Washington, Feb. 4. Highway mprovement in the state of Florida will be given a big boost if the good roads hill, which has just passed the house of representatives by a majority of 281 to 81 becomes a law,

Under that bill the state of Florida is to receive from the Federal Treasury \$220 Us per assum to aid in the construction and improve ment of roads. Of this amount \$65. 000 is a specific annual appropriation, such as goes to every other state, and the balance represents Florida's pro rata, based on population and mileage of rural and star mail routes, the theory of the bill being federal and in the construction and maintenance of rural post




