Pelham, if the resolution is approved, would be required to (1) resign his seat as a member of the Seminole County Commission, (2) take a leave-of-absence from his teaching position or (3) resign from the school system,

One section of the "political activities" resolution reads, in part; "If elected to office which in any way interferes with their regular school work, they shall take a leave-of-absence from their positions or resign from the school

Pelham must leave his school duties every Tuesday for County Commission meetings, and at other times for called county meetings and workshops. (Relative to holding two positions, John Evans is chairman of this same School Board and a member of neither of which conflict.)

This policy change will be submitted for approval, Board at 7 p.m. Thursday. This is one of a series of proposed policy changes

# 'Twin Lakes' Turnoff Proposal Is Revived

By FRED VAN PELT

The State Department of Transportation soon will be in a position to advertise for bids for a contract to improve SR 46 between the Wekiva River (county line) and Interstate 4, it was learned this morning. (The State Department of Transportation continues under a news "blackout" under orders of Gov. Claude Kirk since the State Senate rejected his choice for transportation secretary.)

The Governor's press secretary telephoned The Herald this morning to report that "part of SR 46 will be in a new location." This means that the highway will pass to the north of the community of Paola. The new highway will be two lanes although the state will be acquiring land for a four-lane right-of-way. A. A. Davis, planning engineer from the DeLand district office of DOT, informed a public hearing last Oct. 23 that the SR 46 improvement would be com-

pleted by July 1. Meantime, county civic leaders were reviving plans for petitioning the federal bureau of roads for a new intersection at "Twin Lakes" for Interstate 4. This would be the 25th-20th Street extension from Sanford, leading to Banana Lake.

It was pointed out Orange County is seeking an intersection on I-4 to serve Maitland, "right next door" to the Lee Road interchange. Seminole County has five interchanges, at Hwy. 17-92 on the north, First Street, Lake Mary, Longwood and Altamonte Springs. story which appeared in The A "Twin Lakes" interchange would serve all of Sanford Herald, back in 1914: South Sanford and environs.


