

Johnson Withdraws Bid To Be FBI Director

WASHINGTON (UPI) — Alabama federal udge Frank Johnson said today he will ask President Carter to withdraw his nomination as FBI director because of health reasons. Attorney General Griffin Bell announced.

Bell held a news conference after talking long distance with Johnson, who underwent successful surgery Aug. 26 for a ballooned abdominal artery. But the 58-year-old U.S. district judge has developed complications from abdominal hernias.

'Mormon Will' Authentic?

LAS VEGAS, Nev. (UPI) - There is plenty of evidence, including analysis of the ink. proving that the "Mormon will" is the authentic last testament of Howard Hughes, the jury was told Monday on the opening day of testimony in the trial to determine the fate of Hughes' fortune.

The document's bizarre form and strange history may be part of the proof, attorney Harold Rhoden argued, saying his case would link Hughes' eccentric conduct and the strange "will."



Food Funds Part Of Income Court

WASHINGTON (UPI) — The Supreme Court, in a ruling affecting millions of dollars in tax revenue, decided 7-2 today that a state trooper must list daily cash meal allowances he receives as gross income on his federal tax form.

The justices, acting on a New Jersey case, reversed a lower court ruling allowing such cash allowances for meals eaten while on duty to be excluded from gross income.

The opinion written by Justice William Brennan was a victory for the Internal Revenue Service. The government said millions of dollars in tax revenue were at stake in the case, and warned in advance that a decision in fayor of New Jersey trooper Robert Kowalski, who challenged the IRS position, might have encouraged other civilian employers to begin paying similar allowances as new, tax-free benefits.

Fifteen states — Alabama, Arkanas, Colorado, Connecticut, Idaho, Iowa, Missouri, Montana, New Jersey, New Mexico, North Dakota, Ohio, South Dakota, Texas and Wisconsin — now pay cash meal allowances amounting to about \$10 million a year to 10,000 police troopers. In New Jersey, the meal allowance is a flat rate paid every two weeks to cover the cost of troopers buying meals while on duty within their patrol districts. The troopers do not have to account

for how they spent the money and may in fact go home for meals if they live within their assigned duty area, or carry their lunches to The court noted that tax law says an employee may exclude from taxable income "the value of any meals ... furnished to him by his employer, but only if .. the meals are furnished on the business premises of the employer." By its terms, wrote Brennan, the law "covers meals furnished by the employer and not cash reimbursements for meals. This is not a mere oversight."

Justice Harry Blackmun filed a dissenting opinion joined by Chief Justice Warren Burger. The IRS currently is reviewing the whole area of fringe benefits in an effort to come up with more definitive regulations.





City Hall Tops Building For Sanford

Sanford's 1976-77 fiscal building year was highlighted by the construction of the new city hall building, but private and commercial building was slightly down from the previous year.

Building figures released by Building Official William Braceland show that from the fiscal period of October, 1976, through September, 1977, permits were issued for 38 single-family residences for a total \$767,838 valuation. During the same months the previous, fiscal year, permits were issued for 53 single-family residences for a total value of

\$1,050,451, Braceland said. Home improvements and alterations were also down, according to Braceland's fiscal year report. The 1976-77 totals show 271 improvement or alterations permits

issued for a value of \$444,543, down from the previous year's 294 permits and \$510,217 valuation. "I think it was just kind of a lull," Braceland said this morning said building activity could very well pick up next year. He

noted that a new 42-home development near Seminole High School had received planning and zoning board approval, although no building permits had been issued yet. Commercial improvement or alterations permits issued totaled 79 for \$972,468 during 1976-77. The report does not include a

comparison for the previous year's totals because commercial and private improvements previously were lumped together, New commercial building totaled \$2,073,190, according to the

year-end report. Of that total, \$1,406,000 was assessed for the new Sanford city hall, Braceland said. The report did not give a comparison against previous year

The building department report will be submitted to the Sanford City Commission for final review, Braceland said.



The First Big Step

The euphoria of that history-defying weekend in the Middle East is cooling into reality.

President Anwar Sadat of Egypt received a tumultous welcome from his people and a barrage of shrill criticism from radical Arab states and militant Palestinian organizations.

That criticism is continuing as plans are being laid for all involved parties to attend a minisummit in Cairo perhaps as early as this weekend. As it looks now, it could wind up in a two-party meeting, with only Egypt and Israel attending. We hope not. We hope all the other nations will see their way clear to send representatives and follow up on the initiative taken by President Sadat

in Israel. In the meantime, Prime Minister Menahem Begin of Israel is back at his desk, perhaps pondering what "hard and drastic decisions" Sadat wants him to make in return for the Egyptian

president's courageous journey for peace. Both men undoubtedly are asking the same questions that are being asked by their excited countrymen and throughout the world: What did President Sadat's visit to Israel accomplish? Was it the beginning of a new process toward real peace, or was it only a dramatic false start?

With all the uncertainties, we believe there is room for genuine optimism. Peace in the Middle East will not come as the result of one bold gesture. The region has been at war for 30 years and its1 feuds date back to biblical times.

Nevertheless, when Israeli and Egyptian flags fly side by side in Jerusalem, it is progress. Moreover, President Sadat and Prime Minister Begin have a handshake agreement that there will be "no more war, no more bloodshed, no more

The unprecedented cordiality between Begin and Sadat seems to have been shared by peoples of their two nations, who now understand each other a little better. The overwhelming consensus of both nations, so emotionally exhibited, gives eloquent testimony that both countries want peace.

This new impulse for peace is not without effect in other Arab lands where support for Sadat appears to be cushioning initial hostility. At first only Sudan openly backed him. Then Morrocco joined the ranks, followed by several of the trucial states.

Initially, Saudi Arabia objected quietly, but it has been notably quiet since Sadat's return home. And Jordan, after pro forma criticism, now is pleading with its neighbors to let Sadat's plan have a chance

Know West MARIPOSA, Calif. - Winter has come to the

foothills of the Sierra Nevada, and the wind outside whistles through the towering evergreens. Tom DeVries sits in front of a crackling fire at his home here and recalls his last encounter with President Carter:

"The drought of the past year was just one more catastrophe for the farmers and ranchers of the West. But nothing the President said when he was here six months ago indicated he understood that there are larger economic and social problems faced by these people." DeVries is a writer and former city dweller

who moved here only about five years ago. But his perception of Carter is generally shared by others who have lived far longer in the non-urban

"Where I come from," says Joe Russin, whose family lives near Laramie, Who., "when a man says, 'trust me, I'll never lie to you,' folks instinctively reach to make sure their wallets are intact."

"The President is well-intentioned, but he's hopelessly uniformed about the West," says Bonnie Jeanne Brown, a native of Klamath Falls, the principal trading center for farmers and ranchers in south-central Oregon. Those home towns are important because Los

aren't typical of the one region of the county BUSINESS SCENE where small communities and open spaces are still dominant. One of Carter's few vists to the rural West

came last May, when he toured the farm operated by Charles Kryder in Reedley, Calif., 25 miles southeast of Fresno in the drought-stricken San Joaquin Valley.

"Students will then be allowed to take the Functional Literacy Examination another time during October of their senior year in high school," Swaggerty said. Those who fail again will receive more compensatory education, and will be allowed to take the examination a third and final time during spring of their senior year, Swaggerty

"We had not made a detailed plan of our compensatory program because we wanted to wait until these test scores came in, to learn where our weak points are,'

Swaggerty said today. Completion of that "Compensatory Education Plan" also will have to wait for Swaggerty and his staff to analyze results from statewide examinations of third, fifth and eighth graders, he said.

"We will be finalizing our entire plan within two weeks, to be submitted to the state," Swaggerty said. "Then we will have \$159,000 from the state to use for compensatory education of all students failing the third, fifth and eighth grade tests and the Functional Literacy Examination.' Roger Harris, assistant superintendent for business and finance, said the county has not budgeted other funds for

compensatory education.

regular classes. "We could schedule compensatory education during school, after school, or even during the summer," he said. Individual test scores on the Functional Literacy tests should be in students' hands next week, Swaggerty added. "We release the scores to the principal, and each school then will give them to the students or release them to the

parents," Swaggerty explained. The reports showing test scores "will specifically say a child did or did not pass the examination," Swaggerty

"These reports are very clear, not difficult to understand, something similar to a report card," Swaggerty said. "They also specify each area where the child was

Swaggerty said the form, provided by the state, does not have any way for parents to sign and return or otherwise acknowledge to the schools they have seen their child's report, "but I am certain the schools will provide some

Swaggerty said he is not completely satisfied with the Functional Literacy Test as a way of measuring a child's education.

"Personally, I would like to see the state allow some other requirements to be brought into the picture for graduation," he said. He added that those other elements should include, "how a child does on regular school-work, a teacher evaluation, and additional standardized tests such as the California Test of Basic Skills (CTBS) which we already use in Seminole County."

Swaggerty said he and other school district officials, "can guarantee parents and students that we will do everything we possibly can to make sure these students pass the next time around. We are committed to that."
