History of the Early Days Proved Most Interesting Topic

The first Presbyterian church was founded in this part of Florida at Ft. Reade in the Orange House, the only hotel in the region. This was before the present city of Sanford had been founded and the real settlement was at Ft. Reade, Some thirty years ago a few devoted souls met in the reception hall of the Arange House and founded the first Presbyterian church that at that time was the only one south of Palatka. There were at that time only about eight families living in that vicinity. Mrs. Holland, one of the members and founders of the church read a very interesting paper at the meeting Sunday night, relating the circumstances, and was followed by Hon, J. N. Whitner, himself one of the devoted band of early Presbyterians. He told in a most interesting manner the early struggles of those pioneer days in Silver Lake wehre Presbyterians were the houses.
