No dripping means poor coverage, while heavy runoff means application is too heavy and was-

Be sure to spray the under sides of the foliage as well as Clean sprayer immediately after use, thoroughly. Follow instructions as to how often spraying should be repeated for control.

Fifty-one per cent of adults and 35 per cent of children failed vision tests given by the Titmus Vision Screener at the recent Lions lub Fun Fair. Dr. Richard Dougherty, diwere most scute in the area of muscle balance for children and in the area of far visual

"This lack of eye muscle coordination in school children can cause reading problems, slowing down reading and learning and causing children

"Often people with this problem say they do not like to read. They don't know why, but they are uncomfortable, he pointed out.
"Any student who falls in

the lower two-thirds of his class and has reading prob-lems should be given a complete examination. Possessing that vision is perfect, when muscle ec-ordination is lacking," he declared.

In adults, the far visual acuity lack is most dangerous

for those who drive automo-biles. It causes the driver to make errors in judging the speed and distance of oncoming traffic. Ofter a driver can-not ascertain if another car is coming toward him or going

away. "There is also an increased problem in night driving when a driver with poor light-to-dark adaptation is unable to make the split-second adjustment from the glare of oncoming headlights to the compara-tive darkness at the side of the road and cannot perceive per-


