Sugar is now selling at reatil for pect that it will go still higher. It is believed that there will be no decrease in the price through the summer in the preserving season. The American housewife will have to pay dearly for the sugar that she uses for the next half year, it is predicted.

The heading of the bulletin issued by the Department of Commerce asserted that "Production (of sugar) for 1923 only +25,000 tons higher than tast year. Consumption needs estimated at 725,000 tons above production." In the body of the balletin there appeared statements that there was only a small "carry-over" in Cuba and a decrease in the production of cano and beet suar in this country. Frank C.
