PEKING CALM AS TERROR REIGNS IN OTHER PARTS

Chinese Approach The Barricades Behind Many Small Groups Of Boys And Girls

Sentiment Against Foreigners Spreads

U. S. Catholic Mission Looted In Raid By Rioting Troopers

SHANGHAI, Midnight, March 30.—Chinese mobs opened attacks upon the barricades of the French concession tonight. The mobs of Chinese approached the barricades of the French concession, but the groups of small boys and girls who had been herded in front of the barricades to give them shelter.

The attack occurred at the Avenue Des Deux Republics, where mobs hurled missiles over the barricades and fired occasional shots. The American troops defending the concession were prevented from returning the fire directly because of the children in front of the barricades.

The French defenders, however, fired volleys over the heads of the children.

De Pinedo Resting After Havana Flight

NEW ORLEANS, Mar. 30.—(INS)—Commander Francesco de Pinedo, Italian aviator who is touring four continents by air, landed today after his record breaking flight from Havana, he having made the distance of 100 miles in six hours and 15 minutes, aided by a gentle wind.

All Foreigners Quit Wuhu HONG KONG, Mar. 29.—(INS)—All the foreign women and children have evacuated Wuhu. The male foreigners have been concentrated on shipboard. The situation is uncertain owing to anti-Chinese agitators. Food is scarce and the refugees are suffering hardships. A boycott is threatened against a number of Spanish priests who refused to evacuate. Extremists are active at Chungking. Chinese soldiers boarded a British vessel at Shanghai, but shortly afterward left the ship explaining they were "only visitors." However, they did not disembark till the British warship Cock after came alongside.

Conflict Between Forces LONDON, Mar. 29.—(INS)—The British government has ordered British forces in Shanghai under the general British command were sent here today, although the reports stated that there is some conflict between the leaders of the American and British forces in Shanghai as to how the co-operation shall be carried out. The British cabinet is understood to have sent instructions for the filing of a claim of damages. Nanking with the Nationalists had to have notified the Nationalists that the agreement with regard to Hankow may be considered void if there are further disorders.

French Deny Shanghai Report PARIS, Mar. 29.—(INS)—The French foreign office today denied the French concessions in Shanghai have been put under the command of Major General Duncan, British Shanghai defense commander. The war ministry announced today that the embarkation of 1200 British troops at Saigon, for service in Shanghai, is imminent.

Reports And Then Kills Self SHANGHAI, Mar. 29.—(INS)—Out. K. Araki, in command of a Japanese destroyer Hinoki, arrived in Shanghai today from Nanking and went aboard the flagship of the Japanese forces and reported to the admiral and then committed suicide. Araki left a note indicating that his mind had been unhinged by the horrors he had seen at Nanking.

(Continued from Page One) quieter it is still tense, menacing situations prevail in many places throughout the south, where bands of guerrillas and lawless gangs, taking advantage of the confusion created by the civil war, and flamed by Chinese and foreign agitators are threatening additional attacks against foreign residents. They are destroying foreign owned properties. Refugees, who are arriving in endless stream from coastal cities and interior towns, all tell tales of terrorism, cruelty and growing anti-foreign antagonism. Attacks against merchant shipping bringing refugees to Shanghai and escorts of small warcraft are on the increase. The British consulate was advised that particularly heavy gunfire directed by the Chinese against British convoy near Hankow. Chinese artillery has been used at Wuhu to cover the withdrawal of all British and American warships in anchor off the city. All Americans have fled from Wuhu except a few priests, who used to depart and leave the arch property at the mercy of the Chinese. All Americans are now out of Anh and Changchow and the Americans and British in Chungking are being as rapidly as they can. At Chongking, which was occupied by the Chinese, the Chinese seized Nanking, there a few Americans watching the progress of an American industrial corporation. FLORIDANS PAY OUT HUGE SUM FOR INSURANCE

State Insurance Head Says Over Million Dollars Per Week Were Spent Last Year
 TAMPA, Fla., Mar. 29.—(INS)—Floridians during 1926 spent for various forms of fire insurance an average of more than \$1,000,000 a week, about \$55,000,000 in all, as much as they expended and invested through the state insurer's office during the last fiscal year in all operating expenses of the state government, the support of its institutions, of higher learning, its hospitals, courts, prison and correctional institutions, its gigantic good roads program and the reclamation of Everglades.

RIVER SHANNON PROJECT BOOMS SOUTH IRELAND

Big Hydro-Electric Project And Speeding Up Farms Bringing Prosperity; \$30 Million Is Being Expended
 NEW YORK, Mar. 30.—(INS)—With the completion of the hydroelectric project in the River Shannon and the speeding up of production by the government in both agriculture and industry, the Irish Free State in from five to ten years will be the most prosperous nation in Europe, Lindsey Crawford, Trade Representative of the Irish Free State, declared today in an exclusive interview with International News Service.
 The government is spending from \$25,000,000 to \$30,000,000 on the Shannon hydraulic development which will be finished in one and a half years, Crawford said. It will furnish 96,000 horsepower.
 "It will be capable of furnishing power and light to the entire Free State and will aid immensely in economic development," said Crawford.
 The contract for the project is let to Siemens Schuckert Co., of Germany.
 No Foreign Influx
 Crawford took occasion to deny

This statistical statement was made by J. C. Luning, state insurance commissioner, in an address here today before the annual meeting of the Florida Local Unwriters Association. The commissioner got under way to continue through tomorrow with several hundred delegates in attendance.
 "For the first time," Luning said, "the two per cent premium tax paid by insurance companies as passed one-million dollars in any one year, an amount equal to 11 per cent of the state treasury a quarter of a century ago."
 Net premiums received by fire insurance companies in Florida during 1926 amounted to approximately \$20,000,000 while losses incurred aggregated \$24,000,000, he recalled.
 "Of these enormous losses incurred," Luning continued, "about \$4,000,000 is chargeable to tornadoes, cyclone and windstorm lines and resulted from the hurricane which swept the southern and extreme western parts of the state last fall."
 "The companies had paid about \$1,000,000 before January 1 on account of these losses, and the margin between losses paid and sums incurred may be reduced by final adjustments already made. The storm doubtless increased these losses also, but I do not think of motor vehicle losses were normal in proportion to the volume of business and net premiums, though I have not as yet had time to compile and analyze the lines."

At this juncture Luning reminded his audience that the 1927 sessions of the Legislature begins two weeks and he outlined briefly his views on desirable legislation.
 He recalled that fire marshal have been introduced in the two sessions of the Legislature with a view of reducing fire losses in Florida, and that such a measure the House of Representatives passed two years ago but failed to reach a vote in the Senate.
 Favorable action toward a similar bill during the approaching session, he admonished the underwriters, "would depend very largely upon the support accorded the measure by the fire underwriters of the state."
