WASHINGTON, Aug. 8 (P) President Truman today signed legislation killing all controls on installment buying Nov. 1, 1947.

The President said he regretted that Congress did not follow the recommendation of the Fedoral Reserve Board and of the Council of Economic Advisers by enacting legislation to provide for ntinuing as long as necestary regulation of consumer credit as a means of helping to promote eco-

nomic stability. Mr. Truman had asked for specific peacetime authority to regulate the American institution known as the "easy payment plan," a a bulwark againht inflationary tendencies.

But Congress, instead, sent him bill intended to force an end to the wedit curbs in three months. In a statement criticizing the

legislation the President said: It is unfortunate that the Congress did not provide for restraints on over-expansion of in atallment credit in order to li minish inflationary pressures aciding from this course."





#### Fewer Divorces

The divorce rate in the United States will be material Life Insurance Company has predicted. An indication of the downward trend is the drop of about 40 per cent in the number of divorces granted in Reno, in the first six months of this year- as compared with the like period of Detaber 27, 1919, at the Post Office months of this year- as compared with the like period of last. Figures, for New Jersey, Minnesota, and for California show a similar though less marked decline show a similar, though less marked decline.

Last year an all-time high of more than 620,000 divorces were granted in the United States, almost double the figure of only four years earlier. The rise in the number of divorces in the four years between 1942 and 1946 nearly equalled the increase from the beginning of our history until 1942.

The Metropolitan also calls attention to the remarrely large number of annulments granted annually in some of 225 the states. In California, for example, annulments now s.ec constitute about one-seventh of the total number of marriages legally dissolved. 
