





Be Cheerful

One of the most noticeable characteristics of President Roosevelt is his broad smile and his pleasant happy manner.

One of the most oft repeated criticisms of former President Hoover was his continued optimism in the face of adverse conditions. His reiterated assertion that "prosperity is just around the corner" remained plague him again and again.

Both of these men have tried repeatedly to instill confidence into the American people. They have tried to make them believe that conditions are not as bad as they seem. They have sought to revive the faith of everyone that things are going to be better.

No one can accurately forecast the future. But if Mr. Hoover had told us at the beginning of the depression that the bottom was about to drop out, what would have happened? A little later, when things would have happened? A little later, when were looking pretty bad, if he had publicly declared that all hope was gone, how many people could have stood the strain?

No one today knows what the next year or two will bring forth. But if President Roosevelt were to take a gloomy view of the picture, if he were to tell us that those now unemployed will remain unemployed, that the whole country, in short, is going to the bow wows, then truly all hope would be gone.

It is essential to public welfare that our leaders always be optimistic. It is absolutely necessary, that no matter how discouraged and depressed they may be in private, in public at least they must appear cheerful, hopeful, and confident that the future will be better.

If every individual citizen would make it his business to see to it that he personally reflects the same optimistic spirit which always characterizes President Roosevelt, it would be no time at all before real prosperity would in truth be here.

(AP) -As a result of an autopsy performed at Swayse morgue in found that the child had died of a fracture of the skull. This fracture was located slightly posterior to the left ear and extended from a central point in three directions, one branch of the fracture going forward above the left car, another branch extending upward toward the top of the head and the third branch extending backward toward the back of the head. At a point one inch posterior to the right ear there was a punctured wound through the skull. This wound was one-half inch in diameter rounded by slightly irregular.

Both of the wounds child's head were produced by lence and caused the death of child. The fracture on the left side could have been caused by a blow. The round opening on the right side of the skull could have been caused by any sharp pointed beaters" colorless in comparison. instrument applied with sufficient force.
