

Clarks Return From 11,000 Mile Trip Through 33 States

O. W. Clark and family returned home Tuesday from an 11,000 mile trip to the Pacific coast during which they visited points of interest in 33 states, said Mr. Clark today. He declared that during the whole trip they "advertised Florida." They were accompanied by Long Beach, Calif., by Mrs. Annabelle Lee and Earl Lee who plan to live there. They left on June 30.

Mr. Clark reported that except in the west, he found prices of shoes and merchandise much higher than in Florida.

They visited Mt. Capulin in New Mexico, he said, Pike's Peak in Colorado, Springs, Salt Lake City, the Grand Canyon and Boulder Dam. In California they visited Hollywood and Los Angeles and vicinity and crossed the Golden Gate Bridge and visited Chinatown and other points of interest in San Francisco. They drove through the Redwood forest. In Oregon they saw the sealion caves, he stated.

Other points of interest described by Mr. Clark were the Grand Coulee Dam in Washington, Vancouver, B. C., the Lewis and Clark caves in Montana, Yellowstone National Park in Wyoming including Old Faithful geyser, also bears, deer, elk and moose. They also saw the Black Hills in South Dakota.

State Employment Service Re-enters Agriculture Field

TALLAHASSEE, Aug. 7 (Special)—The Florida State Employment Service has reentered the agricultural placement field, with authority to solicit orders and make referrals, Carl B. Smith, Chairman of the Florida Industrial Commission, announced.

Under the terms and provisions of an act of Congress, approved April 25, this year, the Department of Agriculture will withdraw from this field and the Employment Service will resume its activities as of December 31, 1947, as provided under the Wagner-Peyser Act.

Under the agreement entered into with the Department of Agriculture through its Extension Service, Mr. Smith said the Employment Service during the interim will proceed to make farm placements, soliciting orders directly. During this period the Department of Agriculture, through the Extension Service agents in the counties will continue agricultural placement activities.

Persons desiring farm labor can file their orders directly with the local Employment Service office as before the farm placement service was taken over by the Department of Agriculture during the war. This plan in no way interferes with the Extension Service carrying on its program.

A memorandum outlining the new plan has been sent to the field offices of the Employment Service and the new plan is already in effect.

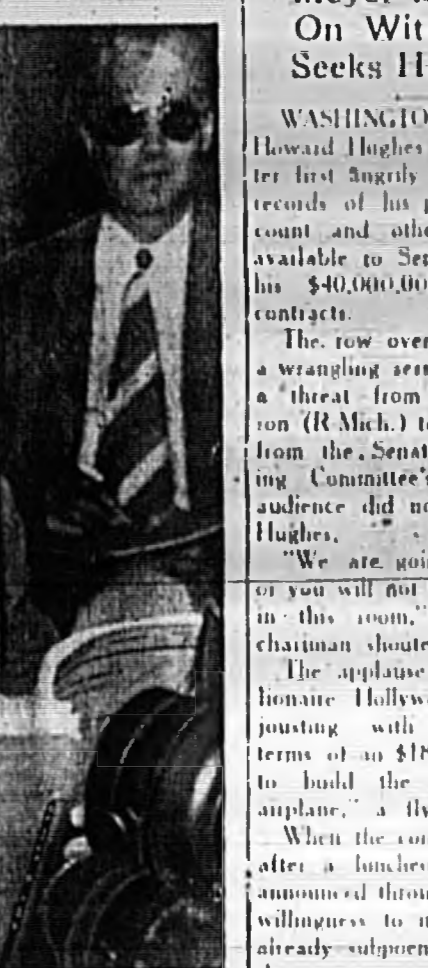

Mexican Claims Are Nearly Cleared Up

WASHINGTON—The government is still doing its claim business at the same old stand. The Indian Claims Commission, created by Congress last year, has taken over the office, telephone numbers—and much of the staff—of the American-Mexican Claims Commission, which expired by law April 4.

Until the final days of the congressional session, however, the commission was a financial orphan. Congress waited until almost the last minute to appropriate funds for it, and the three \$10,000-a-year commissions had jobs without paychecks from mid-April until the end of July. The appropriation was made in an omnibus bill which took care

Mexican Claims Paid

At last, all of the pending claims of United States citizens against Mexico and Mexican citizens are settled. Certain claims always have been handled directly by the State Department and in the future all Mexican claims will go to it.

James A. Langston, secretary of the last of a long line of Mexican claims commissions, is pretty proud of how it all came out.

The commission paid off 1,265 claims for \$37,348,800.05. The people making them had asked originally for \$35,250,950.

Altogether, Langston explained recently, the several commissions that have shuffled Mexican claims around since 1923 approved about \$40,760,000 worth. Under an agreement, Mexico set up a little more than \$40,600,000 to pay them.

Some Money Lacking

That leaves some successful claimants still holding the bag for about \$215,000, Langston said. They won't get it, unless the Mexican government put up the missing money.

The last 200 claims settled by the commission were the historic Texas cattle claims which originated in the late 1860's. They arose from border raids by Mexican soldiers, and once amounted to more than \$50,000,000.

The new Indian Claims Commission faces a similar job, and Langston is its chief clerk and administrative officer.

It is authorized to hear all claims by Indians against the government. It can settle them directly, and its decisions can be appealed to federal courts.

Many outstanding Indian claims as old as the Texas cattle claims Langston said. Some are the famous "pony" claims of the Sioux, whose ponies were driven off and killed by the U. S. Cavalry when it found that the Sioux fighters could be whipped no other way.

The Commission has not adopted its rules yet, Langston said, and has received only seven tentative Indian claims. Most of those will have to be resubmitted, he said, when the rules are announced.

There is one noteworthy commission, Edgar E. Witt of Waco, Tex. The two new ones are Louis J. Omas of Sheridan, Wyo., and William M. Holt of Lincoln, Neb.

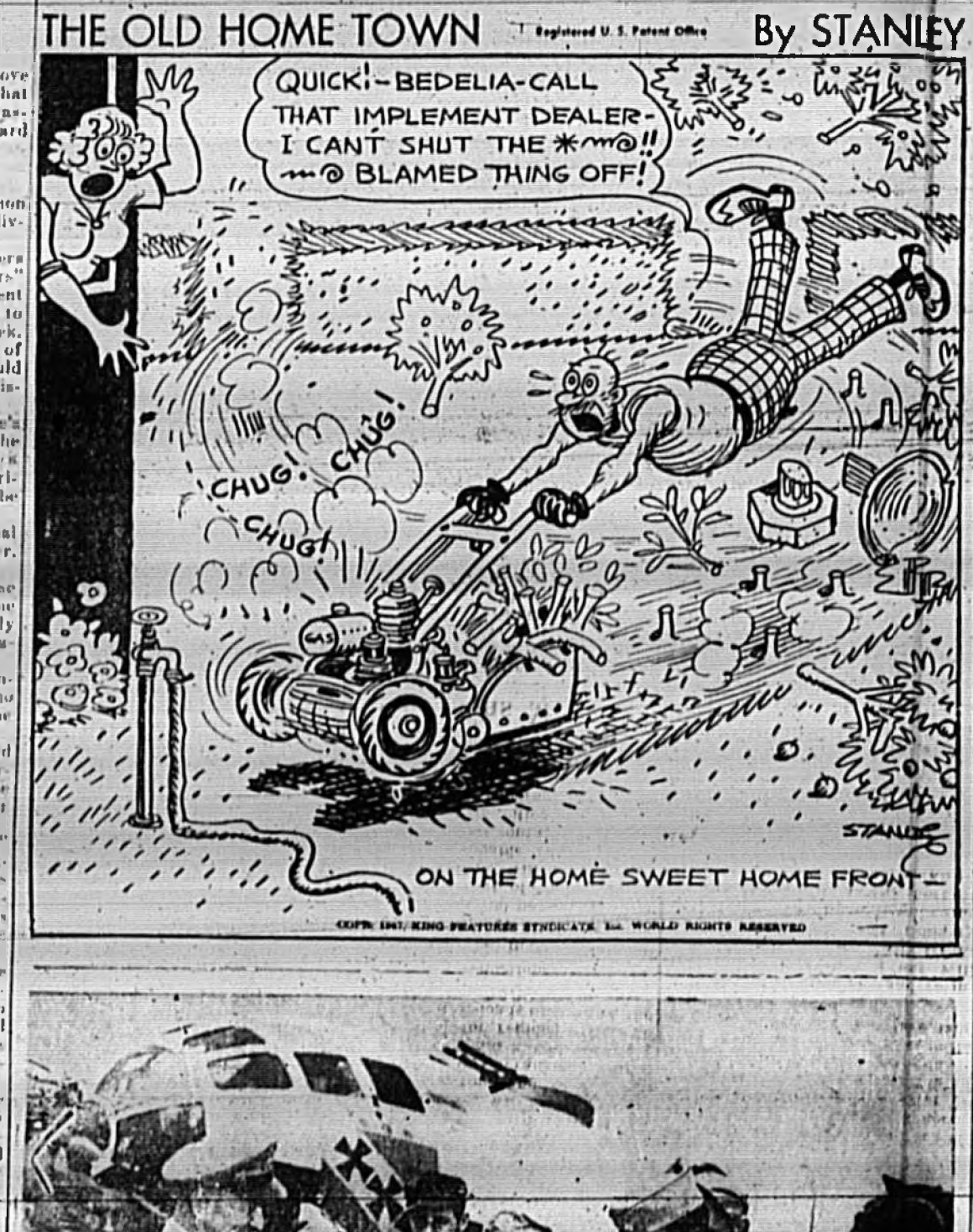
