# Political Platform Making Is A Tough Job

Platform making is always hazardous. This is especially true when it comes to political platforms. It is more than usually obvious in this year where hazard is the name of the game.

This must be accepted as a logical statement, regardless of what some complacent Republicans are saying when looking at the all-things-to-all-people document which emerged in Miami.

Now the Democrats with the hard-headed, Rep. Hale Boggs of Louisiana as chairman, are striving to get some odd-length planks put together for their official platform and make them fit snugly.

Political observers are somewhat puzzled by this fuss over platforms. They have, traditionally, been more "honored in their breach than their ob-

Yet there are some rather useful purposes shown

in the reactions from platforms as adopted. Take, for example, a reaction which has come to our desk in the form of a protest by the National Council of Senior Citizens, Inc., of Washington. This council had asked to be heard at the Na-

tional GOP convention. But this was refused. The senior citizens were "shocked!" John W. Edelman, president of the council which reports a membership of 2,500,000, called the Republican proposal to provide automatic cost-of living

increases for the elderly, a "meaningless gesture." Now the council will get after the Democratic platform committee. We do not bring this up except to point out that the issues which plague the platform builders are not only the great ones of the Vietnam war, civil rights or urban renewal. What can be expected in Chicago, however, is

nothing as bland as went on in Miami, Democrats have at least four open and declared candidates, All are able to express themselves fluently and vigor-






