### Hearing Stated March 23 For Convicted Men

DAYTONA BEACH — A hearing on a motion for a new trial for two Titusville men convicted of slaying an Orlov man, has been rescheduled for March 23, before Judge Howell Melton of the seventh circuit, according to State Attorney Dan Warren's office.

Charles Clark and Richard White were convicted on Feb. 2 of the pistol slaying of Moses Jackson last May 8.

The jury made no recommendation in Clark's case, but recommended mercy for White. Under the verdict, Clark, 27, faces death in the electric chair and White, 34, a mandatory life sentence.

Testimony showed the defendants picked up Jackson and a friend, Andrew Cash, near Titusville and drove to a spot near the St. Johns River in Volusia County, just across the Seminole County border, where the slaying followed a robbery attempt. Cash was wounded but recovered and was a state witness.

Among points listed in the motion for a new trial filed by defense counsel was the denial of testimony before the jury by a court-appointed psychiatrist regarding statements by Clark and White to drink coffee for three days preceding the incident.

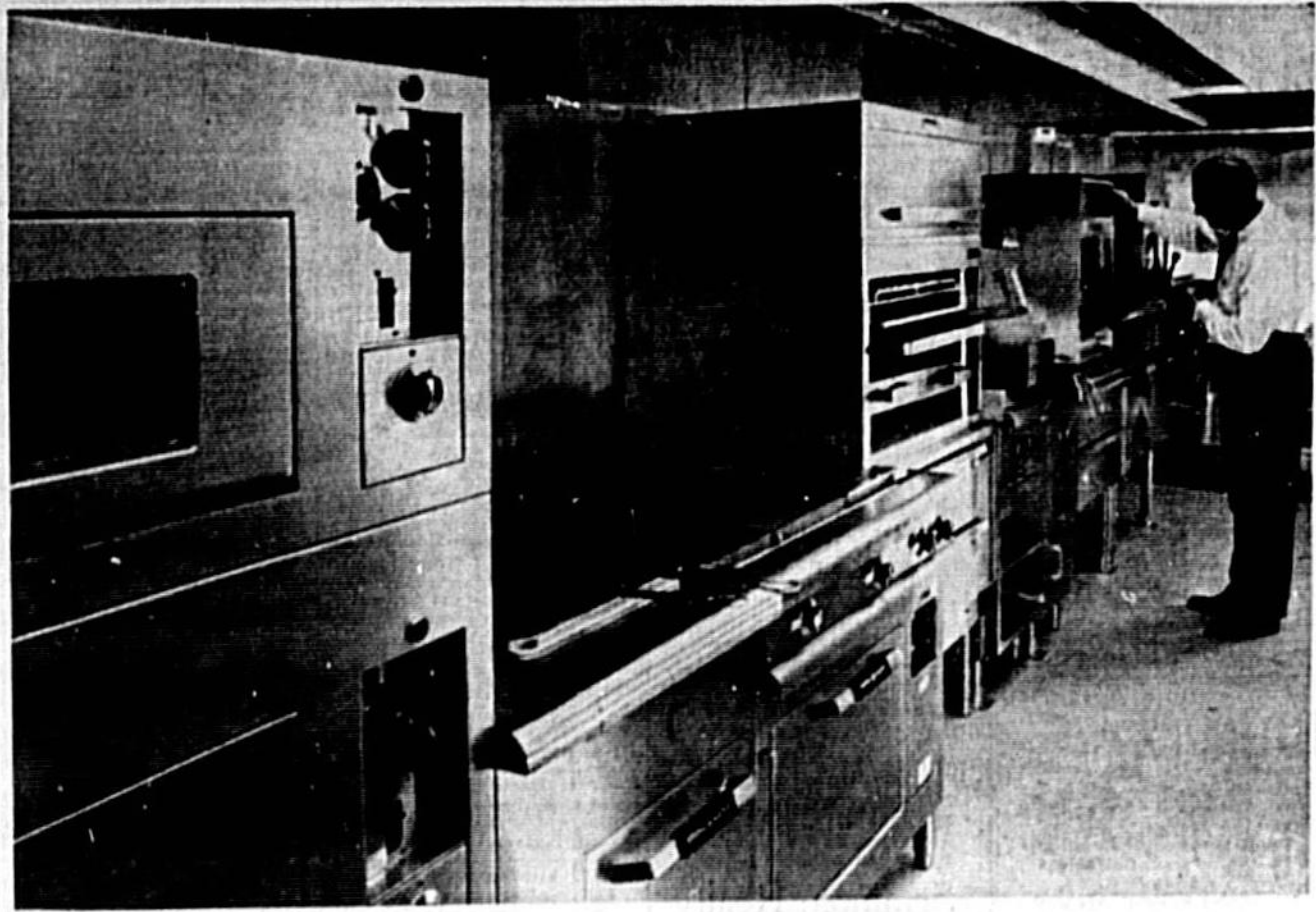

# Medicare Insurance 'Bargains' Outlined By Social Security

WASHINGTON — After months of foot-dragging, Americans are flocking to sign up for the big-time Medicare health insurance offered by Social Security.

Q—How is the premium to be paid?  
A—If a person who is signed up is drawing a monthly Social Security, Railroad Retirement or Civil Service Retirement check, the amount will be deducted automatically from the check. Otherwise, the person will be billed by Social Security at regular intervals.

Q—What other reasons do people give for refusing the insurance?  
A—Many have said—and this is generally a mistaken reason—that they don't want the supplementary insurance because they already have such coverage either through Blue Shield or Blue Cross or a commercial firm.

Q—But will the "Blue" and commercial companies continue such coverage after Medicare takes effect?  
A—That's just it. Most of them have made it clear they aren't going to duplicate for the aged what Medicare offers, and most are urging their policyholders to sign up. Some already have announced how they are going to change their coverage once Medicare begins.

Q—That's next July 1?  
A—Yes. That's when all Medicare benefits except those pertaining to skilled nursing homes go into effect. The nursing-home benefits will not be available until Jan. 1, 1967.

Q—Now Medicare is divided into two parts—  
A—That's right: "Plan A," or basic hospital insurance, and "Plan B," or supplementary medical insurance.

Q—Plan A will—  
A—In general, it will offer up to 90 days of care in a hospital for each spell of illness with the patient paying the first 40 plus \$10 for each day after the first 60. It also will offer home-health bene-

fits—in a patient's own home—following hospitalization. And in 1967 benefits in skilled nursing homes will be added.

Q—And Plan B?  
A—Primarily, it will help pay doctor bills—whether the physician renders his services in the patient's home, in his own office, or in a hospital, nursing home or other institution.
