## NEGOTIATIONS ARE OPENED BETWEEN BRITISH EMBASSY AND STATE DEPARTMENT

LOOKING TO RELEASE OF  
BRITISH VESSELS FROM  
CUSTODY, SIEZED

## THREE MILE LIMIT

And Law Pertaining Thereto  
Will Mean Refusal to Enter an Agreement

(By The Associated Press)  
WASHINGTON, Oct. 17.—Negotiations between the British embassy and the State Department looking to the release from custody of the British vessels seized by prohibition forces outside the three mile limit were expected to take definite form as a result of a refusal of the British government to enter an agreement which would limit of reciprocal authority.

WASHINGTON, Oct. 17.—British refused the American proposal for a three mile limit of search for ships up to 12 miles off shore which was contained in a note handed to Sir Edward Hughes yesterday by Ambassador Geddes. The communication, in reply to Mr. Hughes' note, was setting out difficulties in applying American prohibition enforcement officers in checking the illicit importants into the United States.

Mr. Hughes made public his desire with the ambassador's statement. There was nothing to indicate that any further step to the right of search for American enforcement officers beyond the three mile limit was in view.

Action of the cabinet in approving the abandonment of search presumably because of international difficulties in the British reply of yesterday appeared to indicate that opinion could continue to be considered in recognizing territorial

American note dealt particular attention to smuggling operations from possessions in water adjacent to American coast and suggested by which the existing unfortunate condition might be remedied. Among these was a proposal to extend the three mile limit of search to 12 miles.

## JEALOUSY IS BLAMED FOR TWO DEATHS

(By The Associated Press)  
NEW BRUNSWICK, N. J., Oct. 17.—Supreme Court Justice Charles W. Parker was expected to announce to-day a special prosecutor to take charge of the inquiry into the murder of the Rev. Edw. Wheeler Hall, rector of the Protestant Episcopal church of St. John the Evangelist, and his choir leader, Mrs. Eleanor Reinhardt Mills. He is expected to name Attorney General McRan, but is thought unlikely that McRan will personally look after the investigation. Mr. McRan is expected to designate an assistant to handle the matter.

Private detectives working on the case disclosed yesterday that their investigations have convinced them that the murder resulted from jealousy. Julius A. Braun, employed in the trust of Charlotte and James Mills, daughter and husband of the slain singer, said that Miss Florence North, a woman lawyer, representing a pack of bairns, was beyond doubt that the rector and Mrs. Mills were in love.

He disclosed the fact that the two officers were known to some members of the congregation and that the pair were taken from their home in a car known to have been received about 7 o'clock on the day on which they were killed. They advanced the theory that the rector and Mrs. Mills were confronted with each other's claim and then taken to the church under the real application of the Phillips farm where the bodies were found two days later.

He pointed to the fact that the rectors' eyes were closed as in sleep, while those of Mrs. Mills were open, indicating that the murder was a crime of passion.

This was the performance yesterday of Lieutenant R. L. Maughn, army pilot who drove a Curtiss army biplane at the rate of 283½ miles an hour, surpassing by more than thirty-two miles the previous official record.
