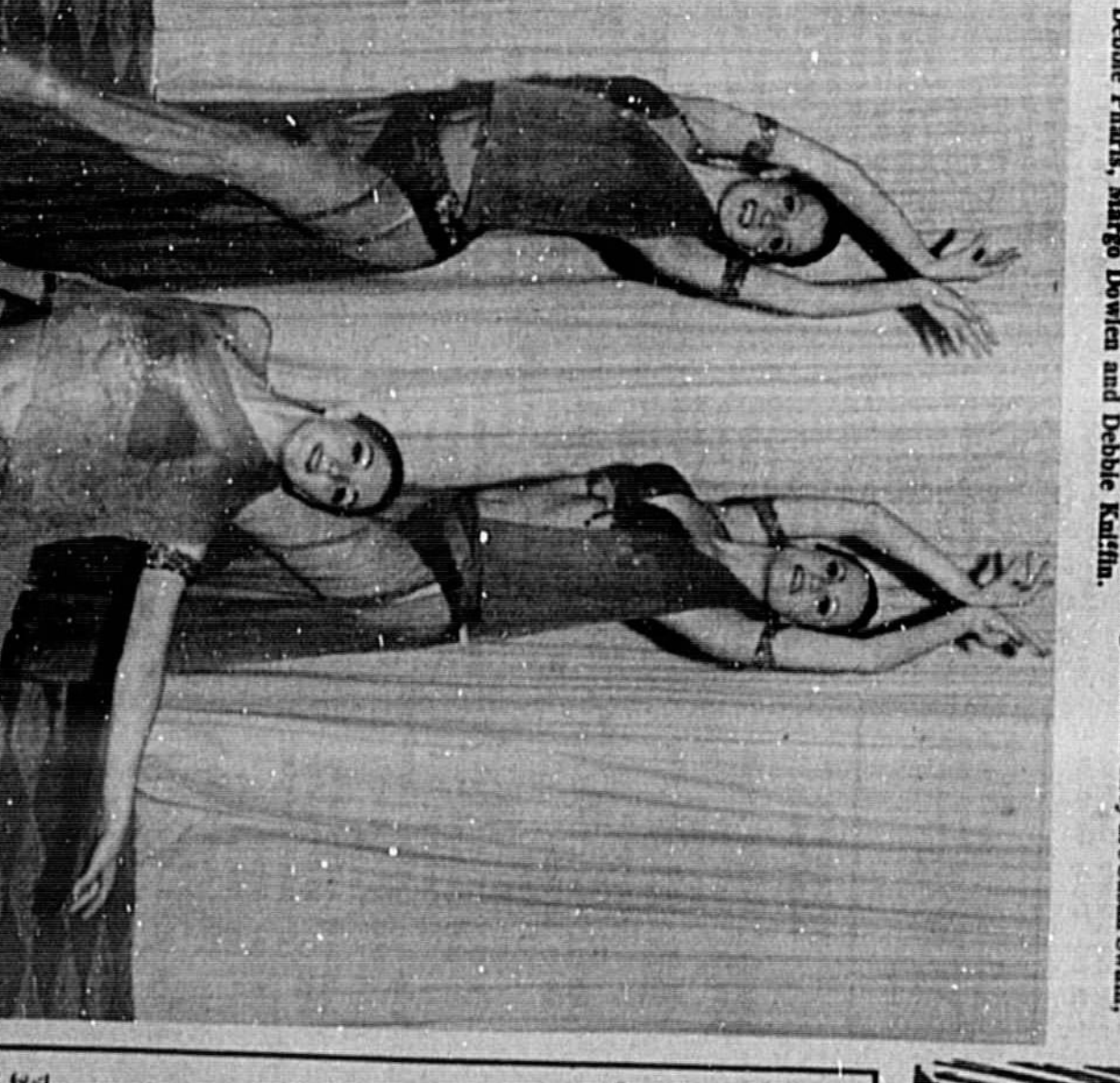
