Stadium plans aired

SANFORD — After several years of consideration regarding the future of the Sanford Memorial Stadium, it now appears as though it will again become a major focal point for Central Florida sports activities.

Listening to Randy Johnson, president and CEO of the Central Florida Sports Authority, one may get the opinion that Sanford's stadium will soon be drawing thousands of players and supporters to the area, possibly more than ever before.

According to Johnson's estimates, if the stadium is put back into the scope of use predicted by the authority, it could see an estimated economic impact of \$12 million by the 1999 season.

Johnson made an appearance at the Sanford City Commission work session Monday afternoon, explaining what may be expected at the stadium if the city enters into a full-partnership agreement with the Central Florida Sports Authority.

The Authority is a non-profit organization created to attract international, national and regional events, as well as sports-related business and activities to the Central Florida area. It is funded by five counties, Seminole, Orange, Osceola, Lake and Volusia, along with the cities of Altamonte Springs and Oviedo. With approval by Sanford a third city would be added to the conglomerate.

Sheriff gets 3, not 5, to provide security

SEMINOLE COUNTY — Usually when the Sheriff makes a request just about everyone in the county complies without blinking an eye.

This was not the case Tuesday when the Board of County Commissioners were asked for funds to hire a Building Security supervisor and four security specialists to monitor the new Sheriff's Office and Public Safety Building at Five Points.

Sheriff Don Eslinger will have to wait awhile to get all he asked for. The best the commissioners could agree on Tuesday was to approve hiring the supervisor and two specialists. Commissioner Daryl McLain voted against and suggested a further study of the issue.

County Manager Gary Kaser said he disagreed

with the procedure for the security staffing. "We should have had these details a year ago," he said. The sheriff's office requested a General Fund Contingency of \$59,437 to hire the security personnel. That would cover costs for 1997/98 fiscal year alone.

Chief Deputy Sheriff Steve Harriett and Sheriff's Office Director of Staff Services Penny Fleming explained how important it was for the security people to monitor the building that will be used by both the deputies and Public Safety staff. "This is a seven day a week, 24 hour a day operation," Harriett said.

It was argued that the Sheriff's Office and Public Safety could supply the security people, shifting personnel Harriett said this was possible but other positions would then have to be filled. Public Safety Director Ken Roberts said

"We're the catalyst for economic development in the county and the region," said chamber President Wayne Weinberg. "We take a regional approach."

The Lake Mary chamber, the Sanford chamber, the Oviedo chamber, specific chambers for specific cities. They are the marketing arm of those cities. We are the marketer for the big picture in the county and the region.

Area road projects in line for additional funding

SEMINOLE COUNTY — The widening of Interstate 4 from the Longwood to Lake Mary interchange only took months, but to motorists during rush hour, it may have seemed like years of clogged lanes and standstill traffic.

Now, with approval by the U.S. Senate and

House possibly by next week, the work will be able to move further north. The I-4 widening project has already been planned, but financing is still being obtained.

The widening, now estimated to begin in approximately two years, is from Lake Mary, past Sanford, to the Saxon Boulevard exit in Deltona. Funding for the six-laning project, which will include a bridge replacement over the St. Johns

River, is now being finalized with an additional \$14 million to be allocated specifically for that project through expected passage of transportation legislation.

U.S. Representative John Mica has managed to push through the "Building Efficient Surface Transportation & Equity Act of 1997." The legislation has now been approved by the Transportation and Infrastructure Committee and is to be

considered by the full House of Representatives next week.

The passage of the bill will provide Florida projects with more money than presently available. "I am pleased to report to you that Florida will receive \$1.3 billion for the coming fiscal year under this bill, as opposed to \$770 million under our current funding formula," Mica said.

Talkin' trash: St. Johns Celebration cleans up the river

SEMINOLE COUNTY — Despite windy and cool weather, preliminary cleanup totals indicate that the 1998 St. Johns River Celebration assembled more than 6,000 participants Saturday morning to pull more than 153 tons of trash from the St. Johns River and St. Marys River systems.

People turned out in 17 counties -15 in Florida and two in Georgia- to remove trash of all kinds, including bottles, cans, furniture and appliances, that had been deposited in and along the St. Johns and St. Marys rivers, and three St. Johns River tributaries—the Ocklawaha, Wekiva and Econlockhatchee rivers.

"This event is a tremendous success each year in cleaning

up the river systems, while also bringing much-needed attention to the importance of protecting Florida's natural resources," said Henry Dean, executive director of the St. Johns River Water Management District. "We're pleased that so many people gave their time this morning to lend a hand to the effort. We look forward to bringing everyone back together on March 20, 1999, for the fourth annual St. Johns River Celebration."

The event is co-sponsored each year by the St. Johns River Water Management District and Keep Florida Beautiful. The cleanup began in 1996, when 5,000 volunteers collected about 300,000 pounds of trash. In 1997, more than 6,000 people re-

Prosecutors want boy, 14, indicted for Murder One

SANFORD - Jonathan Arce, 14, could be tried as an adult for the murder of 68-year old Jean Stillman. Prosecutors are asking a grand jury presiding over the case to handle Arce as an adult and to indict him for first degree murder.

Arce is being charged with the murder of Stillman, who was slain in her garage on March 10. The Oviedo police are still investigating the scene of the crime to try and formulate a motive that the boy may have had at the time of the attack.

Over two dozen wounds were found on the woman's body. The assailant used anything from a kitchen knife to a variety of garden tools. The medical examiner ruled that Stillman died from a wound to her neck.

Prosecutors are trying to get a life-in-prison sentence for Arce. Because the boy is under the age of 16, state law

prohibits him from being sentenced to the electric chair. He is presently being kept at the county's juvenile detention facility.

According to Arce's statement, Stillman was upset with him and she wanted him to come into her house so that she could confront him. The boy said that she came at him with a knife.

Stillman left a list on a table in her home of missing items that the police discovered. When police gained a search warrant, they found some of the items on the list in Arce's possession.

Arce's peers at Oviedo High School said that the boy was involved in gang activity at his former home in Miami. He joined the student body at Oviedo this past October, but skipped school a lot, according to students. A teacher at the high school told the *Seminole Herald* that Arce wore his collar up, a sign of possible gang connection.

Golf course lease plans at a standstill

SANFORD - Plans to re-lease the Mayfair Country Club golf course to United Golf Properties, Inc. are at a standstill. The time limit on a proposal between the present lease holder, Seminole Club, Inc., and United has run out.

Attorney Charles R. Harrison appeared before the Sanford City Commission Monday night, to report on the matter. "The time limit has expired for the re-leasing arrangement," he said. "The only reason I came before you is because the item was listed on the agenda for consideration, and there is no longer anything to consider."

Harrison referred to Warren E. "Pete" Knowles having appeared before the commission twice in recent times, to request consideration of the lease agreement. "But he never received any satisfaction," Harrison said.

Mayor Larry Dale quickly responded that Knowles had not appeared before the commission on two occasions. "He was only here once," Dale said, "and the proposal was never given to the city where it could be placed on an official agenda. Mr. Knowles only brought it up from the floor during citizen participation. It was never an agenda item."

"Nonetheless," Harrison continued, "the purchaser's letter

of intent time limit ran out and we have been unable to get an extension of the letter of intent." He added that the letter of intent had been in his hands since December.

"Then why didn't we even see the letter until February 23rd?" Dale questioned.

City Manager Bill Simmons said even if the letter was in the commission's hands earlier, he would still have difficulty in recommending any change. "There are still some outstanding issues involved with this," he said, "such as sums of money owed to the city by the present lease holder. Before the city could consider any change I would want the lease current and fulfilling all of the requirements."

He added, "From what I have seen, this proposal called for the assignment of a clear title to United Golf, and I couldn't recommend it. I suggest the matter be tabled."

Mayor Dale observed that "This is an ongoing issue. So when the present lease is settled, why don't you come back and we'll address the issues again. If we are going to sign a new lease, we want to be sure all of the old issues are addressed."

Harrison said he would be in meetings regarding the proposal later this week, and would inform the city regarding the further moves which may be brought forth.

The NIMBY attitude

Sanford doesn't need just one new hotel, such as that proposed for the Fort Mellon Park area. It needs two or three hotels, with convention facilities as well.

The *SeminoleHerald* editorials have mentioned this before, and will, no doubt, bring it up again in the future. Hotels bring people and people bring improvements in the local economy. Overall, everyone will benefit—from our local governments to businesses and individual residents.

There are many organizations which conduct conventions on an annual basis. For example, the Florida Association of Circuit Court Clerks. Each year that group draws over a thousand people for three days. Circuit Court Clerks rotate in various locations across the state, almost always in cities which are county seats. But they can only hold these conventions in areas where there are adequate convention facilities. Surely, it would be impossible to hold it in Sanford.

Look at what is happening. Our high schools are all going out of the area for their major events such as graduations. The Central Florida Zoological Park holds its annual fundraising galas out of the area. Local fund-raising events draw hundreds when they could draw thousands.

There could even be difficulties with the proposed improvements at the historic Sanford Memorial Stadium. Should predicted influxes of sports events blossom as expected, where would teams, supporters and fans stay while events are under way? Yes, we have some outstanding places to stay, but not to house thousands of visitors.

Look at what could be done if we had adequate hotel and convention facilities. Most conventions offer spare time. People staying in Sanford could visit the zoo, take a cruise on the St. Johns River, go for comfortable walks along the lakefront, even make a fishing trip.

Yet people object. They say the city doesn't need a major hotel. In effect, they are actually saying they don't want to see the city, its merchants and its citizens prosper. While most would deny it, they simply don't want progress, although they constantly scream for lower taxes, better paved streets, better street lighting and more places at which to shop.

Progress cannot come and will not come to our area as long as citizens continue to take the "NIMBY" approach (Not in My Back Yard).

Sanford is a great city in which to live and work. It will become even better, but unfortunately, until we eliminate this NIMBY attitude, it may take so many years to accomplish, that none of us alive now will ever prosper from the changes.

look at this, as a regional community with no boundaries."

With this perspective, it is easy to see the direction of the chamber. Weinberg said that 50 percent of the people who live in Seminole County work in Orange County. They work there but they live here and they spend here. Maybe they go shopping there, but they eat in restaurants here. And those people from Orange County, will go to Crane's Roost for entertainment...or go to downtown Sanford, so the money transcends the boundaries. And when you have the second smallest county in the community...you have to think of the broader perspective."

The Seminole chamber takes a 3-tiered approach in benefiting its membership, 1,400 large and small business owners. Through representation, networking and resources, the chamber focuses on businesses working together to make Seminole County a better place to live.

"By listening to the needs of our community, we heard that there is a serious concern about quality workforce in Seminole County," said Weinberg. The chamber, in partnership with BDOSiedman, LLP Consultants and Accountants and Seminole Community College, last year, researched published and distributed to the business and education community an assessment of the business environment and workforce issues in the county.

Community Luncheons, such as the State of the County Address, to be given Thursday by Seminole County Board of County Commissioners Chairman Randy Morris, are another way the chamber offers the opportunity for members to share ideas and develop business prospects. An education update, with Seminole County Public School Superintendent Paul Hagerly, E. Ann McOee, president of SCC and John Hitt, president of University of Central Florida, as speakers, is scheduled for next month.

The annual Growth Report, in January, began the year. The Legislative Luncheon, "when our representatives return from Tallahassee" is scheduled for May; the Small Business Awards, for September; and the 4th annual Industry Recognition luncheon, in November.

The chamber also sponsors the annual Political Hob Nob, in August, giving members the opportunity to meet and speak with candidates for various state and local offices.

Small Business Breakfasts are held every other month and Sprint sponsors monthly Busi-

ness After Hours at various locations around the county.

The Greater Seminole County Chamber of Commerce was the first Chamber to go on record in support of a conference center. Weinberg said and with the help of Jack Wert, Tourist Development Director for Seminole County, have identified the Interstate-4 corridor, near Heathrow as a possible site. Sanford Mayor Larry Dale presented an alternative site, at the January growth luncheon, for a development on Lake Monroe. Weinberg said, "We'll enthusiastically support a conference center in Sanford."

Weinberg joined the chamber in May of 1995, after serving as special assistant to Orlando Mayor Glenda Hood, as the television and film liaison and as news director and anchor on a talk radio station.

Weinberg serves as president, unlike other chambers, where the paid head is called an executive director. Weinberg said Seminole prefers the title of president, with a board of directors. "Since we promote business, our structure reflects a business structure."

The *State of Seminole County, a multi-media presentation featuring Seminole County Board of County Commissioners Chairman Randy Morris and the mayors of Altamonte Springs, Casselberry, Lake Mary, Longwood, Oviedo, Sanford and Winter Springs* will be held at the Orlando North Hilton in Altamonte Springs. There are no tickets available, but the luncheon was open to members and non-members. In the authority's mission statement, it explains that the mission is to "solicit and support activities, events and sports-related business that stimulate the Central Florida economy, construct and utilize sports facilities, enhance the area's image worldwide, provide outstanding entertainment and participatory opportunities and contribute to Central Florida's quality of life."

One of the first projects to be undertaken regarding Sanford is the authority's rebuilding and refurbishing of the stadium on Mellonville Avenue. "Our aim is to rebuild that historic stadium to its original glory," Johnson told the commissioners. "It is history and it is heritage, and there is no reason why we shouldn't have it as such."

Johnson said while he expected a renewed interest in the stadium would probably draw thousands of people to Sanford, he observed that the one problem might be a serious lack of available hotel and motel rooms for groups of such size.

"This seems to go hand in hand with the concept of us having a new major hotel at the Fort Mellon Park area," observed Commissioner Whitey Eckstein. "With a new hotel there, the people would certainly have a place to stay."

Commissioner Velma Wil-

liams agreed that it would be an excellent opportunity for the city of Sanford to have the old stadium refurbished.

Not all of the money for the rebuilding would be coming from the government entities involved in the authority. Johnson also projected fundraising events and opportunities, corporate sponsorships, state funding opportunities and private donations.

Events scheduled already include the 1998, 1999 and 2000 Amateur Softball Association Men's Super Open Softball Championships which have already been established.

Also planned are the new winter league major league baseball, National Junior/Florida Community College Athletic Association Men's Baseball Championships, as well as other championships and events for NCAA Division II and III, College Baseball, Seminole Community College Baseball, American Legion Baseball, Babe Ruth Baseball, High School games, classics and championships and amateur athletic union events.

He also suggested the stadium is a potential site for the Doyle Baseball camp, currently held at various sites throughout Central Florida on an annual basis.

A number of local amateur events would also be held at the stadium.

Other projects involve a

Cross Seminole Trail connection, a pedestrian overpass on I-4 for the Florida Scenic Trail, widening of SR-44 in Volusia County from DeLand to New Smyrna Beach, and various other transportation related matters.

Mica said he fully expects the legislation to pass, and that the money will become available to Florida, "to help meet the tremendous transportation needs throughout our area."

Slow-pitch to return SAC to offer girls' slow-pitch softball this fall

SANFORD - Starting next year, there's a good chance there will be two Seminole Athletic Conference Softball champions each season.

County athletic directors and school administrators have approved adding fall slow-pitch softball to the list of sports offered by Seminole County schools. Slow-pitch joins girls' weightlifting and girls' wrestling as new sports being offered under federal gender equity laws.

Play will begin in September and Oviedo Athletic Director Paul Greer said it is probable that the FHSAA will sanction the sports and recognize state champions. (Editor's note - The FHSAA recently tabled a vote on whether to sanction slow-pitch softball for 1998).

Greer said that one-third of all state schools must participate in order for the sport to be sanctioned as an official state title sport.

Seven schools in Seminole County, including Lake Mary, Lake Howell, Lake Brantley, Winter Springs, Oviedo, Lyman and Seminole, will offer the sport.

Lake Mary Athletic Director Doug Peters said that even if the sport isn't offered as a state-sanctioned sport, it would be a conference-recognized sport, much like boys' volleyball which crowns a VolleyFest champion each fall.

Greer said the credit belongs to Seminole Athletic Director and baseball coach Mike Powers.

"Mike Powers came up with the idea and we all have to give him full credit," Greer said. Powers has already put together a schedule

for next fall, including a tournament involving each of the county teams to be held at Lake Brantley on Sept. 12. All games would be played on Saturday's at one site, with each school hosting on a rotating schedule (i.e., Seminole one week, Lake Mary the next, etc.).

Seminole County schools played slow-pitch until five years ago when the county switched to state-mandated fast-pitch. Greer said that since most college programs only offer fast-pitch the change was made to ensure a better opportunity to receive athletic scholarships.

With federal gender equity laws requiring an equal number of opportunities for males and females and the inclusion of a large number of football players into the equation, athletic directors have been scrambling to even the playing field.

Stock: Wash chicken completely. Remove organ pack. In 1-1/2 cups of water dissolve bouillon cube and boil neck, gizzard, heart and liver for 4-5 minutes. Put aside to cool.

Stuffing: Sauté chopped onion, pepper, garlic and celery in 1 tbs. butter until onions are slightly transparent. Partially fry bacon and chop into small (3/8 inch) pieces. In a large mixing bowl mix egg, bread crumbs, sauté vegetables, 1/2 tsp. poultry seasoning, 1/4 tsp. each pepper, onion powder, and bacon. Add 1/2 cup stock and mix. Stuffing should be a sticky dough consistency.

Chicken: Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Stuff both body and neck cavities with stuffing mix. Paint chicken with 1 tbs. melted butter and sprinkle lightly with poultry seasoning and paprika. Pour 1/2 cup each of wine and stock into bottom of a large covered roasting pan. Place chicken with vegetable pieces surrounding chicken into pan, cover and cook for 1 hour. Remove cover and cook for additional 45 minutes. (Note: cooking times are approximate, always use a meat thermometer to check internal temp.) If chicken starts to get too brown replace cover and continue cooking until internal temp. reaches 170 degrees.

Gravy: When chicken is finished cooking pour all dripping from roasting pan into a large fry pan. Add 1/2 tsp. poultry seasoning, 1/2 cup each wine and stock. Bring mixture to a light boil and stir in roux. Continue to stir until gravy thickens.

5-6 lbs. whole roasted chicken
1/2 cup each finely chopped onion, celery, green bell pepper

6 slices bacon
2 cups seasoned bread crumbs
1 large egg
1 tsp. poultry seasoning
1/4 tsp. each onion powder, white pepper
5 tbs. butter
1 cup white wine (Zinfandel or Chablis)

Note: Do not buy or use cooking wines. If you don't want to drink it, don't cook

two end pieces about three inches wide from tortillas, reserve end pieces for lattice top. Using a whisk, combine eggs, milk and seasonings. Sauté mushrooms in butter. Layer bread cubes, ham, mushrooms and cheese in egg

pan. Repeat layers, ending with cheese. Pour egg mixture over each layer as it is completed. Cut reserved tortilla into 3/4 inch wide strips, brush with a little egg mixture. Arrange strips over strata. Bring foil over top and refrigerate 8 hours or overnight. To bake, preheat oven to 350 degrees F, place strata on cookie sheet and bring foil straight up to uncover and to support

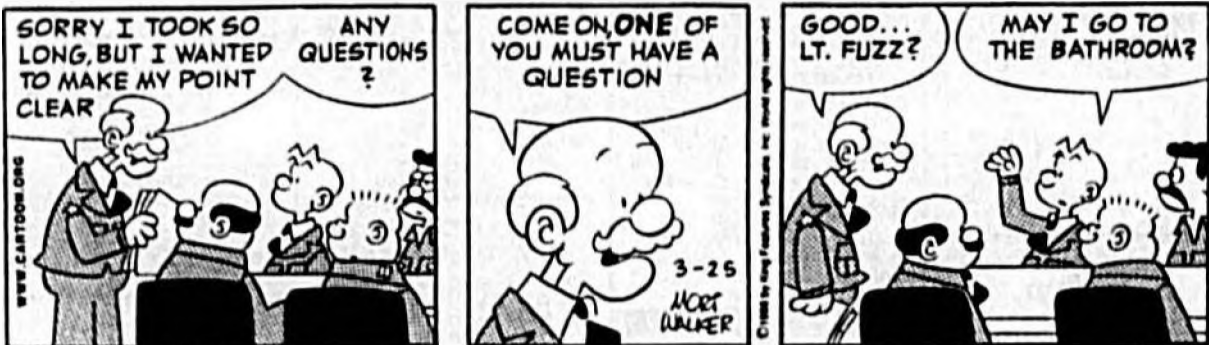

Microwaved food is safe

DEAR DR. GOTT: Is there any health hazard from eating food that has been cooked in a microwave oven?

DEAR READER: None whatsoever. In fact, such food may actually be more nutritious because the cooking time is lessened.

For example, if you boil your vegetables (rather than steaming or microwaving them), they will undergo many minutes of preparation. This prolonged exposure to heat may leach out vital minerals and nutrients. Contrast this to microwaving, in which food can be prepared in seconds or minutes. Moreover, because microwaves contain no X-rays, they do not cause any potential health hazards.

I like to microwave my vegetables because the process is environmentally more responsible than standard oven-cooking. My baked potatoes are ready to eat after five minutes of microwaving, compared to 45 minutes in a customary oven. This uses less energy — and it's fast.

When I was growing up, the pressure cooker was the appliance of choice: It cooked food in minutes. Now the microwave is in, although I continue to pressure-cook artichokes, a favorite treat.

DEAR DR. GOTT: I am an 82-year-old woman with an elevated blood level of alkaline phosphatase. It has progressively increased annually for the past three years and is now 454 units per liter. Should I worry about this?

DEAR READER: In my opinion, yes. The alkaline phosphatase is an enzyme manufactured in the liver and in bone. The normal value is 30 to 120 units per liter. Although the level often increases as we age, this increase is usually trivial. Similarly, levels in adolescents are often elevated, reflecting rapid bone growth.

More important, increased amounts of the enzyme often indicate serious bone or liver diseases, including metastatic cancer, Paget's disease, gallstones and cirrhosis. Some malignancies, especially lung tumors and lymphoma, are associated with high alkaline phosphatase levels, as are heart failure and blood clots in the lungs.

While some authorities discourage testing in elderly patients with isolated increases in alkaline phosphatase, most of my patients want answers and are willing to undergo moderate testing to identify any treatable problems. Such testing should, in my view, include blood tests of liver function, a blood count, chest X-ray, and a bone scan. Ask your doctor about this. Your alkaline phosphatase is quite high. I suspect that you have Paget's disease

of bone, a common and treatable disorder that causes weak spots which may easily fracture. Therefore, I think that further testing is advisable.

DEAR DR. GOTT: Every time I urinate in the toilet, I leave a pink ring in the bowl. This has been going on for about a year. Should I be concerned? DEAR READER: Although such a

discoloration could be caused by a substance in the toilet water, I suspect that the ring you described may actually be blood in your urine. Because even small amounts of urinary blood could reflect a serious underlying disease — such as a tumor or a dangerous kidney disease — I urge you to bring this symptom to your doctor's attention. With blood and urine tests, he should be able to determine if the pink ring is coming from you (and needs treatment) or from the water supply in your bathroom (in which case, a plumber is in order).

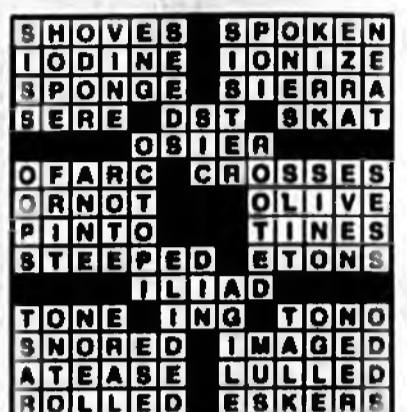

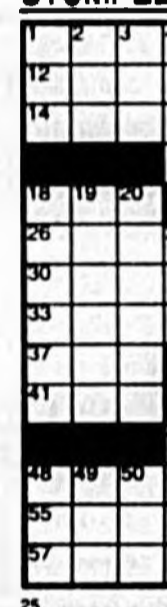

WIN AT BRIDGE

The oft overlooked danger

By Phillip Alder

When beginners are learning how to play in a suit contract, they are taught to count losers. Fine, as far as it goes. But in my experience, they tend not to worry about third round losers, usually with fatal consequences.

For an intermezzo, after partner opens one heart, what would you respond with the North hand in the diagram? Next, for the concerto, how would you plan the play in four hearts after West has led the spade king?

If you (wisely!) use the limit raise, you have no problem: You respond three hearts. But if you play the forcing raise, you have a big problem. You either underbid with two hearts, or overbid (or misbid) with four hearts,

or misrepresent your hand with two clubs. Nothing works!

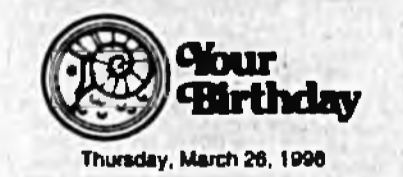
If, after winning trick one, you lead a trump immediately, you lose four consecutive tricks: the heart ace, two spades and the club ace.

You must do something to eliminate one of those spade losers. In other circumstances, leading a club at trick two, establishing a club winner for a discard, would be fine. But here that play is too slow; the defenders still get four tricks.

There is only one chance of success. Immediately play a diamond to dummy's ace, then finesse your diamond jack. True, if the finesse loses, you go two down when you could have settled for one down. But that 100 points is a worthwhile investment in your attempt to score up the game bonus. Here, though, the finesse wins. Now one of dummy's spade losers can be discarded on the diamond king. Finally, lead a trump, the loser count being down to three.
