## Viet-Vets-Jobs

It is bad enough that our Vietnam veterans should leave behind a war that is "winding down" rather than ending on a victorious note. Equally disheartening is that they must come home to an economy that is also winding down from a major inflation, producing such a tight market for jobs that many veterans are simply exchanging the chow line for the unemployment line.

Economic realities must be faced by veterans as well as by other citizens, but it is ar American tradition that the man who has serv ed his country deserves more than an ever break when he returns to civilian life.

Any desire to put our national experience in Vietnam behind us should not lead to a blindness toward the obligation which those who stay home in any war owe to those who go off to fight in it.

The widespread indifference toward the problems of returning Vietnam veterans suggests that this is just what is happening. Moreover, publicity about drug abuse in the armed services has probably made the Vietnam veteran a suspect figure in the eyes of some employers, as if the drug problem were not as acuteor more so - among young people who have never been in uniform.

Actually, the young veteran with an honorable discharge brings to any job a quality that puts him far ahead of his peers - a record showing that he has recognized an obligation and fulfilled it, that he has learned to profit by training and to function as part of a complex organization, and that he has demonstrated stamina and maturity.



When asked about the rumor, Radloff with a smile answered, "That's a rumor, alright." At the same time talk is that Altamonte's other freshman councilman, Dan Dorfman, will oppose County Commissioner

Al Davis next year, Dorfman was not immediately available for comment on this one. But to put at least one rumor to rest, it appears that Altamonte Mayor Lawrence Swofford could not run against Davis even if he wanted to. ## Utilities To Expand

Speaking of Altamonte Springs, after less than 90 days operation, that city's sewer system has 750 connections. At the same time the city currently has 1,870 water customers. This number has more than doubled in the past four years. Customers of the water service are presently consuming one million gallons of water daily.
