Continued from page one will extend on First Street from Street from Park Avenue to Magnolie Avenue; on Magnolia Avenue frem First Street to Second Street. Central Park will be entirely surrounded by these flags tationed 25 feet abart.

It is further the intention of the legion to install one or two flags in front of every residence in the city. Whether one or more flags are purchased, receptacles for holding the flags will be placed at intervals which are multiples of 25 feet. Then when the gaps are eventually filled in it is pointed out, the decorations throughout the entire city will be uniform.

Each fing is stationed on 12-foot poles which will fit into sockets especially placed along the curb line for them. The sockets will be primanent and even if apparently covered up, can readily be found by measuring from certain lines.

These flags, it was brought out, will be cared for by the city or by the legion.
