

OPINIONS VARY OVER VIEWS ON NAVAL ISSUES

Mingled Praise And Censure Trail Dis- sertations By Mac- Donald, Bridgeman

LONDON, Jan. 16.—Mingled praise and censure followed today in the wake of the two widely divergent views on the disarmament question offered by Prime Minister Ramsay MacDonald and William C. Bridgeman, former first lord of the admiralty in the deposed cabinet of Premier Stanley Baldwin.

While Premier MacDonald, talking in an optimistic vein, foreign newspaper correspondents urged that battleships be eliminated entirely by the naval power of the world and cruisers drastically reduced to a bare-bone force of minimum, Bridgeman had launched a bitter attack against the entire disarmament activities of the MacDonald government.

Bridgeman's direct charge that to reduce Britain's cruiser requirements from 20 to 24 would seriously impair the nation's security brings to a head the dissatisfaction felt by the conservative elements in British politics over the disarmament tactics of MacDonald's labor party.

The laborites regard Bridgeman's address as the "swan song" of the big navy men, but the conservatives, on the other hand, seem likely to take it up as a battle cry and pit all their forces against MacDonald's alleged "betrayal" from planning Britain in a position of insecurity.

In general, however, the reaction with favor to Premier MacDonald's straight-forward pronouncements on the disarmament question, and pays great attention to his warning that if the forthcoming five-power naval disarmament conference here results in failure, the world will be faced with at least 10 or 20 years of competitive warship building.

It was more than a mere coincidence that the two dissenting, opinionated attitudes on the disarmament problem should have been voiced on the same day.

From the very inception of the renewed disarmament negotiations, the "yes" and "no" camps have been vocal and have viewed with great alarm the gradual extinction of Britain as a big sea power. Many of the members of Baldwin's conservative government, now stripped of power, have openly charged that the cost in blood of this policy was being undertaken by the labor party's disarmament move, and have fought dire results.

NEW YORK, Jan. 15.—In a special column, Mr. Vincent Richards, who became a professional almost immediately after he discovered that being a professional was not nearly as satisfactory as being fed with popularity, offers to show the tennis association today where it can save a lot of time with its proposed open championship next September.

By using his methods, it can give the first four rounds altogether and start right in with the semi-finals. Mr. Richards, who seems to know all of the answers, isn't going so far as to pick the ultimate winner; only the ultimate loser.

The latter, says he, is an amateur who is sufficiently ill advised as to get in there with the unskilled professionals and he doesn't see the point. He says that he has seen the day they could compete with good professionals. Mr. Richards, even went as far as to offer to match Harvey Snodgrass, another amateur, with any ranking amateur, except Cochet.

"I'll be glad to take an exception in his case," said the young man. "Cochet is one of the four great tennis players in the world today. The other three are professionals and, as good as Henri is, he will be beaten by one of them. If he enters the open championship, Karl Kozuloh is an absolute marvel and his brother, Josef, is almost as good. The Burke brothers, Albert and Edmund, play tennis such as the average ranking amateur never sees. Ramon Nájich is equally good, so are Jesmon and Tuck. These Europeans will give tennis a real reputation for the first time in its history.

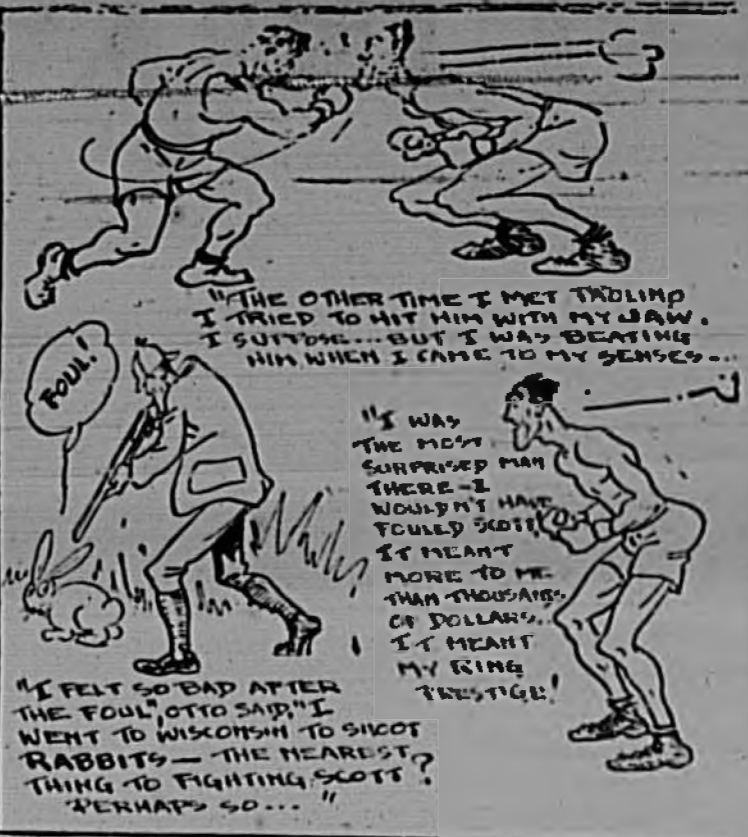

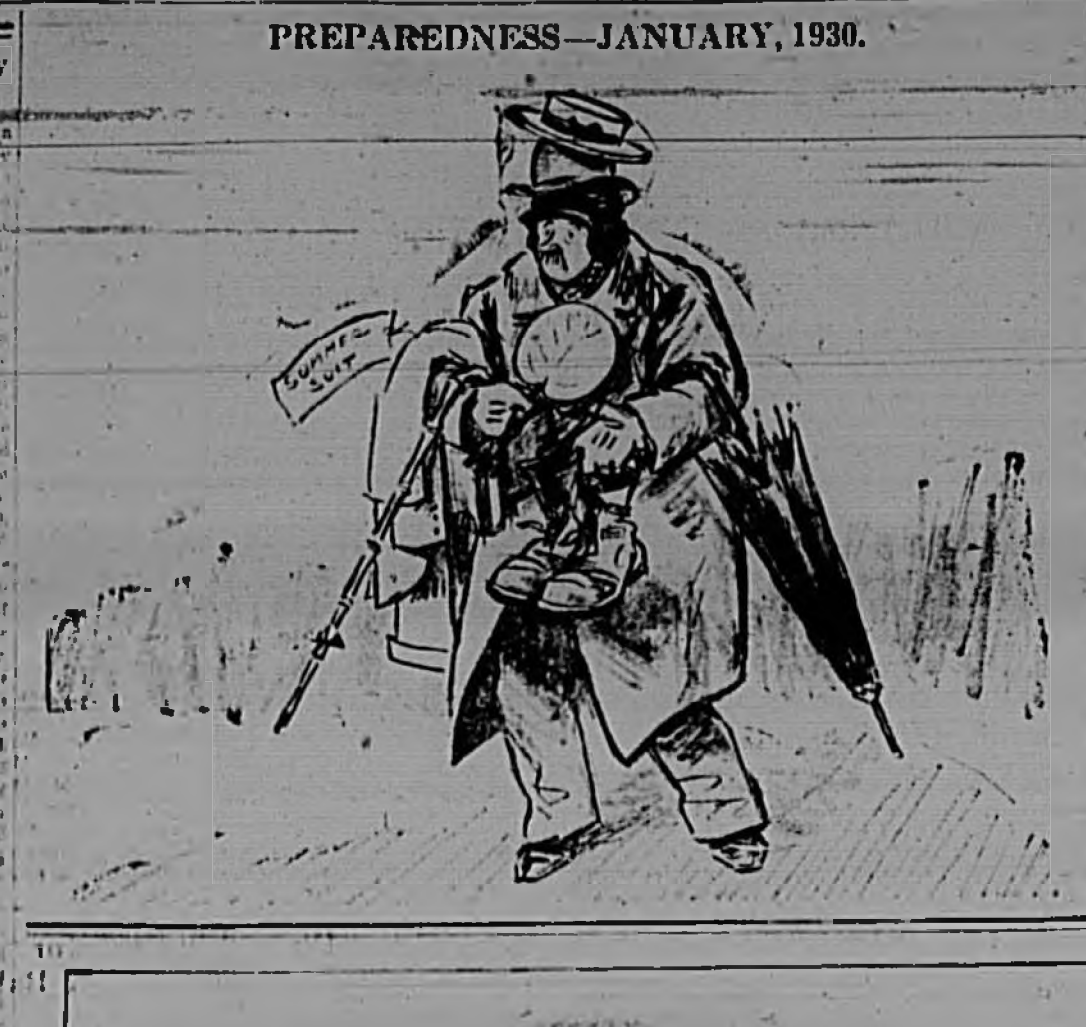
