Grinding Wreck Claims One Life

The first Seminole County Fourth of July holiday fatality occurred at 7 a.m. today when a landscaping service truck traveling on SR 419 toward Oviedo and approximately one and one-half miles from U.S. 17-92 went out of control, left the road and overturned.

Dead on arrival at Seminole Memorial Hospital was Larry Daniel Watson, 24, Route 1, Box 133-B on SR 46 West, the driver of the vehicle.

Listed in "fair" condition in the hospital's intensive care unit is Paul Millard Watson, the deceased's 16-year-old brother and only other occupant of the truck.

Sheriff John Polk reported the accident was being worked by Florida Highway Patrol troopers Robert Lovering and L. P. Tompkins and they listed the Town and Country Gardens Landscaping Service truck as being demolished in the mishap.

Both brothers were employed by the firm, located on Lake Howell Road, and reportedly had just left for work.

To The Editor:

In this time of National crisis as we prepare to celebrate our Independence Day, this July 4, 1970, I believe it is fitting that we not only use this day as one of leisure or one to have a picnic or one to just watch the fireworks, but as one when we stand up and tell the world where we stand and just how proud we are that we are Americans.

As Americans, let's briefly review our great heritage and our great accomplishments from our birthday to the present.

Just 350 years ago a handful of pilgrims sailed from Plymouth, England to cross the cold and harsh Atlantic Ocean in search of a new land where they could be free to live, work, and to worship as they chose. They reached our Continent and anchored in Cape Cod harbor, where they formed and signed The Mayflower Compact which was their instrument for self-government and discipline before landing and founding a colony at what is now Provincetown, Massachusetts.

By 1776, thirteen colonies had been found ed and a whole new society of stout-hearted men, women, and youth were busily building schools, churches, institutions of higher learning, building industries, developing their natural resources, and trading with European countries. And by this time they had compiled a long list of grievances against the King of England which ultimately resulted in "the shot heard around the world" and sparked The American Revolution against England. About the same time a number of courageous men authored and penned The Declaration of Independence which was adopted by all thir-
