



-A SIMPLE FRAME HOUSE FOR A FIFTY FOOT LOT-

This house follows no particular style of architecture, but is a simple straightforward house whose exterior is an outward expression of the plan require ments within. The house is designed to set comfortably on a lot with a fifty foot frontage and leave ample room for a drive on one side.

The entrance vestibule with adjoining coat closet is a convenience and it allows the usual entrance to be eliminated, giving the space over to the living room Three bed rooms and a bath complete the second floor and stairs lead up to a generous attic where room can be finished off if desired.

The exterior walls are sheathed and covered with siding. The roof is of slate in a number of shades, giving color and texture. The living porch is completely enclosed so that it becomes another room.

The foundation is concrete and a cellar extends under the entire house.

The simple plan arrangement of this house makes it economical to build and, at the same time, convenient and livable.






