Strasbourg Foie Gras Revered

By TOM HOGE PIGUANT PATE

In France, the true epicure judges his host by the quality of pate he serves. A classic like the fole gras of Strasbourg is approached by the gourmet fraternity with something akin to reverence, but an inferior creation is spurned as mere meat loss.

Actually, pate is the exalted meat—or fish or fowl—loaf of haute cuisine, even if purists shudder at the comparison.

Eaten with crisp French

Eaten with crisp French bread, a green salad and a light red or rose wine, a good pate maison can serve as a luncheon in itself. But generally it is looked upon as an appetizer, designed to awaken the taste buds and whet the appetite.

Every fine meal should lead off with hunger-provoking tidbits known as hors d'eouvres in France, antipasto in Italy and smorgasbord in Sweden, although none of these nations invented the custom.

It's believed that appetizers originated in China where they were known as di sum and were served with tea. The pleasant habit then spread to Russia where gourmets began serving an elaborate assortment of pates, caviar and fish pastries.

From Russia, the custom worked its way west to Greece and eventually to Scandinavia where smoked fish, pates and aspics became so popular that guests often had little appetite left for the main course.

Aspic, although commonly associated with the pate, is really a separate thing—a shimmering gem of jelly used for encasing or glazing meats, poultry or

Pate as a rule, consists of game, fowl, or ground lean pork and ground veal with pork fat to which pistachios, truffles and other such delicacies are added, along with a liberal dollop of cognac, port or madeira wine.

The average Frenchman feels a meal is incomplete unless it includes a slice of truffled goose pate. Lacking that, he will make do with pate of woodcock, duck, or one of a dozen other varie-

In rural France, a countrystyle terrine—term used for the
earthen baking dish in which a
pate may be cooked—is coarser
in texture and less rich than the
restaurant versions encased in
jelly or crust that are more familiar to the American palate.
These pates are usually redolent
with herbs gathered from the local countryside and spiked withfortified wine.

fortified wine. So famous has the pate de foie gras of Strasbourg become that many farmers in Alsace Lorraine have made a career of raising the force-fed geese, which oversize livers comprise the prime ingredient of the pate. Since the forced feeding of geese to obtain the desired fat livers is illegal in America, fore gras must be imported and the price has reached astronomical levels. As a result, gourmet kitchens have been seeking substitutes for the delicacy.

A substitute we put together costs little and combines the attributes of both pate and aspic.

MOCK FOIE GRAS
% pack plain gelatin
2 oz. brandy

1 can consomme
Garnishment of truffles, pimentoes, olives
1 small cake cream cheese
1 clove garlic


