EVENING HERALD: But might you not be better able to improve your life if you knew these things? For instance, if you wanted to buy a house, you would be at the mercy of people who are acquainted with percentages and interest rate structures. On the other hand, with the new disclosure laws telling you exactly what something is going to cost you, are we wasting time teaching you irrelevant things? Or should we just keep on reducing things to the minimum possible level of understanding? STUDENT: No! Then we would all be on a first-grade





Judge Weighing Mexican Embezzler's Extradition

MIAMI (UPI) - U.S. District Judge William M. Hoeveler is weighing Mexico's demand — backed by the U.S. government for the extradition of 38-year-old Alfredo Rios Camarena, a former Mexican treasury official charged with embezzling \$7.5 million loaned to Mexico by a Chicago bank. Hoeveler is expected to hand down a ruling early in January.

Rios Camarena, arrested in a Miami Beach motel last July 18, claims he is innocent and is fighting extradition. He is being held at the Federal Correction Institute in Homestead, about 20 miles south of Miami.

FBI Nabs Escaped Rapist

FORT MYERS (UPI) - A convicted rapist who escaped from a California prison last December was arrested by FBI agents

Charles Baker Ward, 45, had been serving a 25-year sentence at the Vacaville Prison near Sacramento when he escaped on Dec. 5, 1976. The FBI arrested Ward on a federal warrant charging him with unlawful flight. He offered no resistance and was held in the Lee County jail in lieu of \$25,000 bond.





Law Serves Other Ends

It is the Biblical understanding that lawyers place great burdens upon men's backs. And so they

o, only today the burdens seem greater. They take the form of both higher legal fees and more items thought suitable for litigation. To put it simply, Americans pay lawyers more money than ever and spend more time than ever with lawyers in the nation's courts.

Why is this? Chief Justice Warren Burger correctly noted earlier this year that lawyers. judges, and law professors have developed "a ascination with procedure" that has led to "a smug presumption that conflicts can be solved by law-trained people."

The question needs asking why this fascination with procedure, and the answer suggests itself that the ends of law have been lost sight of; the law has become an end in itself, the source of intellectual preoccupation, the birthplace of ever newer

go to court to resolve even petty differences. But in a very real sense the average person now has no other place to go. He is his own agent, as the lawyer is his, and the two work together, though unconsciously, to produce a mammoth legal

It is the nature of the beast that makes one pause. Chief Justice Burger has suggested that the legal profession in America might learn from Iran. Iranians resolve their differences by taking them to councils of elders.

Which of course they can do, for the simple reason that Iran has not yet endured the affliction of modernity, the breakdown of intermediate in-

But the burdens that lawyers and consumers of lawyers place upon themselves are not likely to ease until there is a fundamental recognition that values are objective, that law serves ends other than itself, and that intermediate institutions like the family and the church can provide more satisfying resolutions to conflicts than the courts. Admittedly this is a tall order, but no other one

Warren Report

Release of long-secret FBI files has done nothing to shake the conclusions of the Warren Commission that Lee Harvey Oswald was alone in the assassination of President John F. Kennedy. But the half-ton of raw data made available in response to provisions of the Freedom of Information Act probably included enough accounts of false leads and unresolved questions, unfortunately, to keep alive the several conspiracy theories. The new information does reveal that the FBI under the late J. Edgar Hoover checked out every lead, even the most bizarre. investigators at no time casually dismissed the conspiracy possibility, but weighed the evidence carefully and thoroughly before determining that Oswald was on his own.

More papers will be released, probably next month. It is too much to expect that the tragic blot on our nation's history will be put firmly behind us. But the demands of the present and the uncertainties of the future argue for looking ahead - not back.

According to the SACS standard of 10 books per pupil in a school, the schools needed from a high of 9,396 books at Lake Brantley to a low of 3,458 books at Seminole High School.

Layer's staff had calculated the cost of the books. which totaled \$30,050 for the schools plus an allowance of 5,000 books to allow for growth, at a total price of \$217,866.

That price allows for 22,538 hardback volumes, and 7,512 paperbacks, and includes \$1 per volume for processing the books. The price could be cut somewhat, said Layer, by

purchasing 50 percent hardback and 50 percent paperback books, at a total of \$165,275, including

15.025 volumes and \$1 per volume processing costs. Other costs to meet the SACS standards for accreditation totaled more than half a million dollars for Lake Brantley (including 12 new classrooms); more than \$4,000 at Seminole High School; and more than \$300,000 at Crooms; for an estimated total of \$602,000 in capital outlay to make it possible to bring the schools to SACS standards.

Layer said the expenditure of those capital outlay funds could not be made in the present budget year and recommended that the time between now and the beginning of next budgeting estimates in February be spent in gathering books from the public, to cut that expense as much as possible. Other accreditation costs would then be considered in light of next year's budget. Anyone wishing to donate books to the board may

About The **Farmers** Demands

The long unhappy and suddenly militant American farmer is getting a lot of attention and even some sympathy where it should count most - in Washington.

By DON GRAFF

The cluckings of concern and sympathy go right up to President Carter himself, who acknowledges that recent economic conditions have "created real difficulties" for the farmers. And being a farmboy himself, although not noticeable pressed economically, he's in a position of being able to say that he ought to

But whether the farmers can expect to get much more than headlines and sympathy out of their tractor procession and strike talk is

As Agriculture Secretary Bergland says, he wishes the farmers well in their dramatized push for guaranteed farm prices, but doesn't think it's going to be effective.

Farm belt congressmen speak up for their constitutents, but they are not the sizeable and cohesive Washington force they once were. The realistic among them, which means most of them, admit they cannot legislate what the militant farmers are asking-100 percent of parity, in effect a federal guarantee that no matter what the economic conditions at the time of sale the farmer will receive a price for his produce equal to the cost of production plus a

The reason is in the numbers. The cost of full parity could reach \$20 billion in direct government payments, possibly more as translated into won't buy it. And there are more nonfarm than farm congressmen, and they represent many more American voters.

The farmers' economic impact is likely to be of even less immediate consequence than the political. They have chosen to act between harvest and planting seasons, barring any immediate wide-scale refusal to produce or deliver foodstuffs, and at a time when food stocks are high. Wheat presently in storage is estimated at a two-year domestic supply. It would be some time before urban consumers felt the effects of any action by the farmers more serious than demonstrations

While the administration is officially sympathetic to the farmers' plight, its own farm 4 program falls considerably short of matching their demands. It wants to manage the surplus production problem by withdrawing acreage from production and a grain-reserve program, the latest version of the post-Depression evernormal granaries. Seminole Education Association (SEA) has filed charges against the Seminole County School Board and Ernest Cowley, director of noninstructional personnel and chief negotiator, alleging that Cowley photographed SEA members during recent picketing outside school board

The charges were filed with the Public Employees Relations Commission (PERC) in Tallahassee, but PERC officials said today they have not yet been received.

According to Gene Grooms, SEA executive director, the charges state that Cowley engaged in "unlawful surveillance" of the members of SEA and that he was observed photographing members who were "engaged in a lawful, peaceful assembly gathered for the purpose of informing the public of its views."

The charges will be inrestigated by PERC. If the charges are properly filed and found to be just," PERC could order that Cowley and the school board publicly acknowledge that what they did was wrong, officials said.

"In essence PERC would slap their hands and tell them never to to it again," Grooms said. "They are not going to issue a \$10,000 fine or anything like that," he explained.


Grooms said a similar thing had happened in Escambia County, where teachers on a picket line were photographed. "PERC did say that should not have happened," Grooms

William A. Moore, SEA past president and chief negotiator, said the PERC decision in Escambia County was based on the feeling that photographs of picketers would be used to intimidate employees.

Cowley said today he had not yet received his copy of the charges, and would prefer not to comment until he had seen it.

"I am aware they sent the charges in to PERC," Cowley

PERC officials said the investigation would begin as soon as the charges are received in Tallahassee. Just to determine 27-YEAR whether to dismiss the charges or file a formal complaint will RENEWAL take an investigation of "a couple of months", according to

The money will go for campaign expenses of Republican congressional candidates instead, he said. Fund raising letters over Reagan's signature were mailed by the Republican National Committee and the

The Students And The Tests --- III

They Talk About Their Teachers' Performances

PERC officials.

(The Evening Herald today continues its series on reactions of students to the Functional Literacy Tests. Students today evaluate their classroom experiences).

EVENING HERALD: Would you give us some examples of what you have seen in competency and incompetency among

STUDENT: I had an English teacher last year at a different high school in this county who told us at the beginning of the year that she couldn't spell. EVENING HERALD: Was she kidding?

STUDENT: I don't think so. I had her sixth period. By the time we got to her class she acted, most of the time, as if she was asleep in class. She would give us an assignment, tell us to do it, and that was it. She wouldn't show us anything. EVENING HERALD: How about the rest of you? Are there any

other examples of what you might consider incompetency? STUDENT: I had a teacher last year who would just look in his plan book, and do only those assignments. If you asked a question he would just tell you to sit down. There are some teachers who just won't help - and there are some teachers who just look at you as if you are wasting a seat. That teacher never did help us. EVENING HERALD: Do you feel he concentrated more on the students who were doing well?

STUDENT: Yes, on the ones he thought might do real well. EVENING HERALD: Why do you think he might do that? STUDENT: Probably because he doesn't want to waste his

EVENING HERALD: If you turn in a paper and it comes back with a C grade, do you sit with the teacher and discuss it? STUDENT: When the teacher goes over the answers on a test. that is as far as it goes. If I didn't like the grade, I would tell her. EVENING HERALD: Otherwise, she will have marked what you had wrong, and that is the end of the teacher-student

STUDENT: Well, you look at the test, and she goes over every answer, and if you understand the right answer, you don't say anything. But if I make an F on a test, and I really don't understand why, then I will talk to her about it. If you are making poor grades all the way through, and are three or four weeks into the nine-week grading period, they don't say, "Listen, I really think you need some help," or "Would you like to come after school and I'll give you some help." No way. They don't come to

somewhere along the line say, "sit down. You have three C's more individualized attention to students. How many students in

already, and you are heading for an F. You have a particular weakness in thus and so."

STUDENT: They won't do that because they think it is your business, which really it is, to know that you are doing badly. If you don't care, why should they bother?

EVENING HERALD: So the teacher gives an explanation, maybe on the board and maybe just orally to the class. You then are tested on this, whether it is right after that explanation or after a few of them on the same subject. Students turn in their papers. Three or four have done badly. The teacher does not make the first move to get those who are the weakest and tell them they are heading for F's, and explain what they need to do to

STUDENT PANEL: No way. (But one member of the student panel then disagreed with the others.) My math teacher is always elling us if we need help to come in at lunch or after school, that she will help us. She will stay with us as long as she can. EVENING HERALD: Have students been doing that? STUDENT: Yeah, at least from my class. She always tells us

she has time, no matter what she is doing. EVENING HERALD: Teachers say that if they could have EVENING HERALD: Are you suggesting that teachers don't fewer students in a class they might be able to teach better, giving

STUDENT: There are 30 to 35 students in most classes. EVENING HERALD: And you are in class for how long? STUDENT: About one hour.

EVENING HERALD: So that, if all students needed assistance. each would get less than two minutes of the teacher's time? STUDENT: Yes, but here's the thing: if you know that you need help; if the teacher is explaining something, you are supposed to sit there and try to understand it. If you know that you do not understand, you should not just sit there. You are supposed to raise your hand and say, "I don't understand." I ask lots of questions. I don't just sit in my seat.

EVENING HERALD: And do you get auswers? STUDENT: I get answers, and if I don't get the answers I want I go to somebody else, or come up to the office.

EVENING HERALD: What do you think is the teacher's STUDENT: If a teacher sees in a grade book that a student has

made four straight F's on tests, and that student pays attention in class and seems interested, we think she should take the student - MARYLIN SHEDDAN
