WASHINGTON, Aug. 18 (AP)—The public and private activities of Herbert Hoover are causing more discussion among the politicians than almost any other feature of the national political scene.

Whether or not it is indicative of their actual expectations, some of those in the inner Roosevelt circle at Washington have been offering even money bets that the former president will be re-nominated by the Republicans.

Among the Republicans themselves, a distinct cleavage in this subject grows more apparent constantly. There have been some warm private expressions of support for those who think Mr. Hoover has the best possible chance of nomination, and those who think that for the good of the party he should announce at once that he will not be a candidate.

His Chicago statement, which lengthened the Democrats' task, is exactly what they want to see in changing the constitution.

Hopson Cited For Contempt As He Fails To Appear

House Probe Leader Says He Won't Let Witness Testify

WASHINGTON, Aug. 18 (AP)—The Senate yesterday lashed out at Howard C. Hopson yesterday with a citation for contempt, and immediately instituted a new city-wide hunt for the elusive chief stockholder of the Associated Gas & Electric system.

In five minutes without a word, Hopson and without a dissenting voice, the senate directed Hopson and his attorney William A. Hill, to appear before the senate bar, to show cause if any they have, why they should not be punished for contempt.

These actions climaxed a day of starcast developments. Involved was a clash of senate and house authority, the reverberations of which could not be calculated.

Chairman O'Connor, Democrat, New York, of the house lobby committee, whose investigators first reached Hopson with a subpoena, at first asserted he would not release the utilities magnate from that summons so that he could appear before the senate.

But when a senate writ for Hopson's appearance, suspended his subpoena, O'Connor lashed out at the senate as a direct affront to the house.

He asserted he might seek from the house a writ for Hopson's arrest. He succeeded the first committee investigator to reach him would hold him.

"I hate to have Mr. Hopson taken to the side of the road and held there until he is ready to testify," O'Connor said.

Ethiopia Asks League To Let Her Secure Arms

Groundwork Laid For Opening Of Tri-Power Discussions

Ethiopia dispatched a strong appeal to the League of Nations Wednesday that she be allowed to receive munitions as the groundwork was laid for the opening of the tri-power conference on her dispute with Italy.

The day's developments included Geneva. Ethiopia urged the league council to have nations of Europe lift an arms embargo against her, asserting Italy is making unchecked preparations for the massacre of a people which constitute a menace to none.

Rome — Premier Mussolini called several thousand members of the military reserve classes of 1911, 1913 and 1914 to report for further training. The steamship Garge, several transport to sail for East Africa within a week, left with 2000 troops and a large quantity of supplies.

London — David Lloyd George, World War premier, charged Britain, France and Italy had wrecked the power of the League and where preparing to hand Ethiopia over to Mussolini.

Paris — The tri-power conference were ushered in by talks between Premier Laval and Anthony Eden of Great Britain with both frankly afraid of war. They hope to work out a plan for Ethiopian economic concessions to Italy which will satisfy Duce and cause him to call off his East African campaign.

Addis Ababa — Emperor Haile Selassie pushed his program to strengthen northern Ethiopia against a possible Italian attack. Unofficial reports said a huge animal train would leave today for the North with arms and ammunition.

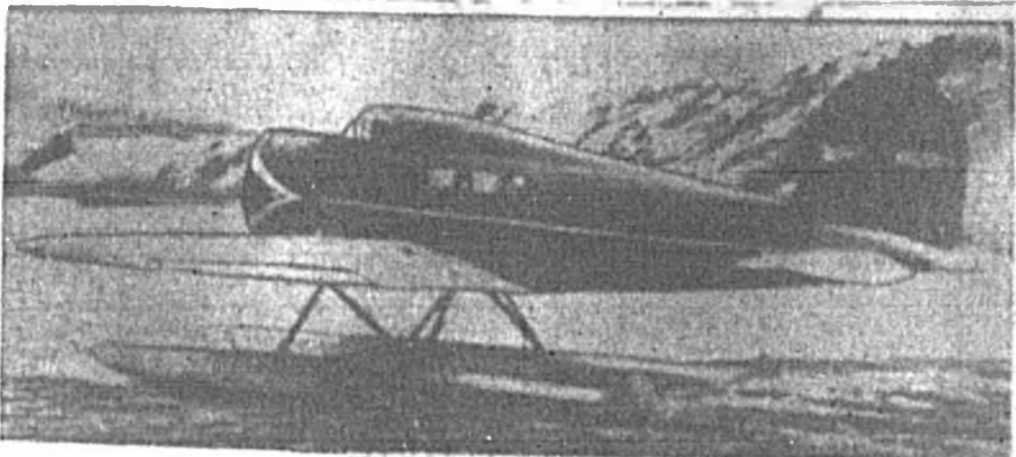
