No doubt these measures would go a long way toward bringing some semblance of order to the State's financial chaos.

But there is still much to be done. The report of the Brookings Institution has pointed the way toward a systematic reorganization of the State government which is essential to place the State on a sound financial basis, It may be that something along this line can be accomplished. 




