Nativity Scene Reprieved --But Only With Disclaimer

CHICAGO (UPI) - The city's traditional nativity scenes today included the Three Wise Men, the baby Jesus, the manger and a government disclaimer. U.S. District Judge Thomas R. McMillen Monday denied a temporary restraining order to remove the scenes from City Hall and Water Tower Park, but ordered signs be placed next to the scenes disavowing any government connection.

In a suit filed Friday, the American Civil Liberties Union contended the nativity scenes promote Christianity and that government officials should not be involved in any way. This was not a final ruling," ACLU at torney Richard Mandel said.



Carter And The Liberals

By staving off a liberal challenge to his antiinflation program, President Carter emerged from the Democratic midterm convention in a position to puruse his emphasis on trimming the federal

Mr. Carter won in Memphis partly because of the inherent leverage a sitting president enjoys in defusing policy revolts within his own party. Even the disaffected are susceptible to White House blandishments, a fact the president's floor

lobbyists in Memphis did not overlook. Beyond appeals to party loyalty, the president had public opinion on his side. To borrow a phrase from Sen. Kennedy, Mr. Carter was sailing with the wind, not against it.

Every poll shows inflation to be the public's chief domestic concern.

And Mr. Carter recognizes it as the one issue that could undo his presidency. In the end, this argument was sufficient to persuade 59 percent of the delegates to vote against a liberal resolution opposing budget cuts in social welfare programs. Still, the liberals will not fade away and Mr. Carter cannot ignore the fact that they continue to represent the core of the Democratic party's traditional strength.

Significantly, organized labor — a relatively conservative force in Democratic politics for most of this decade - lined up this time on the side of the

Mr. Carter may be able to shrug off George Meany's intemperate name calling, but he can hardly discount labor's hostility to his budget cutting, his wage and price guidelines, or his unwillingness to enlist in the fight for things like national health insurance.

When the administration submits its budget to Congress next month, those who feel themselves shortchanged will not be reluctant to complain. We can only guess what all this portends for President Carter's political hopes in 1980.

Ironically, the estrangement between Mr. Carter and Democratic liberals should actually help the president on Capitol Hill. Most Republicans as well as conservative and

Not satisfied with the initial vague reply, Califano peppers the physicians with follow-up queries: Do social workers as well as doctors see the young women? How qualified are the social workers? How successful are efforts to avoid repeat pregnancies? Is there a community outreach program Califano's rapid-fire questioning then moves to

other areas: Are the needs of older patients being served? Do nurse practitioners relieve the doctors of some of the work load? How high is the turnover rate of physicians on the payroll?







ELECTRIC COMPANY Florida Forecast: Big Surplus, No Recession

TALLAHASSEE, (UPI) - State economists expect almost a \$500 million surplus, the biggest in Florida history, at the end of the fiscal year June 30 and no recession anytime soon. That optimistic economic forecast came Monday from legislative and executive branch fiscal experts meeting for the emi-annual Revenue Estimating Conference. The estimate for the current fiscal year was increased \$250

federal money.

The \$293 million windfall, \$156 million left unappropriated in the working capital fund for financial emergencies and another several million in lapsed funds — appropriated, but never spent by state agencies - will result in an estimated \$478 million sur-

The surplus is being caused by greater than expected collections on almost all taxes, especially the sales tax, projected to grow 17.3 percent over last year. Total state revenues are expected to grow \$336 million, or almost 12 percept, over the 1977-78 flacal-year. "There has never been a time in the history of the state when the surplus will be as great," said state Budget Director Joe

Gov.-elect Bob Graham could use the surplus for the two-year treese on property taxes he is proposing, although lobbyists for education and social services will try to get u big chunk of it. Plorida returns to biennial, or two-year, budgeting next July for the first time in 16 years and a spending plan of around \$14 billion
