### Army Investigators Say. **LSD Tests Were Immoral**

WASHINGTON (AP) — Intelligence-oriented ex-periments with the mind-affecting drug LSD violated Pentagon rules "and disregarded moral and ethical standards of conduct governing the use of humans in research," Army investigators say.

This judgment is contained in a 259-page report by the Army inspector general's office on its investigation of drugs on soldiers and others, dating back to the mid-1950s. The Army last summer suspended testing of all chemical compounds on human volunteers after disclosure of LSD experiments conducted with 585 officers and enlisted men between 1956 and 1967. A spokesman said the suspension still is in effect.

A censored section of the report focused on three experiment operations between mid-1958 and early 1963 by U.S. intelligence and chemical corps teams, which also included medical officers.

WASHINGTON (AP) — Carla A. Hills, secretary of housing and urban development, says local communities will see a need to supply low-income housing for the poor outside of city ghettos without the government forcing it

She said in an interview Tuesday that current federal incentives in the form of money for low-income housing and community development projects are adequate to entice suburbs to provide housing for low-income workers who nec. .a rollow trie jobs to trie suburbs.

Hills' comments came a week after the Supreme Court ruled in a case involving low-income housing in Chicago that a federal court has the authority to order metropolitan-wide public housing programs for Chicago and that HUD could be ordered "to foster projects loca. ### Strike Saves City Money

SAN FRANCISCO (AP) - A four-week strike has crippled public transportation and dirtied Golden Gate Park. But it has saved the city more money than the planned pay cuts which precipitated it, the city's con-

Controller John Farrell said Tuesday the strike has brought a net savings of nearly \$7.5 million. That is nearly \$2 million more than the planned \$5.7-million pay cut for about 1,800 laborers, carpenters, plumbers and street-

### Criminal Code Updated

AUGUSTA, Maine (AP) — Prostitutes in Maine won't have to worry about jail terms after Saturday. Possessing a small amount of marijuana will no longer be a serious crime. But a five-year prison sentence will mean just that - no early release on parole.

A new state Criminal Code, adopted last year and revised this year, takes effect Saturday. It is the first comprehensive rewriting of the criminal statutes since

### Power Struggle In China Cools

The struggle in Communist China over the role of Teng Hsiao-ping as acting premier has left Teng out of power and Hua Kuo-feng confirmed as premier and the highest ranking Politburo member after Party Chairman Mao Tse-tung. Hua is now in effect the successor in power to the late Premier Chou En-lai.

China watchers tend to believe that Teng was purged because he reached for too much power too quickly during the time last year when Chou was sick and dying and Teng was filling his shoes. As acting premier, Teng had deployed civilian officials loyal to him in key positions around the country, many of them individuals who had been ousted from their posts during Mao's Cultural Revolution. As acting chief of staff of the armed forces, Teng had shifted top military men about to his advantage in the provinces.

All this, one assumes, was too much for Chairman Mao. He turned against Teng just as he had previously turned against two other No. 2 men under him - Liu Shao-chi and Lin Piao, who once undermined his leadership. The April 4 anti-Mao demonstration in Peking, which pro-Teng forces must have augmented if not instigated, apparently was the last straw. Teng's dismissal at Mao's in-

The power struggle between the so-called pragmatists represented by Teng and the so-called radicals represented by Mao's wife Chiang Ching is unlikely to end with Hua's accession to power, but it may diminish for the time being. Hua has had past links with the radicals, but he is no wild-eyed agitator. He has a record of favoring stability and economic progress, as do the pragmatists, and he may show he can get along with them.

From the standpoint of the United States, it is probably all to the good if disruption on the Chinese mainland now dies down. Stability in Peking means that Red China will continue to serve our interests as a counterwieight to Soviet power. Nor are the changes in Peking likely to lead to any change in the cultivation of the United States as a counterweight to Soviet power in the eyes of the

Hua's speech welcoming former President Richard Nixon to China recently left no doubt that he is as categorically anti-Soviet as was Teng and equally desirous of friendly relations with the On The Air Show United States. To the extent that radicals may have increased their influence in Peking's inner councils, China may be a little more assertive and abrasive on some issues — the future of Taiwan for instance — but not to a disruptive degree.

Secretary of State Henry Kissinger is probably correct in forseeing no new problems in our relations with mainland China as a result of Hua's taking the place of Teng. Mr. Kissinger once called Teng "a nasty little man." Indeed, he may find Hua



But oftentimes in this culture when a person reaches an age where they can no longer live in a home by themselves - but can still care for themselves and are ambulatory — they must give up the dignity and privacy of their home for the oftentimes emotional sterility of institutional living. This is not the case with Share-A-Home. Here they live together in a family setting, eating together, being entertained together, able to leave

the home whenever they wish and have complete run of the house. In short, they have the advantage of companionship without the loss of dignity which can sometimes accompany admission to a nursing

Each home has a manager (usually a husband and wife team) who maintains the home and works there at the pleasure of the "family members." The SAH charter, which sets the ground rules for the non-profit venture, even gives residents the power to fire Gillies if they become dissatisfied with his

The residents pay from \$275 to \$475 a month depending on the home they live in and individual quarters in that home. Rooms are either single or salary, plus transportation for residents to the

Alvin Knight, director of the Orange County Advisory Council on Aging, had this to say of the concept: "Our results with people we're referring is it's an outstanding arrangement that meets the needs of quite a few elderly.'
