

We had just begun to believe that Britain's blockade of Germany was about as effective as a sieve holding water, that ships as large as the Bremen could slip by the British warships as easily as German submarines, that in short the naval power of the country which for centuries has ruled the waves was indeed upon its last sea legs, when along comes a spectacular battle in the South Atlantic and
