Angie Graham, right, manager of The Colonial Room restaurant on First Street in Sanford, figures there are about 240 people memorialized in special glass decorations hanging on a tree, right, and on the walls of the business. The glass decorations were inspired by Graham's mother, who makes her own version to commemorate members of the family. At The Colonial Room, the decorations contain photos of deceased customers. "We've been here 28 years," Graham said. "In 28 years, you get to know a lot of people." When the collection became too large for the one Christmas tree in the back of the restaurant, employees lined the walls. Some are even hanging near the person's former favorite spot in the restaurant. Ernie Mills, for example, is memorialized in the middle of the western wall of the main room. Mills was once the pharmacist neighbor to The Colonial Room. Some of the photos have been donated. Others came from church directories. "I wish I had thought of taking pictures of customers over the years," Graham said. Owner Bill Painter gave a photo of his parents, Ruth and L.C. Painter, above. Painter said they will hang as many decorations as people bring in photos of former patrons. Graham said she has gotten pretty good at producing the decorations. "I can make one in less than a minute," she said.



Deputies: Local man portrays officer to scam food

SANFORD — Deputies arrested a Sanford man who investigators said impersonated a police officer to get refunds on restaurant food he claimed had hair in it.

The Seminole County Sheriff's Office had asking fast food and take-out food establishments to look out for George Jolicoeur, 33, of Sanford. Jolicoeur weighs about 500 pounds, and deputies said he claimed to be a law enforcement officer or firefighter in an ongoing scheme to defraud.

As of Tuesday afternoon, Jolicoeur was being held in the John E. Polk Correctional Facility under \$5,000 bond. Two additional charges for fraud each carries a \$1,000 bond, according to a Sheriff's Office spokesman.

In one case Nov. 23, Jolicoeur claimed he was a police officer and requested a refund for \$31 worth of milkshakes at the Steak and Shake on Red Bug Lake Road. He claimed the shakes had hair in them.

The manager of Steak and Shake said a heavy-set man was leaving the restaurant in a white car. A deputy nearby saw the car and stopped it. Jolicoeur was driving and told the deputy he had been to Steak and Shake.

He denied having identified himself as a police officer. Another deputy drove the restaurant manager and cook over to identify Jolicoeur.

The manager said a phone call had come in from someone who said he was a police officer and that he had ordered some snakes

RiverWalk fishing ordinance fails

SANFORD — A proposed ordinance restricting fishing in the marina area of the RiverWalk failed to pass Monday night when the mayor, vice mayor and newly elected District 4 commissioner voted against it.

The ordinance stemmed from a complaint back in October from local resi-

dent Robert Johnson, who said his children were threatened with arrest for fishing in between the breaker walls on the RiverWalk in front of the marina.

"When I put my tax dollars in to have the RiverWalk redone, no one told me they're [the children] not going to be able to enjoy the same privileges I had when I was growing up. I've always been able to fish down there," Johnson said.

Three commissioners agreed Monday night, after an ordinance proposed to restrict fishing almost completely in front of the marina.

The "no fishing" signs were put in place when the RiverWalk was near completion by former city manager Al Grieshaber Jr., after the city received complaints from boat owners about fishing line hitting their boats and getting tangled in engines, and plastic get-

ting sucked up in boat engines from fishermen.

New city manager Sherman Yehl said at the last commission meeting that either way, there is no ordinance attached to the "no fishing" signs, and he ordered city staff to come up with an ordinance.

A group of boat owners, who started

Longtime lifestyle editor passes away in Alabama

Doris Dietrich, long-time society editor for *The Sanford Herald*, died Tuesday, Dec. 6, 2005, at her home in Prattville, Ala. She was 81.

"Miss Doris," as she was known, had a nose for news and an eye for detail when it came to covering Sanford's society scene. For nearly four decades Dietrich kept *Herald* readers informed about the latest cocktail party, charitable function or impending nuptials.

"Everybody but everybody read Doris' column," said former Mayor Bettye Smith. "People wanted to know who was wearing what, and who showed with whom. That's why people read *The Herald*."

No detail was too small for

Dietrich's column.

"She would describe every last detail of the wedding gown, as well as which lady was in charge of the guest registry or punch bowl," Smith said.

Before being elected mayor in the early 1980s, Smith was involved in numerous community activities where she came to know Miss Doris. The two ladies also shared a passion for footwear.

"We both had a taste for shoes and we bought a lot of them," Smith recalled.

Manny believes in Chophouse

LONGWOOD — Brea Tato, the Longwood mother and wife, who graced *The Herald* pages when she won a contest to interview Tom Cruise on the Red Carpet this past summer, is keeping busy with the opening of her husband's first full service restaurant, Manny's Chophouse.

Manny Tato owns a Miami Subs franchise and a Cuban fast food restaurant in Lake Mary called Coconuts. He always wanted to open a full service restaurant, but only if it was "in the right location".

That location presented itself three months ago when the Tatos noticed a failed restaurant for sale on Markham Woods Road and S.R. 434 in Longwood.

The Tatos live down the street and watched a few restaurants fail at that loca-

tion. They said it saddened them to see restaurants fail because they knew how much heart had been put into it.

"Manny saw the potential for what it could be," Brea said. "We knew it was going to be ours."

The restaurant used to be a sports bar for almost three years, and was then a fine dining restaurant for about five months. Brea said the walls were plain and white, and

SCC trustee earns state recognition

SANFORD — Sidney Miller, a Seminole Community College District Board of Trustees member, has been named the 2005 Florida Association of Community Colleges Trustee of the Year.

Chosen from one of Florida's 28 community colleges, the annual award recognizes a trustee whose exemplary contributions help meet the needs of that trustee's college and community in extraordinary ways.

Miller was appointed to SCC's District Board of Trustees by Gov. Jeb Bush in May 1999 and reappointed in June 2002. Her taste in fashion didn't stop at her feet, however. Dietrich often "dressed to the nines," Smith said, and always made sure her outfits matched. She also kept up with the latest fashions.

"I remember when hot pants came out," said Carol Dennison, president of the Sanford Woman's Club. "Doris loved those hot pants."

Like her fashions, Dietrich was serious when she needed to be but preferred to let her "feisty" personality come out.

"We talked about what to wear to mother's service (Dec. 17 in Prattville), and finally decided we should wear hot pink," said Mary Hillman, Dietrich's daughter. "She would have had a fit if we showed up in black."

Wayne Doyle, former publisher of *The Sanford Herald*, said Dietrich was an asset to the newspaper and always confident in her abilities.

"When I became publisher in the 1970s, we had a staff meeting and I remember she told me, 'Don't worry Wayne, we'll teach you everything,'" Doyle recalled.

"She had a very calming way," he said. "Whenever there was a controversy, she had the ability of being a peace maker. She was an outstanding employee of *The Herald* and referred to her co-workers as one of the 'Sanford Herald Angels.' She was always well-dressed and had a serious yet comical approach to almost everything."

Frank Voltoline a long-time

co-worker at *The Herald* commented: "She was really out there. It was common knowledge that if you wanted anything done, call on Doris. She had a friendly smile for everybody."

Voltoline said he didn't remember when Doris started working with *The Herald*, "but it was about the time when the paper's office moved from First Street to the present location on North French Avenue in July 1966."

Current *Herald* publisher Dan Ping said Dietrich helped convince him to move to Sanford.

"I was offered the editor's job after the interview and Miss Doris asked me if I was going to take it," Ping said. "I told her I was going to think about it and her response was: 'What's there to think about? Sanford's the greatest place in the world. Just pack your bags and move to town.' How are you going to say 'no' to Miss Doris?"

"She was one of the people who made me feel right at home," Ping added. "Miss Doris had to bust my chops a couple of times — set me straight, as she would say — but I can't thank her enough for her help and hospitality those first few months."

Dietrich was a member of First United Methodist Church of Sanford and the Sanford Woman's Club.

"She was a great lady and worked very, very hard in our Woman's Club," Dennison said. "She was the publicity chairwoman for as long as I

can remember. Doris was a very viable member of the club."

Dietrich was formerly a member of the Board of Directors of Ballet Guild of Sanford/Seminole and the Seminole County Mutual Concert Association. She was a recipient of the Outstanding Community Service Award by the Sanford Kiwanis Club and many other outstanding awards including Woman of the Year.

Born on May 12, 1924, in Montgomery, Ala., Dietrich moved to Sanford in 1958. Dietrich had been in failing health for some time but did have the joy of learning of the birth of her great-grandson, her daughter said. Logan Michael Hartson was born on Monday, Dec. 5, 2005. Dietrich died the next day.

"It was as if mother was holding on long enough to see that that baby was born," Hillman said. "I guess it was her way of leaving on her own terms."

Survivors include her husband, Carl, of Prattville; daughter, Mary Hillman of Prattville; granddaughter, Laurie Hartson of Burlington, N.J.; and great grandson, Logan Michael Hartson of Burlington. She is also survived by two step-grandsons Andrew Hillman of Tiktrit, Iraq, and Bradley Hillman of St. Mary's, Ga.

A memorial service will be held Saturday, Dec. 17, at 10 a.m. at Ridout's Prattville Chapel in Alabama.

a petition last month to restrict fishing from the shore in front of the marina, were present at the meeting. They said that the newly proposed ordinance, which restricted fishing on the RiverWalk from Memorial Island to Sanford Avenue, was not good enough. They wanted the restriction all the way to the east seawall.

A resident not in favor of the fishing restrictions said: "I object. [The] no fishing signs should be remove — period."

Commissioners discussed whether or not the ordinance provided no fishing restrictions from boats inside the marina. The ordinance did not stipulate, and commissioners said that citizens could not have it both ways.

"If it's a no fishing zone; it's a no fishing zone," Mayor Linda Kuhn said.

Because the fishing restrictions went to the east side of Memorial Park, District 2 Commissioner Velma Williams voiced concern over residents not being able to fish from the park.

"I hope [we] wouldn't be limiting people from fishing on the east, or west side, of Memorial Park," Williams said.

District 1 Commissioner Art Woodruff moved to approve the proposed ordinance and tried to encompass a few feet more of sidewalk into the ordinance, bringing it just a hair past Sanford Avenue, to appease

the boat owners.

Williams said that as she sat and reflected on the last four or five years, she never thought she'd witness a decision being made by commissioners to restrict fishing.

According to Williams, she has had several people tell her "I told you so", because back when the hotel and conference room was going in, a lot of citizens from the minority community did not support it because they felt eventually they'd be denied the opportunity to fish.

"I tried to convince them that would not be the case," Williams said. "So for me, it's a very sad day in the city of Sanford."

Kuhn said the RiverWalk was historically used for fishing and she wanted to make sure people still had the ability to fish.

"I don't want to see any part of our population disenfranchised," Kuhn said. "I'm going to vote against it."

Woodruff said that he agreed that fishing should not be banned downtown, but he had to weigh all sides of the issue.

"I think this is a reasonable compromise," Woodruff said.

District 3 Commissioner Randy Jones said that the city wasn't blocking off the RiverWalk, only a portion of it.

He said they had already made the right move by not

allowing buildings to come directly up to Lake Monroe, and instead created public access all the way around it.

"It's not singling anybody out, it's an across the board issue," Jones said.

Newly elected District 4 Commissioner Jack Bridges said some decisions were "extremely tough to make". He discussed how his family has been in Sanford more than 50 years.

"I think I caught my first fish on the breaker wall," Bridges said.

Bridges stated that the city has the duty to balance the needs of the boat owners, who he said pay good money to rent slips, and the public, who have had fishing rights on Lake Monroe before the breaker walls were even put in.

He blamed fishing line tangles and plastic getting caught in engines on "bad fishermen who do not respect the environment", but he said he didn't know of fishermen purposely trying to get their line stuck with boats in the marina.

"It's not going to be the end of the world, but it's a precursor of things to come," Bridges said of the ordinance passing. "But, here today, I can't support the ordinance."

The motion failed with the only support coming from Woodruff and Jones.

The City Commission meets on the second and fourth Monday of each month at 7 p.m. at City Hall.

there was green, white and red tile, with no rhyme or reason.

"Nobody believed it could be done," Brea said.

The inside of the restaurant now boasts dark brown wood tables, columns and seats, with orange lighting, and rock columns, with wine racks surrounding the restaurant. The inside is comfortable, but romantic. It also has a lounge on one side of the restaurant with televisions, and an outside seating area.

The general manager of the restaurant, Justin Shoener, was the first employee at a vending company Manny owned. Shoener then went to full service eventually, and when he found out Manny was opening a restaurant the couple said it was a "no-brainer".

Enough is Enough - Stop eating when you're not hungry, not when you can't eat anymore.

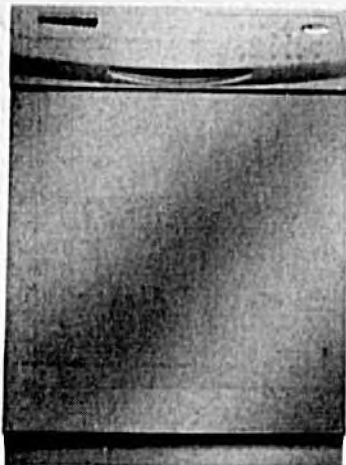
Out of Sight Out of Mind - If you're not hungry, position yourself away from the food; if you are near food, you might eat unconsciously and not even remember eating.

earlier in the day and that when he got back to the station, he found hairs in the top of the shakes. The caller said

he had spoken to the general manager who had approved the refund.

The manager, Jon Curry, said he talked with the general manager who had not spoken to anyone about a refund. When the man came in for the refund, he called Curry by his first name, so he thinks it was the same person who called. That's when Curry notified police.

Another case happened the day before at a Taco Bell on Tuskawilla Road.

This time, the heavy-set man said he was Lt. Stevens with Sheriff's Office Station 21 and was due a refund for five taco combo meals because they also had hair in them.

The subject never pro-

duced any food to return. Management refused the requests. The person had called before saying the refund was approved by a general manager, but left when the restaurant called the general manager to verify.

The Taco Bell drive-through clerk identified Jolicoeur immediately from a photo line up on Nov. 25, deputies said. The on-duty manager at the time said the same man had tried to get a refund from the restaurant two other times in the last week.

There are some other similar cases, deputies said.

According to the deputy investigating the case, a large-built male matching

Jolicoeur's description made such a scene in another area restaurant that the on-duty manager gave him more than \$36 as a refund, essentially to make him go away.

Deputies said the restaurant reportedly later made the employee pay the money out of the employee's own pocket.

The Sheriff's Office is trying to get a firm identity on the subject in that case.

The Seminole County Sheriff's Office obtained a warrant for Jolicoeur's arrest, and alerted food establishments to be on the lookout.

Jolicoeur was arrested in September 2005 on an unrelated charge, deputies reported.

A Seminole slam dunk

It was a sweep for Seminole. If the early season is any indication this could be a good year for Seminole County boys' basketball, especially in the bigger schools.

While it wasn't a tournament, Saturday's "Hoops with a Heart" Classic at Oviedo High School marked the third time already this season that Seminole County teams have been the class of an event, following championships in the Rotary Tip-Off Classic and Greyhound Invitational by Lake Howell and Lyman, respectively.

The event, which raised money for a scholarship fund for the children of Rob Graham, the Bishop Moore coach who is making a recovery from a stroke and heart attack suffered during a game last spring, featured eight highly respected teams given more than a good chance at making a run at a state title.

But it ended up being a showcase for Seminole County talent.

After Class 1A power Pine Castle Christian (6-1) eased past Oak Ridge (1-4), 58-47, Seminole county took over.

Emerging national power Lake Howell got things started with a 67-51 whipping of Vero Beach, which had lost to Lyman in the Greyhound final.

Chandler Parsons led the way with 21 points and 10 rebounds as the Silver Hawks remained unbeaten at 8-0.

Then it was the hosts' turn and the Lions did not disappoint the fans as Justin Barrett had 15 points and Matt Stillwell and DeAndre Williams 14 points each as Oviedo improved to 6-2 with a 71-43 rout of West Orange.

The evening ended with Winter Springs (3-4), which continues to get better and better under new coach Travis Jones, easing past Bishop Moore, 82-62, spoiling the day somewhat for Graham, who made his first appearance at a basketball game since the stroke.

Kevin Verdino and Alex Keeler led the Bears with 13 points each, while Danny Krazit, the son of former SCC player David Krazit and a teammate of most of the Lake

Howell team in AAU, led the Hornets with 12 points and eight assists.

Lake Howell did not rest on its laurels on Monday as the Silver Hawks made their final tune-up before the holiday's a good one, smoking Lake Mary (3-5), 98-64.

Lake Howell's big three of juniors Chandler Parsons (21 points), Joey Rodriguez and Nick Calathes (18 points and 10 assists each) led the way as the Silver Hawks ran their record to 9-0. Josh Ingram was tops for the Rams with 19 points.

Now with the preliminaries out of the way, Lake Howell and Oviedo will be heading to nationally-recognized tournaments to try to uphold the county's honor.

The Silver Hawks are headed this week to the 33rd Annual Bank of America City of Palms Classic, arguably the nation's No. 1 Boy's High School Basketball Tournament, at Bishop Verot High School in Fort Myers.

And how good is the field?

Lake Howell is only seeded No. 6 behind St. Patrick's of Elizabeth, New Jersey, ranked No. 4 in the country, Dominguez from Compton, California, Merion Station Episcopal Academy from Pennsylvania, Lincoln from Brooklyn, New York and Brentwood Academy from Nashville, Tennessee.

The Silver Hawks will not open play until Saturday (12/16) when they take on host Bishop Verot at 8:15 p.m.

The tournament is a little disappointed as with only one court being used, there can be big gap between games.

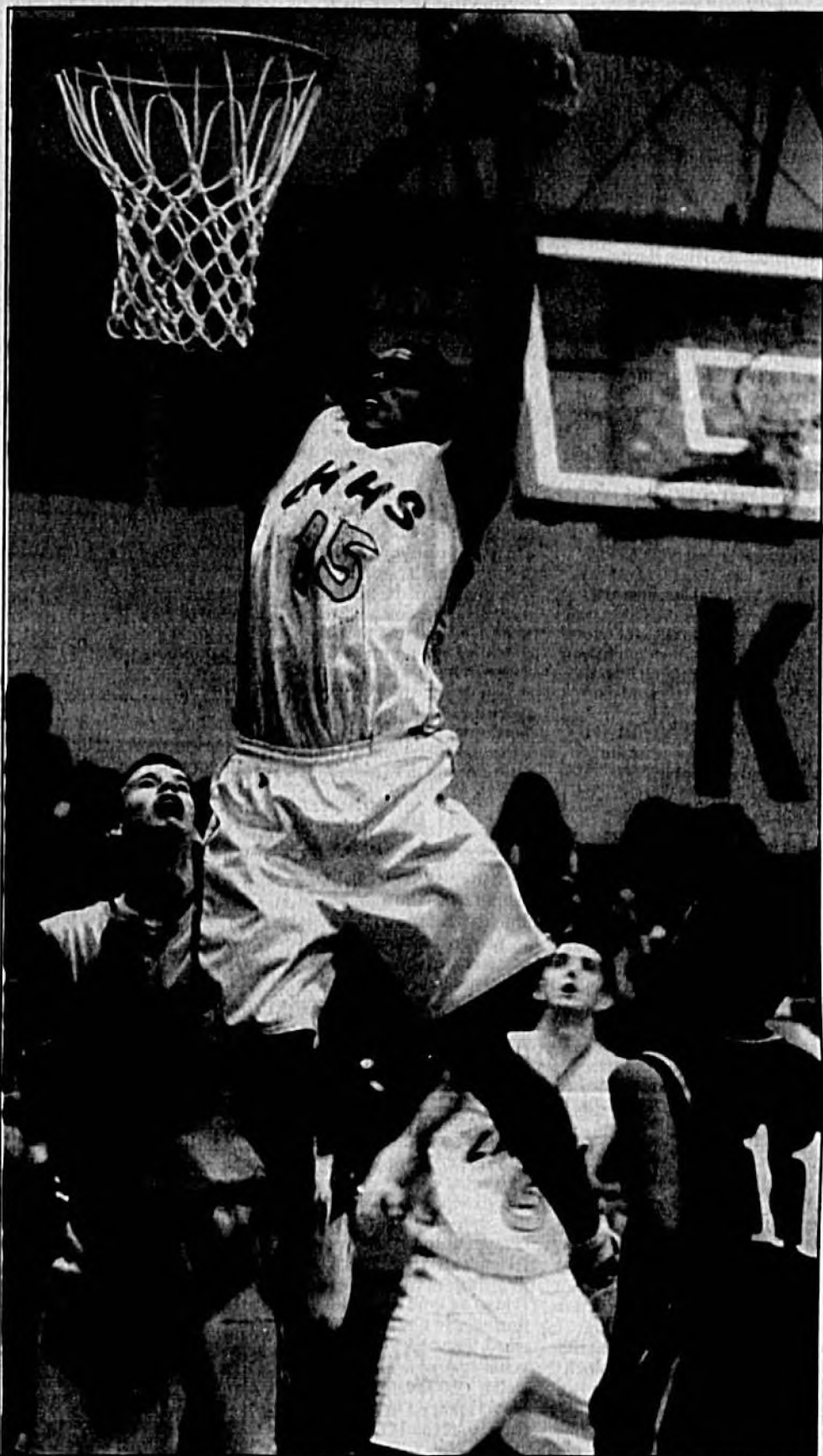

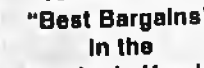

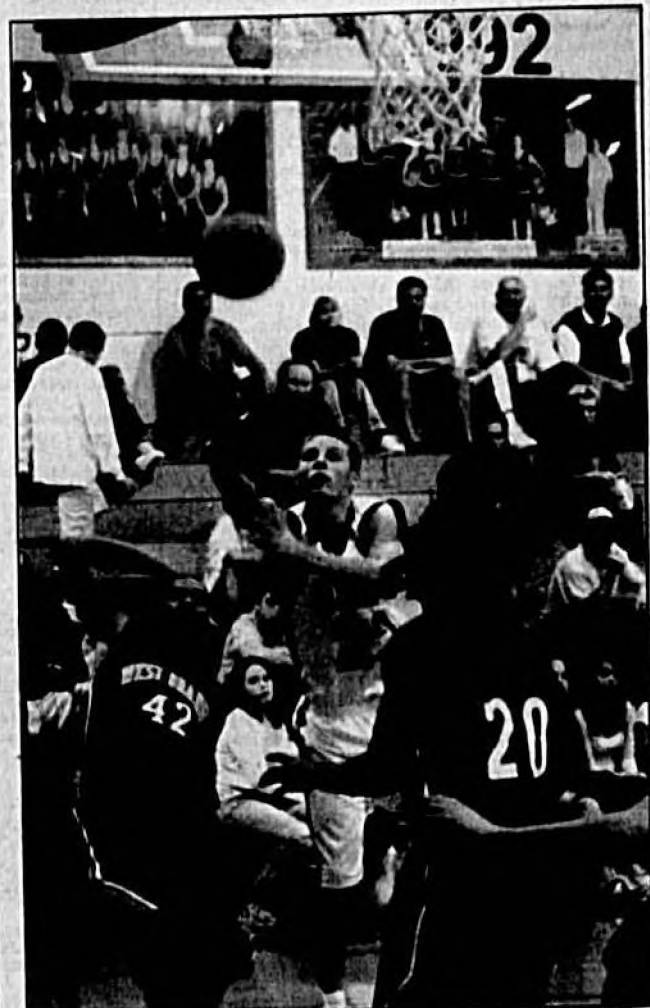
