

# Achievements Of Educational TV Stressed By Principal

"Educational television is not a teacher substitute, but it is a fine teacher aid," says Floyd Richards, principal of Lake Mary school.

Richards and several other local teachers visited educational station WEDU in Tampa to observe the workings of the program as carried out in the surrounding section of the state which includes the counties of Hillsborough, Pinellas, Polk, Sarasota, Manatee, Pasco and Hernando.

The total pupil audience last year was estimated at 100,521 with 75 per cent of schools in the reception area using some television instruction.

It is also estimated that the

home audience which watches and utilizes the educational TV system includes more than twice the number of the students.

The programming has now advanced to carry an every increasing number of subjects including reading enrichment, science, tele-math, U. S. history, music, magazine and feature writing, study of religions, career, opportunities, homemaking, national security, world wide events, French, Spanish, Russian, German and English and also singing and dancing.

Daylong programs on WEDU begin before 9 a. m. and continue until 10 p. m. and can be utilized from kindergarten to the college level and for study at home.

Richards said that courses are now being given in colleges in Florida to teach prospective teachers how, when and where to use and utilize television teaching.

Television teaching is also being taught, and surveys and tests made, to determine the results of television teaching, and the design of better and more useful television teaching programs.

Programs are taped so that they can be used repeatedly, after they are shown "live", and each program has study guides, tests and instructional aids prepared along with it, which are given to the teachers and pupils so that they may work or study

the subject beforehand and review later.

Of the four charter counties in the area, which would make initial use of Channel 11 facilities, Seminole, Volusia, Orange and Brevard, there are many teachers who are now receiving in-training instruction. These prepared teachers will be ready, when area educational TV begins in the fall of 1963 (if all goes as planned) to start live programming of educational television teaching.

At present, local representatives are drawing up a brief to present to the Federal Communications Commission for their approval. Seminole County Board of Educa-

tion has pledged \$50,000 toward the financing of the establishment of the station.

The whole project received a shot in the arm recently when the Welch Scientific Co. pledged to donate a complete center for the television teaching of Science and Math, complete with all equipment and apparatus needed for all grade levels.

### 88 Americans Still Stranded At Airport

LONDON (UPI)—Ninety-eight Chicago tourists were flying home from Ireland today after a six-day wait but 88 Californians started worrying about delays in their flight from England by the same airline.

The 98 originally had been due to fly out of Shannon Airport last Wednesday after a three-week vacation in Ireland. Broke and hungry, many wound up sleeping on the floor of the airport lounge when their flight was delayed six days, first by mechanical breakdowns, then because of a \$6,000 fuel bill.

Their President Airlines DC6B finally left Tuesday night. It was scheduled to arrive in Chicago at 10:15 a. m. after a fuel stop in Gander, Newfoundland.

President was left with only two planes after one of its airliners crashed at Shannon Airport last month, killing 85.

The Californians had been due to leave London's Gatwick Airport at noon Tuesday. A President spokesman told them their plane would be late coming in from the United States and that they would not be able to take off until today.

He said there was no chance of their being stranded. But the Californians, members of the British-American Club in Los Angeles, had heard of the plight of the Chicago tourists and were uneasy.

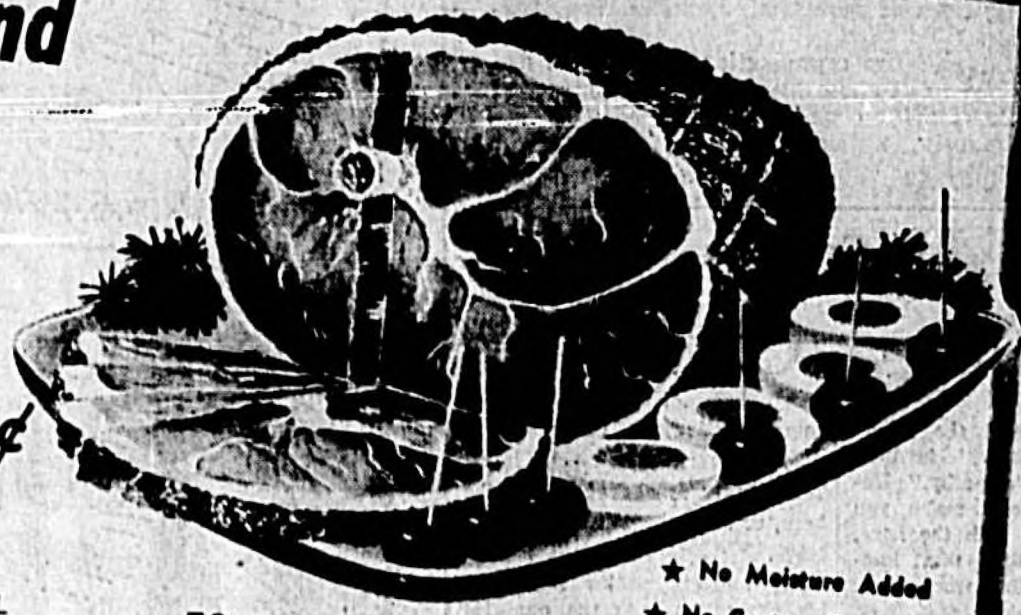

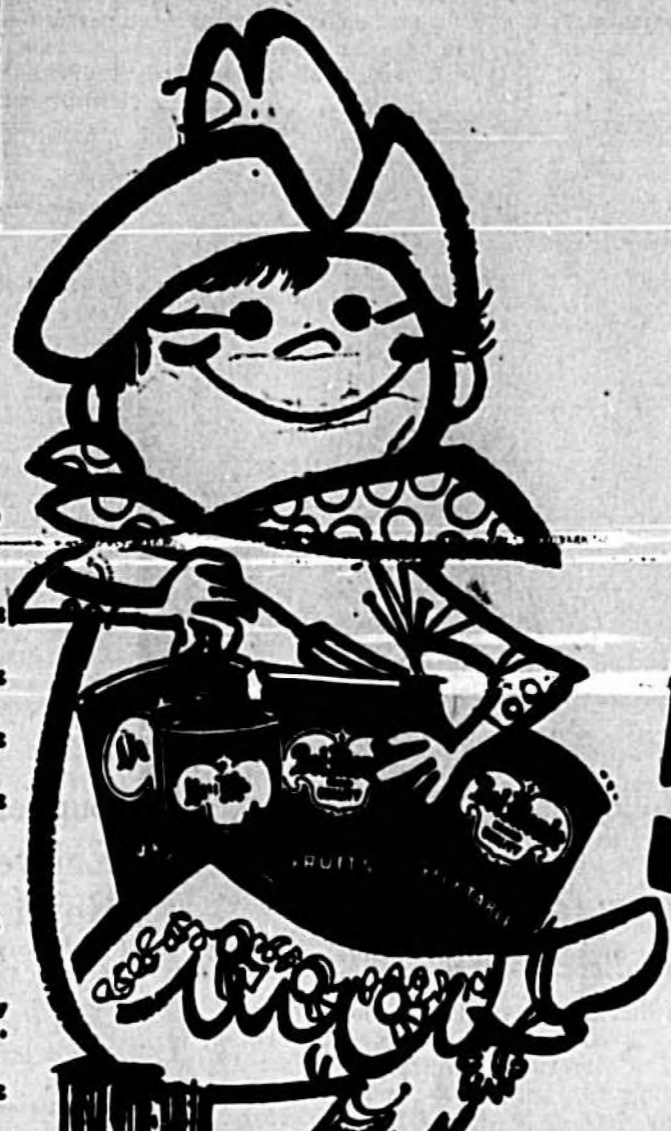

### School Boycott Feared After Memphis Mixing

MEMPHIS (UPI)—School authorities believe that classroom roll-calls today will indicate whether this city of Old South traditions has accepted the surprise integration of four elementary schools.

There was a fear that any organized reaction against the transfer of 13 Negro students to previously all-white schools without trouble Tuesday would come in the form of wholesale boycotting by white students today. Officials said the chances of violence were "slim" because of massive police security measures.

At least 17 white students were withdrawn from the four schools by their parents after news of the integration spread.

"I think if all of the parents would keep their children away from school, I don't believe the niggers would go," said Mrs. Herman McGregor, who took her son out of school.

hope," said Galbreath. He attributed much of the success to an "outstanding performance by the police."

Negro leaders said they were "gratified" by the partial lowering of racial barriers but added they would not be satisfied with "token integration."

## Not 'Bluffing' On Berlin, Kennedy To Tell Gromyko
