the Senior's retirement, the house has taken over and continued in the tradition of his family, serving the fans efficiently and with great gentility.

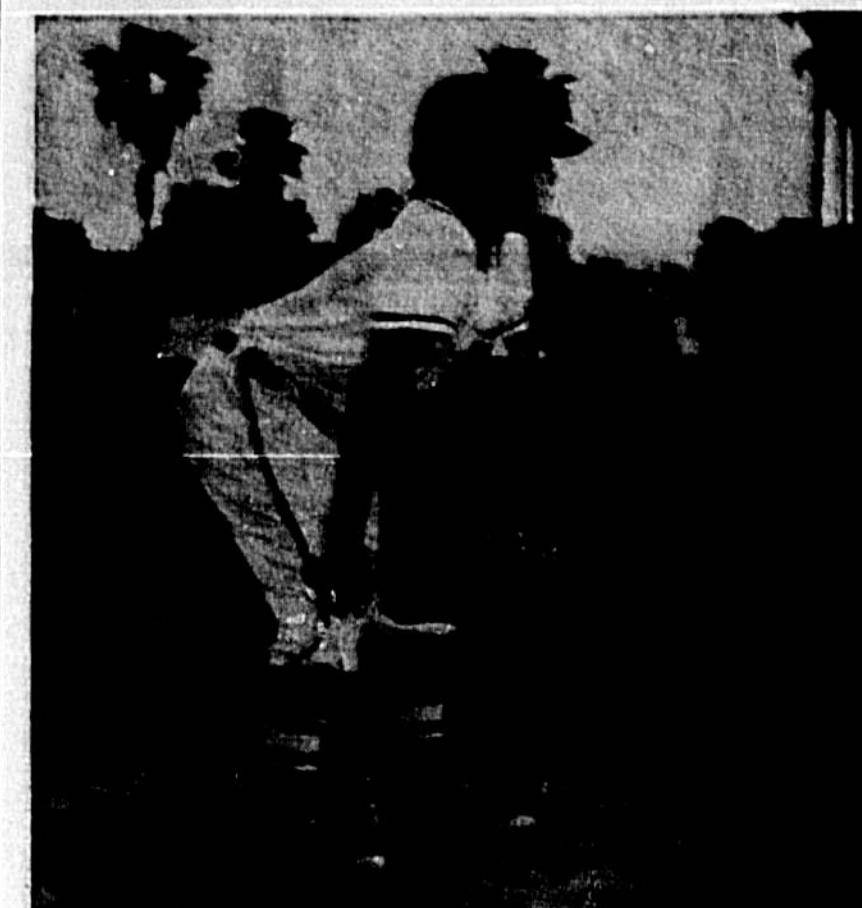

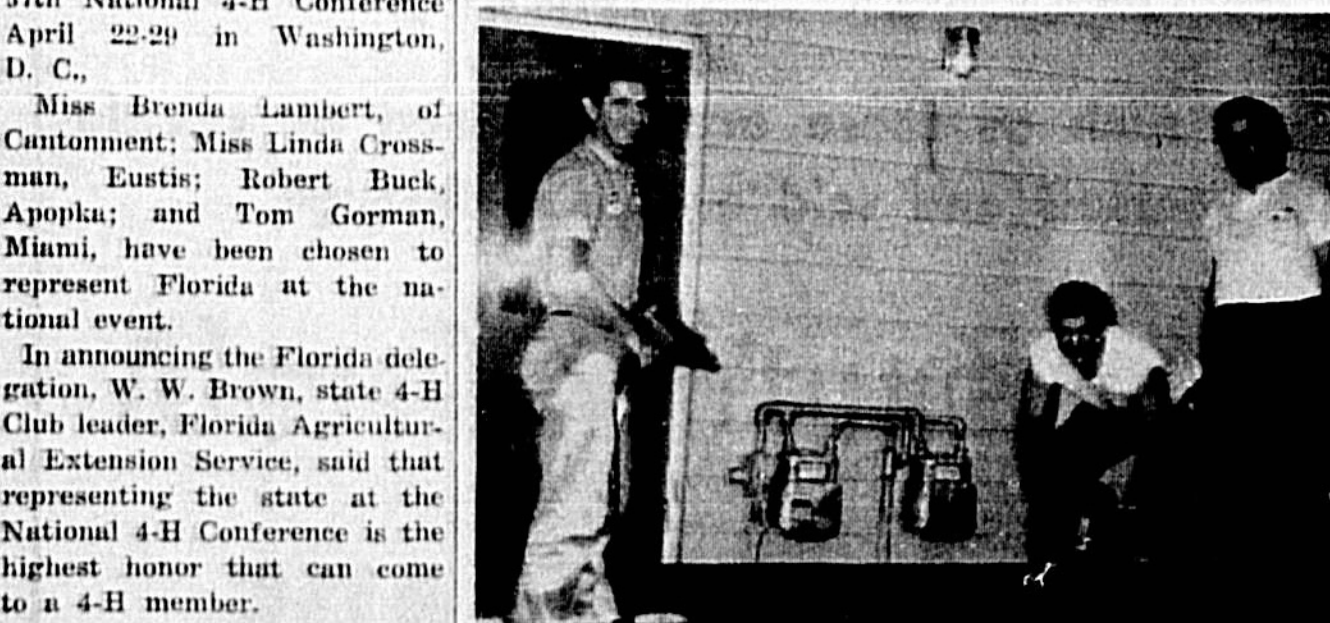
