## Lecithin Is Fat, Not Some Vitamin

DEAR DR. LAMB—I would really appreciate your answering a couple of questions for me. Can you tell me what foods naturally contain lecithin and are there any calories in a 100 milligram vitamin capsule? Also, are there any calories in vitamin B complex with vitamin C that has 15 milligrams of lecithin in it?

DEAR READER—In the first place, lecithin is not a vitamin. It's a triglyceride (fat) attached to choline. Your body can manufacture choline from an adequate amount of good quality protein in your diet. The calories in lecithin come from its fat content. There are nine calories in every 100 milligram of fat. It follows that a 100 milligram lecithin vitamin capsule probably contains less than 10 calories.

You should know that your own body manufactures lecithin. The amount that is in your blood stream is basically regulated by your own liver. Choline can be manufactured from essential amino acids in the proteins of a well-balanced diet and your liver can produce the fatty acid necessary to form the triglyceride part of the lecithin. So if you are eating a good normal diet, your lecithin level is more apt to be dependent upon the basic characteristics of your own body chemistry. Lecithin is found in a variety of foods; soybean and soybean products are good examples. Choline is found in meats. If your diet contains an adequate amount of meat, you should be getting sufficient choline for your body to manufacture its own lecithin.

Note that lecithin is not a vitamin and its calorie content is solely dependent on the point that it is really a fat. Real vitamins don't have calories. For that reason, vitamin B complex and vitamin C do not add to your calorie intake. They

are not used for energy. Vitamins are commonly used in the metabolic cycle to help your cells break down the food you eat and release the calories that are in the food. These vitamins, many of which are in lecithin, neither lecithin nor the vitamins are an important source of calories.

Other foods that are rich in choline, which your body can use to make its own lecithin, include whole grains, liver, egg yolks and kidneys. Your body needs between 150 to 400 milligrams of choline a day. Seven ounces of lean meat will contain 300 milligrams. Lecithin is important in your body, but you need to know that the way lecithin is increased in your blood is from the action of your own liver. The liver is a remarkable organ that controls the level of sugar in your blood, regulates the formation of different sized fatty-cholesterol particles, changes one amino acid into another amino acid, breaks down amino acids from proteins and even forms new ones.

## What They Say At The Polls

A random sampling of Sanford voters as they left the polls at the Civic Center this morning revealed a neck-and-neck battle for the Third District city commission seat at stake.

Challenger David Farr led incumbent A.A. McClanahan six to five with five of the 10 electors polled refusing to reveal their votes.

Voter turnout in Sanford was steady with about 700 by noon. In Lake Mary only 54 voters had gone to the polls by 11 a.m.

Francis Mark and Bill Smathers are locked in a run-off race for seat two on the city council. They are trying to take over the seat being vacated by Mrs. Lillian Griffin.

McClanahan and Farr finished one and two, respectively, in the Dec. 5 city election in a field of seven candidates. However, neither garnered a majority of the 1,000 votes cast two weeks ago.

McClanahan led the pack of seven candidates for the seat with 303 votes. Farr trailed him with 288 votes, seven more than three-place Isham Noel Vance.

Many voters who said they supported McClanahan mentioned their personal friendship with him and his years of service on the commission.

Farr supporters expressed a feeling that city government needed new blood and younger people on the commission.

### 'No Christmas For Me'

There's going to be no Christmas at all for me," Vernon Andrews, 68, said today.

Andrews was shot and then kicked repeatedly after he fell to the floor during an armed robbery Monday evening at his girlfriend's home on West Marker Street near Altamonte Springs.

"I've been working six, seven days a week trying to get Christmas money for the kids," Andrews explained. He said he had the robber over a chair and could have gotten his gun but he was attacked from behind by the second robber.

Andrews said that after the attack, the events became unclear. He said he doesn't even remember when he was shot.

"I knew I was shot because I could feel the blood running down my face," Andrews said. But a lot of things happened that I don't remember."

The bullet grazed the side of Andrews' head and he was treated and released at Florida Hospital North.

Miss Walker's two children, Helen, 9, and Robert, 11, were in the room throughout the robbery. Andrews has a five-year-old son.

A lifetime resident of the area, Andrews lives on Marker Street with his mother and son.

In moving to give Beckwith a key, Sturm noted: "In keeping with the Christmas spirit, I move the county commission give all constitutional officers and judges keys to the courthouse to bring peace and harmony for all concerned."

When Commissioner William Kirkhoff, who voted against giving up the key, tried to amend Sturm's motion with an attempt at humor, he evoked a comment from Sandra Glenn. She had seconded Sturm's motion to name keys and voted with Sturm to get it passed.

"Let's change that to give all constitutional officers' employees keys, which would end someone's security, but be in the Christmas spirit," said Kirkhoff.

Responding Mrs. Glenn "Whoop-de-do." Usually, Mrs. Glenn moved to give Beck with a key, but that was amended by Sturm to give all constitutional officers a key.

### Panel Asked: Alter Recall, Ethics Laws

Councilman Laurent Pellerin of Winter Springs and ex-Councilman John Daniels, subjects of an unsuccessful recall movement earlier this year, appeared at the Seminole County Legislative Delegation Monday evening to urge toward curbing the "inequality" in the state laws concerning recall of elected municipal officials and the code of ethics.

"I wouldn't run for election in this state again anymore than I would to try," Daniels told State Reps. Bobby Hattaway, D-Alamonte Springs, and Bobby Brantley, R-Longwood, and State Sen. John Vogt, D-Cocoa, at the new delegation's first meeting in Oviedo.

Daniels, who withdrew from a re-election effort after the signatures on petitions seeking his recall from office were deemed insufficient in number, said the recall law discourages honest, forthright persons from running for office and fails to provide due process of law.

"The law doesn't provide for recourse by the elected official," he said. "It allows any yo-yo backed by unnamed co-conspirators to make unsubstantiated charges. A person could be removed from office without one charge being proven. The law should be changed to require proof in court or at least an indictment by a grand jury."

Daniels said the code of ethics does not provide for a trial in court before removal from office and lacks a provision on due process.

## 15 Elderly Losing Their 1 Hot Meal

Grace Perry, director of the Meals on Wheels (MOW) program of Seminole Community Action (SCA) began Monday morning over the list of 15 homebound elderly persons who receive one hot meal daily under the program, to determine which 15 will have their meals halted as of Jan. 1.

"This man is not crutches. This lady has no legs," she said, as her way of identifying each of the recipients, trying to determine whose need is greater, whose need is not so great.

"The money is not available. The fault is mine," Mrs. Perry

transferred to the Seminole County Federation of Senior Citizens Project OASIS (Older Americans Services in Seminole). Under that specific federal program, called Title III, 30 hot meals daily were being distributed to homebound elderly in the county. Although Project OASIS is to be dropped from the list of the 30, for various reasons 15 persons were dropped.

When Mrs. Perry became June 30, 1979, the end of the federal-state program called Title XX, 40 hot meals daily to other homebound elderly. Using a different accounting method, costs of the meals were cut from \$1.51 each to \$1.20 and Mrs. Perry added the 15 persons who had been cut by Project OASIS to her list of clients. Monday she was told that even with the savings in the cost of the meals, 15 persons have to be dropped from the list of the 30, for various reasons 15 persons were dropped.

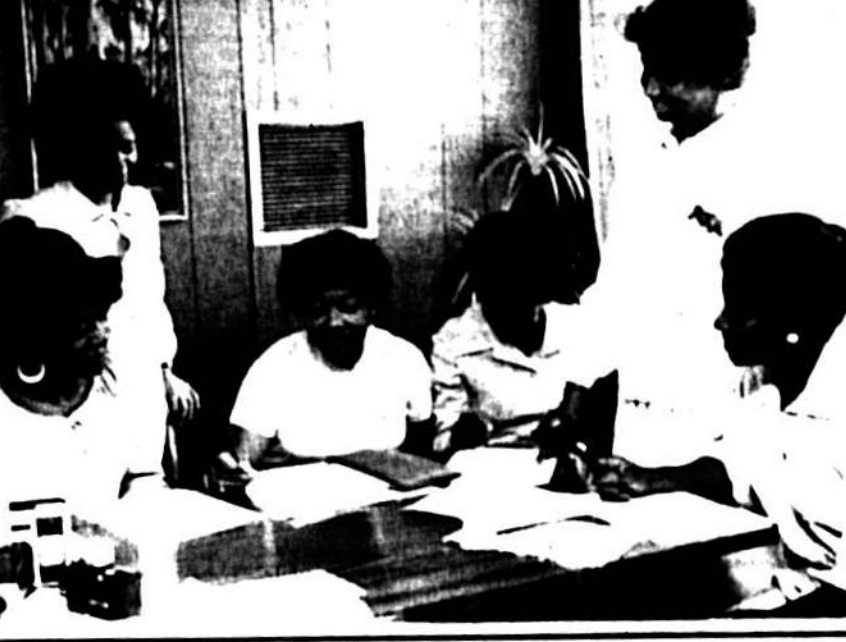
