Hopson Cited For Contempt As He Fails To Appear

House Probe Leader Says He Won't Let Witness Testify

WASHINGTON, Aug. 18 (AP)—The Senate yesterday lashed out at Howard C. Hopson yesterday, with a citation for contempt, and immediately instituted a new city-wide hunt for the elusive chief stockholder of the Associated Gas & Electric system.

In five minutes, without a word of debate and without a dissenting voice, the senate directed Hopson and his attorney William A. Hill, to appear before the senate bar, to show cause if any they have, why they should not be punished for contempt.

Within little more than an hour, a writ was served upon Hill as he sat in a drinking room of the fashionable Mayflower hotel, a bowl of pretzels before him.

Chester Jurney, the rotund senate sergeant at arms who has indulged in other games of hide-and-seek after those the senate wanted, served the papers with an "I am sorry" and set out in a new search for Hopson, a search un-crowned with immediate success.

These actions climaxed a day of staccato developments. Involved was a clash of senate and house authority, the reverberations of which could not be calculated.

Chairman O'Connor, democrat, New York, of the house lobby committee, whose investigators first reached Hopson with a subpoena, at first asserted he would not release the utilities magnate from that summons so that he could appear before the senate.

Government Wins Tax Suit Against Charles Mitchell

Board Upholds Major Court Opinion In \$1,275,644 Suit

WASHINGTON, Aug. 10.—

A victory was won by the government recently in a board of tax appeals decision, upholding major points in a \$1,275,644 income tax suit against Charles E. Mitchell, former chairman of the National City Bank of New York.

It embraced a story of Mitchell's dealings in fortunes from 1926, 1927 and 1928 in conformity with 1922 and 1923 National City Bank stock.

Bluntly the tax court said the "alleged sale" by Mitchell to his wife in 1929 of 18,500 shares of National City Bank stock was

substantiated with intent to evade taxes. The banker had claimed a loss of \$2,572,283, but the board said the alleged loss did not constitute an allowable deduction from income.

Mitchell was upheld in his contention that a \$256,214 loss suffered in 1930 on a sale of 8000 shares of Agueda Copper mining stock was deductible from net income for that year.

But his contention that 1934-1935 received in 1929 as a distribution from the National City management fund did not constitute taxable income was overruled again by the board.

The failure to report such payment for taxation was fraudulent with intent to evade tax.

Further, the board said Mitchell's 1930 income tax return was "fraudulent" because he did not include \$34,500 of dividends on the bank stock "fraudulently" sold his wife in 1929.

Treasury officials estimated the board decision validated approximately \$1,200,000 of the original \$1,275,644 claim against the New York financier, for it held that his jury acquittal in a New York District Court on personal charges of tax evasion "shall bar" the imposition of the penalty of 50 percent of the deficiency.

The Treasury had claimed tax deficiency of \$728,799 for 1929 and \$121,719 for 1930. The respective 50 percent penalties brought the total assessment to \$1,275,644.

Mitchell resigned as head of the National City Bank early in 1932. His stock transactions had been brought out previously by the Senate Banking Committee's stock market investigation.
