#### Britain Opens Gem Theft Witness Albania Case Before Council

Balkan Nation Is Accused Of Violating Law With Mining Of Corfu Channel

LAKE SUCCESS, N. Y., b. 18, (P)— Britain began today to detail her case against Albania before the United Nations Security! Council. British delegate Alexander Cadogan accused the Balkan nation of violating international law by mining the Corfu Channel. Cadogan asserted further at the laying of mines in ne channel also was a crime against humanity.

According to Britain, 41 British scamen were killed and 42 were injured last October by mines for which Albania is responsible. Cadogan asked the delegates at Lake Success to rule that Britain and Albania should egotiate further in an 'effort, to settle the dispute resulting from the charge. He asked also that the council keep watch over the case until it Is settled. Also, Dr. Quillman Cites Cadogan said, all nations should be reminded that their territorial waters must be cleared of mines.

So far, Britain has failed to be satisfied in demands for apology and compensation from Albania in connection with last October's Corfu Channel incident.
