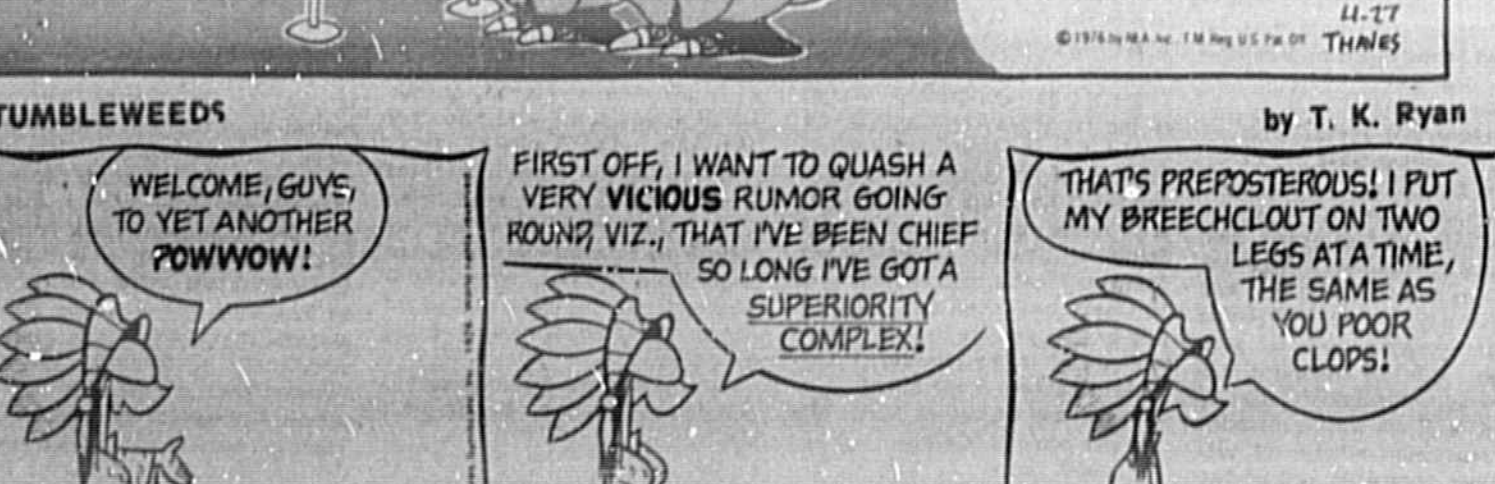

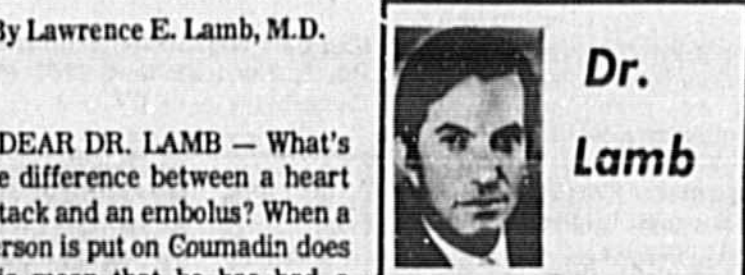

DEAR DR. LAMB—What's the difference between a heart attack and an embolus? When a person is put on Coumadin...



clots of that type do form in the veins in the legs. Your son's doctors are perfectly correct in saying that they can examine the legs and not be able to detect the presence of a clot within one of the deep veins. The clot that breaks loose from any location follows that blood stream just like a log going down a river. It rides with the blood stream through the right side of the heart, the blood comes out of the heart and goes to the lungs. The clot lodge in the lungs and never get back to the heart.

My son has a job and travels in his own car or in airplanes. He has been instructed to exercise every 45 minutes. I presume to get the circulation going in his legs. He was told that he only needed to take Coumadin for three months and that period is almost up. Yet a friend of his has been on Coumadin for the past 10 years; is that possible?

I lost my dear wife from a heart attack even though she had been taking the same medicine for blood thinning. The doctors restricted my wife's activity very severely, yet the doctors encourage my son to do things such as going out to drive golf balls. Any light you can shed on this would certainly be appreciated.

**Altamonte Policeman Shot, But Saved By Vest**

Altamonte Springs Police Patrolman Lewis Branding escaped serious injury early today, thanks to a gift from his parents. A protective vest given Branding, 24, by his parents when he graduated last August from Rollins College stopped two bullets fired at an unidentified gunman at 2-48 a.m. at an industrial building at Newberryport Ave. and

his service revolver. Branding, who was later treated and released from Florida Hospital North, Altamonte Springs, then radioed for assistance and Cpl. Norman Floyd Jr. reached the scene 30 seconds later, Garver said.

The gunman fled into a nearby wooded area and at least 40 officers from Altamonte and other law enforcement agencies responded to cordon off a 10 to 12 block area that included parts of an adjacent residential area. Investigators said they found no blood at the shooting scene and no indication that the gunman was wounded by the downed officer's gunfire.

During a three-hour manhunt, using police dogs, the officers failed to turn up a suspect but did find a pistol, described as a .22 caliber "Saturday Night Special" in the wooded area. Investigators said ballistic tests will be made to determine if the bullets imbedded in Branding's protective vest, made of a nylon-like material, were fired from the pistol.

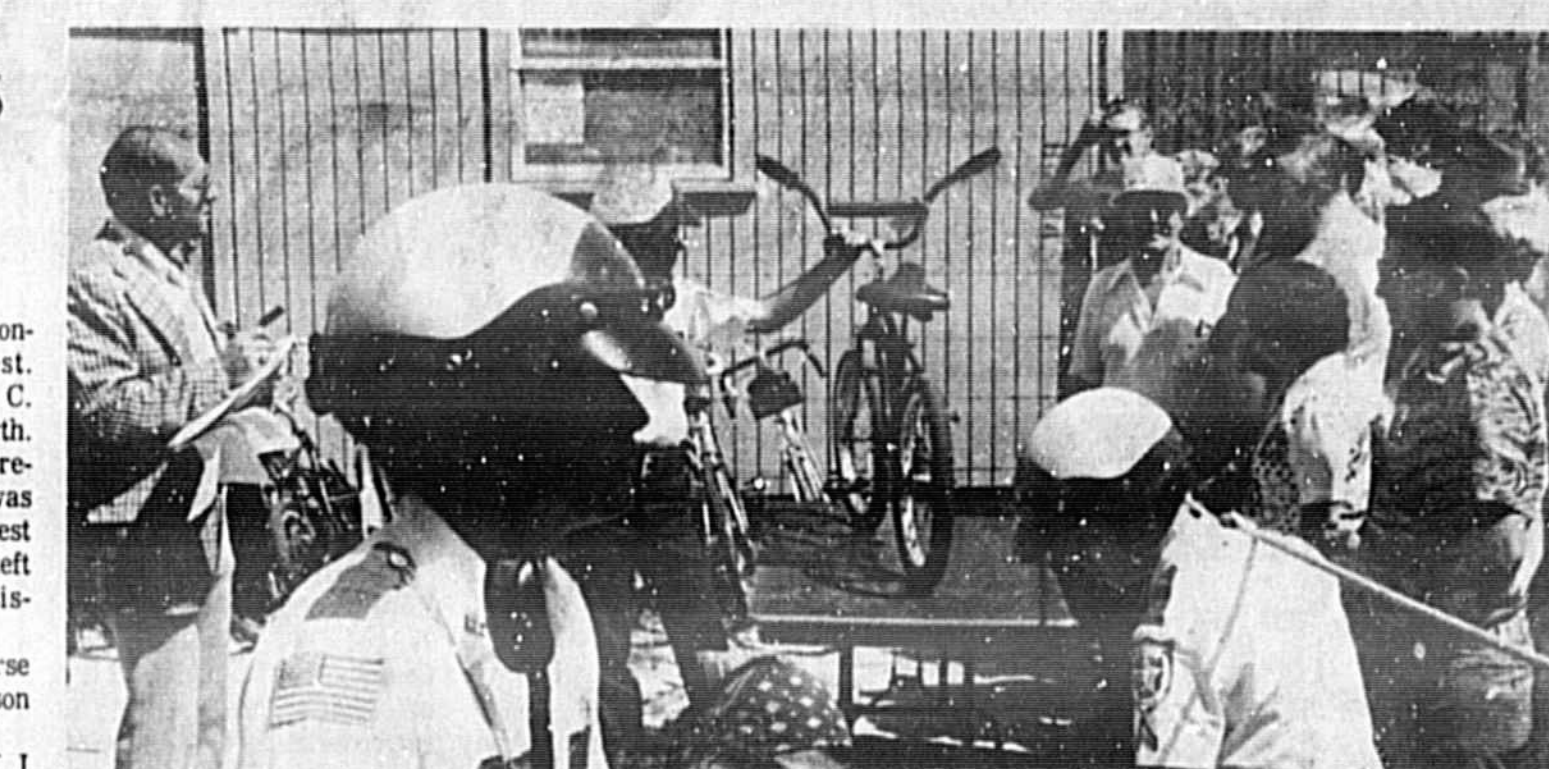
**Carter Ahead Both Ways In Pennsylvania Primary**

PHILADELPHIA (AP)—Jimmy Carter has combined his big victory in Pennsylvania's Democratic presidential preference primary with an unexpected lead in the crucial battle for the state's national convention delegates.

The former Georgia governor, boasting that "we're now No. 1," had won or was leading for 61 of the state's 178 delegates as the vote count continued today. Some results were not expected until Friday.

President Ford, unopposed in Pennsylvania and apparently assured of all 103 Republican delegates, was in Texas preparing for the important May 1 primary there.

Correctly predicting that the party bosses and labor leaders "were going to win, win on the first ballot," Carter said, claiming his Pennsylvania triumph had pushed his delegate total over 400 and that he would have more than 1,000 by the time of the last primary June 8.

Big Magic Is Brewing

Surfing Combines Many Skills And Thrills

HONOLULU (AP) — When the Big Kahuna speaks everyone listens. The Big Kahuna is a mythical Hawaiian wizard who watches over surfing.

Right now, according to George Downing, the Big Kahuna is brewing big magic for surfing. Downing should know because he is a Big Kahuna in his own right.

Called the world's greatest surfer, he turned surfing into a celebrity sport by teaching the Duke of Windsor, Douglas Fairbanks and scores of other notables how to ride the waves at Waikiki.

Duke Kahanamoku set the record for the world's longest surfing ride, a mile and a quarter across Waikiki Bay, ending up on a ripple against the sands of the Royal Hawaiian Hotel beach.

A man who respects tradition is George Downing. And a man who is intent on making surfing as popular a sport as baseball and football. Ever since he gave

The sport has changed greatly from what it was in the Duke's time, Downing notes. In the early days of the sport, the main point of surfing was the long ride. Surfers used heavy redwood boards 17 feet long to ride a wave from its peak all the way to shore.

Downing, 44, survived this period with a worldwide reputation for daring and skill. Many of his contemporaries, however, did not. They fell victim to crashing waves 25 feet high or a forest of pilings in the path of their waves.

Downing was one of the first to realize the damage done to the sport and sought to transform the wild ride into the skilled "ride," where performance was judged on a surfer's ability to maneuver his

Professionals surfing in competition under Downing's skill system earn their highest points for performing maneuvers in large waves and close to the point where the curl of the wave collapses. Here, the slightest mistake in performance can lead to a wipeout under tons of raging water.

Downing has also announced an award to any surfer in professional competition who can ride his board in a 300 degree loop down, up and around the face of a wave. The surfer who can perform this skillful maneuver will get a cash prize

of \$1,000 donated by Japan's Sake industry association, according to Downing. "We're trying to make surfing more interesting for both the participant and the spectator," Downing says, "and to make it into something everyone can do. For anyone who can swim, it's a lot safer than skiing and a lot more fun."

Tribesman In Borneo Says His Age Is 138

BANDAR SERI BEGAWAN, Brunei (AP) — An Iban tribesman living in southern Brunei on Borneo Island claims he is 138 years old. His recipe for longevity is a staple diet of rice, homebrewed liquor, plenty of cigarettes and a bath only once a week.

The Iban, who believes he was born in 1838, is known only as Yungkom. If he ever had any other names he has either lost interest in them or forgotten them. He said he had always retained faith in his own gods and that they had always answered his prayers.

A recent expedition by the Brunei Nature Society down the Ulu Belait River found him living a still healthy and happy life. Wearing only a loose leincloth and bush hat, he still chops firewood every day to earn his board and lodging.

Yungkom said he was born near Kuching, capital of the neighboring Malaysian state of Sarawak, 138 years ago. His wizened shrunken frame tends to back up the claim. Always a "heavy" smoker, he believes that a good spirit — or lingo in Malay — has helped him to survive so long.

He said he was so busy he never had time to get married and settle down. Only when he reached his "retiring age" of 88 did he move in with a rice growing family, in a house in undulating country near the Ulu Belait River. In return for food and shelter Yungkom descends the log ladder of the house every day to cut wood with his parang.

Yungkom remembers he was a "young man" of 45 when the island of Krakatoa, off Java, blew up in the mightiest volcanic explosion ever recorded. He recalls flooding and havoc from the tidal wave that hit Borneo and was felt not only in Southeast Asia but much of the world.

His back is now permanently bent and his flesh wrinkled and shrunken but his eyes are bright and alert. As he spoke to Azizah Williams, Secretary of the Brunei Nature Society who acted as interpreter, his memory sometimes played tricks on him. But at the age of 138 nobody would blame him for that.

Lloyd's Of London Unhurt By Large Claim Payoffs

Three other British companies, doing business in the more prosaic auto, household and life insurance fields in the United States, however, reported big losses last year. Insurance companies are notoriously close-mouthed on the size of losses that hit them, as well as the amount of premiums paid on policies.

Reliable estimates, though, put Lloyd's losses on the three maritime disasters at over \$40 million. Lloyd's share of the crash near Paris two years ago are still pending and the final bill could come to more than \$200 million.

But when seen in the context of Lloyd's assets, the losses don't amount to much. The huge group, the spokesman said, has 8,500 members organized in 150 underwriting syndicates. Each member must place at the disposal of Lloyd's a minimum of 75,000 pounds (\$150,000) before being elected to membership.

That means total funds available for payment of losses are around \$10 billion — enough to cover a lot of disasters. Maritime disasters create other problems than mere money loss. In addition to the loss of life, some wrecks have given rise to huge pollution problems.

This aspect was highlighted nine years ago when the American-owned Torrey Canyon ran onto Seven Stones Rocks in the Isles of Scilly, eventually spilling its entire cargo of 120,000 tons of crude oil into the Atlantic Ocean at the approaches of the English Channel. Beaches of southwest Britain were fouled throughout the summer despite government spending of more than a million pounds (\$2 million) in Operation Cleanup.

Since the Torrey Canyon, four super-tankers, including the oil-bulk carrier Berge Iskra, 227,556 tons, have blown up — three of them within a two-week period at the end of 1969. All of them were empty and in ballast at the time except the Berge Iskra, which was laden with Brazilian iron ore bound for Japan.

No pollution problems arose from the four tankers. Nor was any caused by the Olympic Bravery, 270,000 tons, newest and greatest of the Onassis fleet. Built at St. Nazaire, France, she was on her way in the early hours of Jan. 24 to go into mothballs in a Norwegian fjord

pending better times for the tanker business when she ran onto the jagged rocks of Ushant, just off Brest, less than 200 yards from land. The Atlantic Ocean and the rocks began tearing her to pieces, while human marauders from shore stripped her fittings, including 20 cases of Scotch whisky in the owner's apartments.

The end finally came for Olympic Bravery March 13. With gales gusting to 90 miles per hour, the ship broke up to become what a Lloyd's spokesman called "the most expensive insurance write-off in history."

The tanker broke in half just behind the wheelhouse superstructure. The stern floated free and sank. The forward section remained impaled on the rocks. The Lloyd's man said: "We do seem to have been hit worse than usual recently, but it would take a string of big payoffs really to hurt."

Mushrooms Add A Touch Of Splendor To Meals

Helen Lafferty, Longwood, likes to try out new recipes, even though she often "tastes and adds," to make them come out better.

"I have lots of cook books, and cut out plenty of recipes in magazines and newspapers," she said. One of her favorite books contains a collection of recipes from Rolling Hills Moravian Church members.

Helen and her husband, Denney, recently celebrated their 50th wedding anniversary. She has not tired of cooking in that time, and especially enjoys cooking with mushrooms.

"I came from Pennsylvania, which is mushroom country," she explained. "We have had company all winter. The chicken tetrazzini recipe is great for guests, because with a salad and dessert, you have an entire meal. Also, we all like the

corn souffle." Helen loves to do fancy work, and has many beautiful pillows to prove it. She enjoys gardening and "just general cooking." Some of her recipes are printed here for readers to try.

CHICKEN TETRAZZINI 1/2 lb. spaghetti 1 cup sliced mushrooms 2 tbsp. butter 2 cups sauce 3 cups cooked chicken cut not too small two-thirds cups grated Italian type cheese Break spaghetti in 1/2 inch pieces, cook and drain. Sauté mushrooms in the butter. Put the spaghetti in shallow baking dish. Pour over half the sauce. Put in chicken over the sauce and then mushrooms. Pour over rest of sauce. Sprinkle all over with grated cheese and bake at 350 degrees until cheese is brown.

Sauce: 2 tbsp. butter 4 tbsp. flour 2 cups chicken broth Few grains of nutmeg Salt to taste one-third cup cream

Melt butter, add flour and seasonings. Stir until well blended. Add chicken broth, slowly stirring constantly, cook until thick, then add cream and 1 tbsp. Sherry.

MORAVIAN SUGAR CAKE 1 cup cooked mashed potatoes 1 cup lukewarm water with 1 pkg. yeast dissolved in it 1 cup sugar (1/2 cup white and 1/2 cup light brown) 2 eggs beaten well 1 cup butter (melted) 2 level tsp. salt Stir all above ingredients together and add enough flour to make a soft dough. Let it rise until double in size. Take enough dough to spread on pie for about 5 minutes. Drain and cool, then slice. Add celery chopped, chopped olives and onions. Gradually stir in milk and egg yolks, blend well. Cook stirring constantly until mixture thickens. Remove from heat and add vanilla and let cool. Put a thick layer of peanut butter in bottom only of the cold baked pie shell and then add the

padding and top with meringue. Meringue: 2 egg whites 1/4 tsp. cream of tartar 1/4 tsp. vanilla 1/4 cup granulated sugar 1/4 tsp. vanilla Beat egg whites with cream of tartar until soft peaks form. # The Art Of Kitchen Budgeting: Scandinavian Cooking

Until recently, there was little similarity in diet between the mountain valleys, fishing villages, and farms in Norway. Long distances and lack of transportation isolated these living areas.

Add to that the extremely short summers and the lack of refrigeration and you can see why the Norwegians have developed domestic skills in the smoking and salting of meats and fish, the preserving and pickling of other foods, and the baking of breads, cakes and cookies that will keep for long periods of time.

Smoked fish such as herring and salmon are popular and are served for breakfast and dinner. The most popular sandwich spreads for this northern country include anchovies, whole or boned, an assortment of cheeses including goat, Edam, Brie, Cheddar, and Gouda, and Gefiltefish, which is small pieces of herring in wine or dill, mustard, tomato or lobster sauce. Mackerel with tomato sauce and sardines in either oil or tomato sauce are also included.

A truly Norwegian soup is Asparragus Suppe or Asparragus Soup.

## ASPARAGUS SOUP

- 1 pound asparagus
- 1 quart water
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 4 tablespoons butter
- 2 tablespoons flour
- 1 1/2 quarts of meat stock or bouillon
- 1 egg yolk

2 tablespoons of cream  
Wash the asparagus. Cut the tips off; cover these with a little salted boiling water and cook till tender. Remove the tips; add more boiling water and put in the rest of the asparagus. Let it cook till soft. Mash through a sieve, pouring the remaining cooking water through with it. Stir the butter and flour together in the soup kettle. When smooth, add the asparagus puree and liquid, the meat stock and cooked tips. Beat to boiling; then let simmer 15 minutes.

Beat the egg yolk with the cream in the slightly warmed tureen. Slowly add the hot soup, stirring continually. Add

seasoning if needed. Serve at once. 6-8 servings.

A rich soup that is called Vin Suppe in Norway sounds more like a dessert to the American palate.

- ### VIN SUPPE (WINE SOUP)
- 2 quarts of water
  - 1 small cinnamon stick
  - 1/2 lemon, peel only
  - 4 tablespoons sago flour or minute tapioca
  - 3 egg yolks
  - 1/2 cup sugar
  - five-eighths cup sherry
  - five-eighths cup white wine

Boil the water with the cinnamon and lemon peel a few minutes. Remove the cinnamon and peel. Mix the sago flour or tapioca with a little cold water

and add. Heat to boiling and the sago flour or tapioca is clear, usually about 20 minutes. Beat the yolks and sugar together till light. Stir into hot mixture. Add the wine and sugar. Or chill and serve as a cold soup. 6 to 8 servings.

For your entree some evening, try this traditional Norwegian dish.

### BEEF LINDSTROM (BIFF A LA LINDSTROM)

- 1/2 pounds boneless beef
- 4 egg yolks
- one-third cup cream
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1/2 teaspoon pepper
- 2 cooked potatoes
- 4 tablespoons diced cooked beets
- 1 teaspoon minced onion

Wipe the meat with a clean wet cloth; scrape it to remove tissue; then pound in a mortar.

Mix the egg yolks with the cream, gradually add to the meat and continue mixing and pounding. Dice the potatoes very fine and add with the beets, onions and chopped capers, mixing smoothly. Form into small cakes about 1/2 inch thick. Fry quickly in butter.

Serve hot, 4 to 6 servings.

The choice of dishes in Sweden is enormous. They are both filling and hearty to ward off the cold weather, and wonderfully imaginative and varied.

Swedish dishes have been influenced by German, Viennese and French cuisine. Rich pastries are served any time, from breakfast to the traditional midnight snack.

Sirnorgbord is served often. A sample assortment of appetizers would include herring salad, salmon with sharp cheese, pickled beets, smoked reindeer meat and eel. Several finishing touches to this "smack." All this, and the main course is yet to be served!

The sauces used in Sweden are so rich they are almost unparalleled in the culinary world. The reason for the use of these heavy sauces makes good sense. Fats, creams and other dairy products produce a natural body warming function which is needed for the Swedes to sustain themselves in their severe climate.

From the palace of the king to the humblest farmhouse, a national dish called Arter Med Flask is served every Thursday. We know it as Dried Pea Soup.

DRIED PEA SOUP

- 1 pound dried yellow peas
- 2 quarts water
- 1/4 teaspoon ground ginger
- 1 pound smoked pork or ham
- 2 teaspoons salt

Wash the peas; discard bad ones. Drain them; cover with cold water and let stand overnight. Drain again. Put into the soup kettle with 3 quarts of cold water and let them come

slowly to boiling. Then cook vigorously for 1 hour. Skim off the skins of the peas as they float to the top. Add the meat; lower the heat; cover the kettle and continue to cook the soup slowly for 2 hours or even longer. Add the seasonings. Remove the meat; slice it; and serve with the soup but on a separate dish, with mustard and black pepper. Serves 6.

In Sweden, regardless of how late or how large the dinner has been, food is again served about midnight. Every housewife has her own variations of the most popular midnight dishes. Here is one of them.

### BAKED HERRING AND POTATOES (SILLGRATIN)

- 2 large salt herring
- 6 raw potatoes.

Wash the potatoes, pare, and cut in thin slices. Butter a baking dish; put a layer of potatoes on the bottom, season with a little pepper, then a layer of herring. Cover with sliced onions, add a sprinkle of pepper and repeat the layer, finishing with potatoes. Sprinkle the top with crumbs and dot with butter. Bake in a moderate oven (375 degrees) 45 minutes. 6 servings.
