## Longwood Bites Bullet; Facing \$44,000 In Red

LONGWOOD — There are financially rocky times ahead for this city's government, according to a report issued last night and said belts must be tightened to get out of the money morass.

City businessman, Georges St. Laurent, asked to assist the city with financial advice, urged the council to "bite the bullet now," rather than putting off the inevitable; the laying off of some city personnel.

Income and spending was examined for the first three months of the fiscal year, line-by-line, and numerous equipment items were cut. Hartsock said the city would still end the fiscal year \$44,000 in the red.

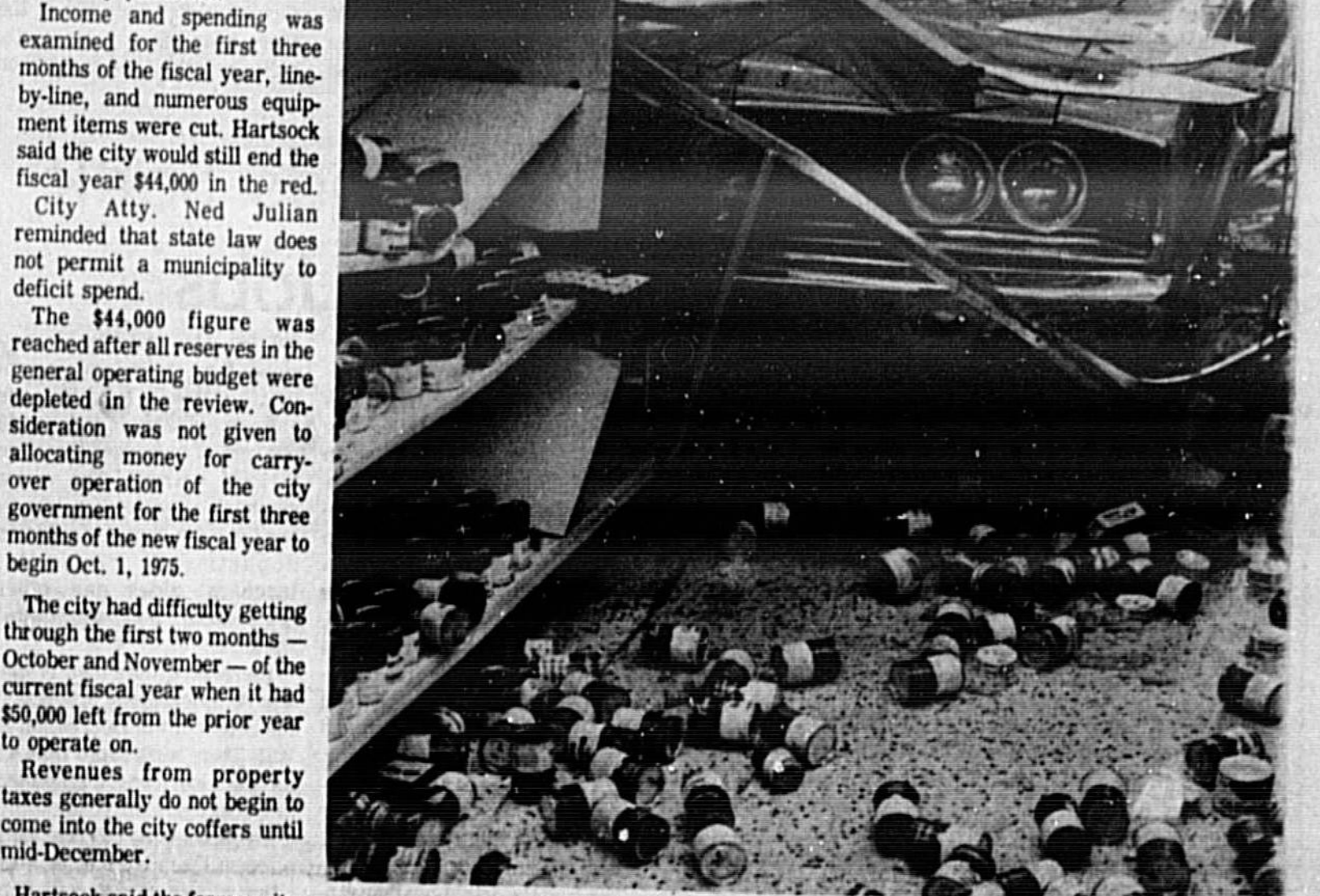
City Atty. Ned Julian indicated that state law does not permit a municipality to deficit spend.

The \$44,000 figure was reached after all reserves in the general operating budget were depleted in the review. Consideration was not given to allocating money for carry-over operation of the city for the first three months of the new fiscal year to begin Oct. 1, 1975.

The city had difficulty getting through the first two months—October and November—of the current fiscal year when it had \$50,000 left from the prior year to operate on.

Revenues from property taxes generally do not begin to come into the city coffers until mid-December.

Hartsock said the former city council had expected \$600,979 in general revenues. However, the city will receive about \$48,979, Councilman Jerry Connell added the figure did not take into account the \$10,900 borrowed by the general operating fund from water

A fourth juvenile has been indicted by the Seminole County Grand Jury in connection with an armed robbery.

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## Utility Violations Found In Southern Gulf Program

The Seminole County Utility Control Board—also known as the County Commission—has found Southern Gulf Utilities to be in violation of county utility regulations and can assess the firm almost \$40,000 in fines.

The action, which came yesterday, was expected after the Board Tuesday denied steep rate increases requested by the firm because of "non-compliance" with utility regulations.

On Tuesday, commissioners denied a rate increase that would have doubled water bills and tripled sewer bills for the firm's customers in the county.

In a series of rate hearings that concluded on Nov. 12, Southern Gulf representatives told the Board that their firm would lose money on both water and sewer operations in the county if they did not receive the requested increases.

But during compliance hearings, which ended in December, the Board heard evidence from inspectors in their Utility Control Department that cited interruptions in service and poor housekeeping throughout the firm's system.

During the non-compliance rendering, newly-elected Commissioner Harry Kwiatkowski abstained from voting since he wasn't present for the hearings.

Judge Richard Muldrew, who issued a temporary injunction halting the county's first hearing on the firm in September, will review the fines to determine if they can be collected.

Meanwhile, commissioners set a Feb. 11 date for the first public hearing on requested rate increases by Southern States Utilities. The new rates, which would more than double existing sewer fees, and increase water rates by at least half the present rates, will be decided within 55 days of the concluding hearing.

## Zoo Eyes Heavy Tourist Traffic

Sanford officials are hopeful the new Central Florida Zoo will be completed in time to attract part of a record 25.3 million tourists expected to stream into the Sunshine State

State commerce officials predicted Thursday in Tallahassee that tourism this year will surpass even the banner year experienced in Florida in 1973.

State tourism officials estimated 25 million sun-seekers spent \$5.5 billion in Florida in 1973, while 24.5 million sightseers spent \$6.1 billion last year.

Zoo officials have set April 1, as the day animals will move from present facilities into the new compound and a Greater Sanford Chamber of Commerce official said today he's hopeful the attraction will be "full blown" sometime this fall.

"I'm hopeful they can have it really nice for us to go all out," Executive Manager Jack Horner said, adding, "We're (Sanford officials) not really geared up until we have something to sell."

applied from Congress and other quarters to implement rationing as the method to cut down on soaring consumption of the precious petrol.

Also a boost to tourism was an announcement yesterday by Eastern Air Lines that it will add 600 seats a day to and from Orlando Jetport at McCoy sometime this summer.

State officials are hopeful that a surge in tourism can help to offset the increasingly bleak financial picture in state government.

Faced with less-than-hoped for revenues from tax collections during the first five months of this fiscal year, the Cabinet on Jan. 9 ordered state agencies to cut spending by \$119 million.

Residents Face Exemption Loss

Many residents of Seminole County are facing the loss of their eligibility to homestead exemption for 1975, according to Terry Goemmel, Seminole County Property Appraiser.

Goemmel said the renewal applications are being returned to his office marked "undeliverable" probably due to those residents being created with some of the cities renaming and renumbering their streets causing the forms to be returned and marked as undeliverable.

Residents are reminded by Goemmel if they haven't received their homestead renewal application, and if they still reside on the same property, they should contact the appraiser's office.

New residents of Seminole County in 1974 or old residents who moved to a different home during 1974 are reminded they must apply in person prior to March 1. Homestead exemption applications are being taken at either of the three locations: Seminole County Courthouse in Sanford; Seminole Plaza in Casselberry; and the Altamonte Mall in Altamonte Springs.

Goemmel cautioned residents not to take the word of others if there is a question and instead requested they contact the personnel in his office for the correct information.
