

One of the most important problems confronting the next session of the Florida legislature which convenes in-April is the so-called "Child Labor Amendment." This is another of that infinite variety of laws which are seeking to destroy the rights of the individual states and transfer all the power of government to federal authorities.

In this instance the maneuver is being accomplished an honest forthright manner as provided for by the Constitution of the United States. As long ago as 1924 a resolution submitting the amendment to the states was passed by Congress and during the thirteen years that have followed has been approved by all but twelve of the necessary states to make it effective. It is conceivable that before this year is over the states will have surrendered their authority over child labor to the federal government.

The proposed amendment reads as follows:
"Section 1. The Congress shall have the power to limit, regulate, and prohibit the labor of persons under eighteen years of age.

"Section 2. The power of the several states is unimpaired by this article, except that the operation of state laws shall be suspended to the extent necessary to give effect to legislation enacted by the Congress."
For the purposes of this amendment "labor" is de

fined as "physical or mental activity." Though popularly known as the "Child Labor Amendment," it applies to all persons under eighteen years of age. And the powers in this respect which Congress shall have, if the amendment is adopted, will be "to limit, regulate, and prohibit" the physical and mental activities of all persons under eighteen years of age.


