



Change In Regulations Spurs Action

Rock Lake Schematic To Be Ready By July 15 Deadline

Herald Staff Writer

Architect Eoghan Kelley was at a Seminole County School Board work session last night to submit a schematic for the Rock Lake Middle School to the state Department of Education

That approval required no official board action, since Kelley had earlier received board okay to submit the design Discussion last night was centered on the July 15 deadline

for submitting the schematic in order for the Rock Lake School to qualify under existing construction guidelines, a move Kelley said could save the board some \$80,000 to \$100,000. Kelley told the board that legislation going into effect on

that date calls for changes in insulation regulations that would raise cooling costs considerably. "If we can get the schematic to Tallahassee by the 15th, then you're not taking any risk," Kelley told the board.

Kelley appeared before the board with a Kiplinger news letter population projection that called for an increase to more than 150,000 in Seminole County in 1980. The same projection set current population at 131,000.

After Kelley submits the schematic, his timetable calls for design development submission by the fall, with construction bids going out early in 1977 and completion scheduled for the fall term in 1978.

Kelley offered to draw up preliminary plans for a new design for the Rock Lake School and throw in a re-use of the

Tuscawilla School plan, with some minor modifications. "Now I'm offering you a deal," he said, being quick to assert that his concern over the July 15 submission date was solely because of a desire to save the board's money.

School Supt. William P. "Bud" Layer wasn't impressed by the Kiplinger growth figure. "I don't see us growing any at all next year," Layer said. Assistant Supt. Dan Dagg said that of the three other schools in the area of the new site, only Teague showed any

increase in enrollment this year and that was an addition of 20 students. South Seminole and Milwee showed no change in enrollment, Dagg said.

"We could handle up to 400 more students if they were spread out over the area" of the three schools, Dagg said. Alluding to the Kiplinger report and other county population

Bureaucrat May Be Listening

To Beethoven On Own Time

WASHINGTON (AP) - The bureaucrat who urged Congress to abolish his job because he hasn't had anything to do in four years besides listening to Beethoven records may soon get his way. The House voted Tuesday to abolish the Federal Metal

and Nonmetallic Mine Safety Board of Review and its \$19,683-a-year post of executive secretary. Jubal Hale, who's held that post since the board was established in 1971, says he's ready to look for another job and thinks Congress has no choice but to abolish the





Arms Limitations Nowhere In Sight

Events occurring in three parts of the world recently dramatized the hard realities that are overtaking the dream of ending the nuclear arms competition between the United States of America RAY CROMLEY

In Geneva, U.S. and Soviet negotiators sat down to still another round of Strategic Arms Limitation Talks to iron out "technical" problems in drafting a formal version of the agreement reached last No ember at the meeting of President Ford and Chairman Leonid Brezhnev in

Somewhere in Siberia, the Russians launched an SS18 missile capable of carrying multiple warheads - a missile much larger than any in the U.S. arsenal - on a test flight carrying it into the Central Pacific.

And in Washington, the U.S. Senate was meeting behind closed doors to hear an explanation of why the Defense Department wants to continue development and testing of an advanced nuclear warhead that would permit new options in our deterrent strategy.

What this adds up to is that our reach still exceeds our grasp in finding a safe basis to assume that there is a cut-off point in sight in what still must be considered a nuclear arms race between

The SALT negotiators at Geneva still are haggling over such basic issues as what kind of hissiles and bombers shall be considered strategic weapons under the agreement that would commit each side to a ceiling of 2,400 of those vehicles. They have not even solved the problem of how one side would know for sure that the other was equipping only 1,320 of its missiles with multiple warheads, as the agreement would provide.

Even if the numerical ceiling can be embodied in a SALT treaty, however, we face the fact that greater size of Soviet missiles combined with multiplewarhead technology could produce a dangerous imbalance in the strategic posture of the two sides during the 10 years that the ceiling would

The \$109.7 million item for advanced warhead research in the military procurement bill before the Senate has been attacked on grounds it would "destabilize" the current strategic balance. More accuracy and manuever-ability in warheads would make it possible to target them on Soviet luanching silos as an alternative to a "doomsday" exchange wiping out major cities. Thus, say the critics, we would be veering away from a deterrent strategy toward one with options for "warmaking."

The SS 18 test and others which have been monitored in recent years indicate that this alternative is exactly what the Russians are striving for as they use the SALT talks to try to place a lid on total numbers of missiles. The Senate did what it had to do in approving funds for our warhead program. Regardless of what may come out of the SALT talks, it is clear we are a long way from the finish line in developing and deploying weapons that cannot be countered by technological advancements which the Russians are pursuing as urgently as ever.

The vote of the British people to continue Britain's membership in the European Common Market is of more political significance, probably, than economic.

Despite the assumption outside of Europe - and, reportedly, among many of the voters - that the issue involved no more than the price of a loaf of bread, the market is a symbol of European unity. Its members enjoy the potential to be friends and partners in security and other matters of common interest,
