His announcment came as U. S. authorities disclosed they intercepted two Cuban exile boats loaded with arms off the Florida coast last Tuesday. The boats apparently were headed for a rendezvous with anti-Castro Alpha 66 exile forces inside

The boat capture, which resulted in the arrest of two of the five men aboard, as a demonstration of the new U. S. crackdown on refugees trying to topple the Castro regime.

More than 100,000 of the fivepage census forms have already been prepared, and more are being assembled, he said. The forms will be distributed to delegates in all major U. S. cities with large exile populations and to most Latin countries and

Torriente has previusly stated that he is working for the "liberation of Cuba by any means" and he has come under violent attack by premier Fidel Castro.

Congress finally may have discovered that E taxes are not popular with the folks back home, especially new taxes. At any rate, the lawmakers in their infinite wisdom have figured out a way of levying a new tax and placing the blame on someone else.

It happened almost unnoticed in the language of the bill which increased airline fares by 3 per cent beginning July 1. This 3 per cent increase is a federal tax, to be added to the existing 5 per eent federal tax. The purpose is to raise sixteen billion dollars to pay for airport improvements and otherwise make air travel safer.

- But, in passing the revenue-raising measure, Congress stipulated the added 3 per cent could not be identified on the ticket as a tax, nor can The airlines advertise the fact the added cost is not of their doing. In short, the public is supposed to think-and has no way of knowing otherwise-that it is the airlines which are receiving the added bonus.



He continued, "Species management for waterfowl is nothing new to duck hunters, and in the past regulations restricted the taking of certain ducks. The major difference under the point system is that the hunter does no have to idenify he bird in flight, but will be required to identify and know the pont value of the ducks in his bag."

Entzminger announced that the manning of some 12 fire towers on these two forests was being discontinued on that date.
