

Long - Borrowed Books

"Stolen from the library of W— H— J—." This and similar inscriptions are sometimes found on bookplates of booklevers who know that friends borrowing books are not

to be trusted and may need a sharp reminder.

The practice goes back a long way, according to Lawrence S. Thompson, writing in the Bulletin of the New York Public Library. In ancient Assyria the library of King Ashurbanipal, who reigned in the seventh century B. C., contained this curse, inscribed on every important tablet:
"Whoseever shall carry off this tablet or shall inscribe

his name on it, may Ashur and Belit overthrow him in wrath and anger, and may they destroy his name and posterity in - Adams the land."

The Middle Ages were much proper to cursing makes thleves, sometimes even threatening them with excommunication. Also ordinary maledictions unfortunately too often failed to prevent stealing, special devices were sometimes used. Some German looks of the 17th century contained a warning that the volume had been owned by some one afflicted with the plague. If the would-be thief believed this warning, he might well hesitate to steal the volume.

With the growth of public libraries, theft from private owners has become less of a problem. Still enough remains, mostly by people who borrow books and then never think to return them, to justify the old warning seen on many book-plates, "neither a borrower nor a lender be."

Cold War Music

The memory of Beethoven, one of the greatest of the German composers, is still vivid enough in the minds of the German people to make him an important objective in the cold war between the East and West sectors of partitioned Berlin. On the anniversary of the death of the composer special musical program were presented in both sectors, with both sides making statements claiming his sympathy for their ideals. The Communists maintain that Beethoven was as revolutionary in his political beliefs as he was in his departures from many of the techniques of music approved in his day. He was revolutionary—he wanted individual freedom and dignity.

One thing seems certain. Beethoven would not have been able to produce the enduring works of music that he did under the handicaps that artists experience in Iron Curtain countries. In Russia today it is impossible for an artist to create outside the boundaries prescribed by Party taste and doctrine. Writers, painters, dramatists and musicians in Russia today are compelled to idealize the state and its

Despite all this it is well that the Communists in Ber-lin honor the memory of Beethoven. Perhaps while listening to the music created by a genius unfettered by Commissars of Culture they will realize the heritage they are betraying.

Alaska - Siberia Tunnel

The Alcan Highway would be nothing at all compared with a former Russian project unearthed by the Library of Congress. In 1908 Americans comprising the Trans-Alaska-Siberian Company suggested to Czar Nicholas II that they build a tunnel from Alaska under Bering Strait to Siberia, and continue the railway 3,000 miles further.



This exceeds the previous record season of 1866-47 when all these events drew 4,44,543 spectators who wagered \$194,710,333.

The total is expected to reach 220 million dollars by the season's end bett month of which the state will get more than 15 million in admission taxes, commission and breakage (odd cents), occupational licenses and registrations.

In the 1866-47 season the state received \$14,623,480,280, of which the counties divided \$8,800,500. The remainder goes to the Old Age Asistance, Education and General Punds, and to expesses of operating the State Racing Commission. This year the 67 counties will divide seven million equally.



Senate: Approves Tidelands Bill On Oil Laden Lands

Measure To Give

Coastat Lands To States, Not Nation WASHINGTON to—The Senate Wednesday approved the contraversial tidelands bill giving states, instead of the federal government, clear little to oil-rich lands in their coastal arous coastal areas.

The House has passed a somewhat similar hill, but the measure is still far from becoming law. First, differences between the Sen-ate and House hills must be iroued out Lawmakers do not believe this will be difficult.

The finally approved bill then goes to President Truman, who vetoed a similar measure in 1946 and may veto the new one.

Following the 50 to 35 Senate rollcall vote, senators expressed conflicting opinions whether the legislation could be passed by the required two thirds majority over e anticipated veto The Senate measure gives the states outright ownershipt o the lands beneath the marginal seas for a distance of three miles from their shores, except in the cases of Texas and Florida, where the distance is 1012 miles because of conditions under which they were admitted as states. The House bill not only gives the states little to the marginal belt, but provides also that the states should receive 37% per cent of all revenues from oil and gas developments in the continental shelf beyond the state seaward boundaries.

He struck this optimistic note of ceremonies in Constitution Hall commemorating the third anniversary of the signing of the pact by the original 12 nations. Greece and Turkey have since joined the North Atlantic Treaty Organization (NA-TO).

"If we continue the hard, sus-tained effort we have begun, we can clearly forease the time when our common military dismass will be strong enough to defend us against any attack," the President said.

Mr. Truman's talk followed one by Queen Julians of the Nether-lands, now paying a state visit here with her husband, Prince Berahard.
