

# Egypt Expecting Attack Over Sinking Of Israeli Ship

Egypt's Cabinet, meeting late last night, decided to take immediate action when it learned that the Israeli ship, the *Elah*, had been sunk. The cabinet was held in the presence of Prime Minister Levi Eshkol and Foreign Minister Moshe Dayan, who said the sinking of the ship was "a violation of the 1957 Geneva Convention" and "a flagrant violation of the 1957 Geneva Convention". The cabinet decided to take "immediate steps" to protect Israel's maritime interests in the Red Sea and the Gulf of Aden.

The Associated Press said Israel's three victories were "a signal of the kind of determination" which will be required to bring about a permanent settlement of the Arab-Israeli conflict. ## OB Ward Losing Money

### 'Bitter Pill' For Hospital

The Pill apparently is doing its job. Too well, says Robert Bessinger, administrator of Seminole Memorial Hospital.

The county hospital is losing about \$2,000 a month because it works so well.

"It's no joke," says Bessinger. "Hospitals all over the country are having a decline in obstetrics activity since The Pill came along. The obstetrics ward now is a steady money-loser."

When Seminole Hospital was being designed the planners figured on a "baby boom" because of Seminole's young population. But they forgot to consider The Pill.

The 16-bed ward has been averaging only six or seven patients a day for the last year. Its average occupancy has been only 40 per cent.

Cost of operating the OB ward during the fiscal year ending Sept. 30 was \$55,000, while the income for that department was only \$50,000.

Bessinger also said that there were 646 births at the hospital last year... as compared with 711 in the previous year... and 812 in the year before that.

While this was happening, Sanford and Seminole County population was climbing steadily.

A couple-three years ago Sanford had a population of 19,000 and Seminole County was estimated at about 55,000. Today it is estimated by John Krider, manager of the Seminole County Chamber of Commerce, that Sanford has a population of 22,000, while there are 83,000 persons residing in the county.

"Our population certainly is not getting any older," says Krider. And Bessinger adds: "Something's happening... it could be The Pill."

A Central Florida obstetrician says that "there is no doubt about it. This is a nation-wide phenomenon. In some instances the birth rate has dropped as much as 20 to 30 per cent."

In Seminole the birth rate reached its peak about two years ago. Since then, births have declined because of the growth rate has leveled off and "so many women are taking The Pill."

## New Plans To Be Drawn

Architect John Burton was hired by the City Commission last night to come up with plans for a "functional" neighborhood facility building for Goldboro at a maximum cost of \$100,000.

Burton will work with a special committee appointed by Mayor Joe Baker to decide on the "scope of the facility" which may be located on the Farmers Market property on W. 13th St.

At the same time, the board agreed to junk \$275 worth of earlier plans that were submitted by architect James Chapman. Chapman's plans, according to the board, were "too elaborate."

The commission has no word as yet on whether they can get the market property free of charge from the state. If not, an alternate will be selected.

The commission named Burton after members reaffirmed their decision before an overflowing crowd of Goldboro residents at City Hall to go ahead with the center.

Prior to the regular meeting, commissioners met with members of the Bi-Racial Committee to hash out the problem of the center.

At that time, commissioners assured the committee they were committed to the project and had no intention of changing their minds.

Dr. George Starke, who has opposed the center as a "waste of taxpayers' money," was not present.

"We plan to live up to our commitment and promise," Baker told the group made up of ministers, community leaders and youngsters.

At the same time, the board decided on any action on needed street improvements in Goldboro pending a complete storm sewer study of the entire city.
