Congregations at West Palm Beach and Trinity, Church, Miami, raised \$2,700 each; the four churches at Del Ray totaled \$10,000; while a group of twelve at Fort Lauderdale quickly raised \$1,200, said Dr. Russell, in-dicating the quick response of Florida Methodists.

Dr. Russell said that throughout the church, mounting interest in the cause of missions was evident and that payments on the recent million dollar campaign for missionary maintenance were coming in at the rate of \$5,000 a day.


