The answer is no, despite the fact that Feller has just signed a 1947 contract that could bring his earnings to the \$80,000 mark in Ruth's 1930 contract.

Ruth only had to pay income tax of \$11,640 on his \$80,000 and took home \$68,360. Feller, if he achieves \$80,000, will have to shell out \$47,700 to Uncle Sam, leaving \$32,300 in take-home pay for Ralph Robert.






