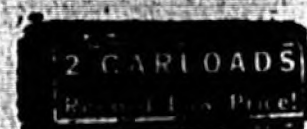

STEEL WAGES UP

CLEVELAND, Ohio, Aug. 14.—The Republic Steel Corporation today announced it has signed a contract with CIO United Steel Workers of America incorporating 44-cent daily pay raises ordered by the War Labor Board.

The cost incurred in the flow of the nation's commodities through distributive channels constitutes a substantial portion of their steel cost, according to the Department of Commerce.

WASHINGTON, Aug. 14, (AP)—Railroad transportation for an estimated 750,000 Florida Winter residents was sought of George Eastman, chief of the Office of Defense Transportation here yesterday by H. H. WASHINGTON, Aug. 14, (AP)—Federal income tax collections ended Florida during the fiscal year 1942 at \$1,042,763, 10.42 per cent greater than in the previous fiscal year, the Bureau of Internal Revenue reported yesterday.

Individual income tax payments were 82.3 per cent greater than in the previous 12 months, while corporate income tax payments were up 74.1 per cent.

The total individual income payments in 1942 fiscal year were \$400,958.74 against \$225,612.89 in 1941.

Corporate income tax payments for the fiscal year totaled \$131,267.32 compared with \$76,821.23 the previous 12 months.
