This was reported today by Dr. Jay Roberts, chief of the pharmacology department of the Medical College of Pennsylvania at Philadelphia. He said the elderly patients potentially involved are those chronically affected by disturbed rnythms of the heart - called "arhythmias" - that commonly follow coronary heart attacks. He said the drug most commonly used is quinidine, which is taken orally, and that the research he reported specifically suggests new caution in the use of

It is better, though, to tax individuals for support of candidates with whom they do not agree and violently oppose? And isn't it euphoric to believe that the feared "special interests" won't find other means of helping and influencing their

Enterprising aspirants for

public office have in recent years been successful in attracting large numbers of small contributions from those who believed in them. Voluntary campaign gifts to an inspiring candidate offer more "voice" than the dollars plucked from tax payments and distributed anonymously. And enforcement of present laws could curb effectively candidate depen-


dence on "fat cat" backers. Public funds, distributed generously and equally, would give unfair advantage to incumbents who already loast a campaign headstart. At the same time, it would encourage frivolous candidates to enter primaries on the strength of the

federal handout. Yet, under certain of the formulas now under debate in the U.S. Senate, Alabama Gov. George Wallace, a formidable presidential contender in 1968. would be denied a share of the carcpaign pot under similar circumstances.

Bonn's Seeking Detente

WASHINGTON-President Nixon has come through the Watergate ordeal, so far, with no outward sign of strain. This is the remarkable report of aides and visitors whom we have sur-

Over the past year, the President's great re-election victory has exploded. One by one, close associates have pleaded guilty to crimes and have accused other trusted aides of crimes. Each day, month after month, has brought news of yet another moral

The President has been revealed as a tax fudger who would use dubious loopholes to reduce his income tax below that of an ordinary worker, a finagler who would bilk the taxpayers for improvements to his personal property. When crimes and improprieties have been traced right to his door, he has defended himself by claiming the President of the United States didn't know what was going on inside the White House.

The dreary revelations, piled one upon another, might have broken a man of less grim determination. The terrible weight could still affect his policy decisions and cause repercussions Therefore, we have interviewed several people who have

been in contact with the President-visitors, aides and a few intimates-to find out how he is weathering Watergate. Most asked us not to identify them; a few had no objections to being Those closest to the President agree he has gone through

agony over Watergate. On occasion, they have heard him erupt with rage and profanity. But most of the time, he has bottled up relive the glories of Napoleon's his feelings and gone off to agonize alone.

His favorite retreat during the lonely struggle with his seventh and greatest crisis has been Camp David in the Maryland mountains. Sometimes, his close friend, Bebe Rebozo, would join

There's a new item called "FUEL ADJ" on our electric bills. It stands for fuel adjustment, and has been a part of the rate structure since 1925. We started itemizing it on your bills last December to help you

better understand your monthly charges. This fuel adjustment represents the monthly changes in cost and quantities

of fuel necessary to meet the demand for power. It also reflects the higher cost of burning lower polluting fuels. It gives us a chance to make appropriate increases or decreases in your electric bill without having to go through costly rate case proceedings. Yes, we did say decreases.
