

BALL LEAGUE TO OPEN YEAR WITH GAMES SUNDAY

Four Teams Will Embrace Central Florida Diamond Loop

The Central Florida Baseball League opens its third season of play in games at Orlando and Daytona Beach next Sunday afternoon.

This was decided at a meeting of directors held at the City Hall last night where William MacIntyre, former sports editor of an Orlando paper, was elected president succeeding J. T. Hogan.

The league will begin operations as a four club circuit composed of teams at Daytona Beach, Sanford, Orlando, and Cocoa. A representative of a New Smyrna team was present last night with franchise money and a desire to join the league.

New Smyrna officials were given until noon Friday, Apr. 21, to name league directors and officials in securing a sixth team, probably Deland. In case their efforts are successful, the newcomers will be permitted to play double-headers early in the season to provide for the two first games they missed.

Following election of officers, the directors officially adopted a new constitution and by-laws, and the first half schedule. Under the schedule, the season opens Sunday, Apr. 16 and ends on Thursday, July 6. Each club will play each other club eight times during the first half, four of the games to be played at home and four on the road.

Floyd A. Palmer, of Sanford, and Bill Driskill, of Daytona Beach, were named as regular league umpires after a secret ballot had been taken, while H. R. Laine of Sanford, and E. C. Langan, of Eastia, were named alternates.

Before adjourning, the directors officially adopted the Goldsmith No. 97 baseball, decided that the price of admission to games should be left optional, and passed a resolution of thanks and appreciation to former president Hogan, organizer of the league, for his two years of service in behalf of the league.

With final league organization out of the way and a first half Central Florida Baseball League schedule adopted, Manager Joe Barnes of the Sanford Celeryfeds, today turned his attention to a last minute training drive in anticipation of a victory in the opening day game at Orlando next Sunday afternoon.

Barnes, announced that his new hurler, J. P. Holt, had been forced to return to his home at Clearwater because of illness. Holt will return within a few days, he said.

He also stated that he had signed a new infielder, Joe Arioli, of Plant City. Arioli saw a season of service with the Plant City semi-pro club of last year, and has several years of fast baseball to his credit.

Barnes was not definite about his line-up for Sunday. He said that Tige Minor, Ocoee's contribution to this league, will start on the mound and that Chapman will catch. Manager Barnes will hold down first base and Shorty Malby will be at second. Eddie Moore wrote friends here that he will be ready to play for Sanford next Sunday, so he will be at third.

Whether it will be Arioli or Abbott at short probably will not be known until later this week. Whoever fails to get the call will go to right field, while Roy Harrison and Tete Newcomb of the Clearwater slugs will occupy the other outfield posts.

The inclement weather of the past few days has halted any real training activities, but the players are said to be ready for action. They are talking of a victory over Orlando in that city Sunday afternoon, and declare themselves confident that they'll win three out of their first four games at least.

Public Schools In State To Receive Quarter Million

TALLAHASSEE, Apr. 12.—Florida's public schools will receive \$225,000 from the state within a few days, the state department of public instruction reported Monday.

The state funds came from motor vehicle licenses, \$100,000 and mills ad valorem tax, \$27,000, and interest on the invested common school fund, \$73,000.

McLean Is Seeking Court Action For Portion Of Estate

WASHINGTON, Apr. 12.—Edward B. McLean, former publisher of the Washington Post, said in a petition filed Monday in the District of Columbia supreme court that he was "desperate" and asked that he be given funds from his father's estate so that he might make a cash offer for the newspaper.

He asked the court through his attorney, George B. Frager, to compel the American Security & Trust Company, a co-trustee of the estate, to give him \$933,784. McLean also is a co-trustee of the estate, but the trust company has instituted proceedings seeking to oust him.

Refusal of the trust company to pay him any money last year, the petition said, had "greatly embarrassed him and has left him destitute and without necessary funds for medical attention, food, clothing and other necessary living expenses."

McLean, who now is in Montreal, also claimed he was entitled to \$400,000 deducted from his income to make payment on the new building housing the Cincinnati Inquirer, another paper owned by the estate.

A hearing on the petition was set for Apr. 24.
